## PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT REPORT

Pursuant to 50 ILCS 705/6.2, all law enforcement agencies shall notify the Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board (aka the Board) within 30 days of any **final** determination when either:

- (1) the officer is discharged or dismissed as a result of willful violation of department/agency policy, official misconduct, or violation of law; or
- (2) the officer resigns during the course of an investigation, of which the officer has been served notice, based on the commission of any felony or sex offense

Please note this does not replace the mandatory reporting by an agency of any felony or qualifying misdemeanor arrest/conviction of an officer under 50 ILCS 705/6.1
