It is with great pleasure and even greater pride that I issue this Annual Report on the operations of the Mobile Team Training Units for Fiscal Year 2023. The Annual Report provides a summary of data and information related to both the funding and operational activities of the 13 established Mobile Team Units and the Executive Institute from July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023. This report will reflect the data recorded regarding training that relates to both in-person through the Mobile Training Units (MTU) and classes held by the Executive Institute as well as the On-line Learning Network through the Executive Institute.

With the establishment of the Mobile Team Training Units in the early 1980's, pursuant to Public Act 82-674, the State of Illinois effectively created a law enforcement training network that is recognized throughout the nation as being "state of the art." It is a training system that provides continuous professional and aggressive training for local and state law enforcement agencies which includes: Law Enforcement Officers, Correctional Officers, Court Security Officers, Auxiliary Officers, and States Attorney personnel. This Annual Report provides evidence of the continued effectiveness and productivity of the Statewide System of In-Service Training (ASSIST) and their extremely important role including their partnership with both the Governor and our states' legislature.

This year's annual report provides the first full year's data release following the implementation of the SAFE-T Act which went into effect the first day of this Fiscal Year. This report allows all parties to evaluate several changes within the law enforcement community following a six-month introductory period of the SAFE-T Act along with a return to normalcy as it relates to the lifting of COVID Policies surrounding the training environment. It is our hope, with the continued assistance from the Governor's Office and the Illinois General Assembly that we can continue the lines of communication with our partners, educate those effected by state mandates, and establish a clear and complete picture of law enforcements commitment to evolve in our ever-changing environment within the policing community while being transparent and open minded to understanding citizenries' expectations of policing today.

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ANNUAL REPORT INTERGOVERNMENTAL LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS IN-SERVICE TRAINING ACT FISCAL YEAR 2023

Mobile Team Unit Funding in Fiscal Year 2023

The Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board (ILETSB) awarded state funds totaling \$8,817,785.03 to 13 Mobile Team Training Units in Fiscal Year 2023. Their quarterly payments included a second quarterly payment in quarter four to ten MTU's for training and educational resources, under the authority of the Intergovernmental Law Enforcement Officers In-Service Training Act (Public Act 82-674). In addition, \$914,316.69 in Specialized Training, including areas of Crisis Intervention Training Team (CIT) & School Resource Officer Training (SRO), with an additional \$263,343.52 in federal grant funds to the Mobile Team Units for Traffic Safety (IDOT) funding through the U.S. Department of Transportation (Ill. #9), and \$260,930.90 in federal funds from Homeland Security to eleven of the MTU's. In total, the Mobile Team Units were awarded \$10,288,401.14 in state and federal funds listed above. This amount was augmented by expended local funds and tuition totaling \$3,478,518 in membership dues and added tuition fees.

For Fiscal Year 2023 the 13 MTU's collectively expended \$13,834,709.81 in federal, state, and local funds, not including funds expended outside the MTU's (Ill #4). Illustration #1 provides a map and address directory for each of the Mobile Team Units established and funded by the State of Illinois through the Intergovernmental Law Enforcement Officers In-Service Training Act. The concept of boundaries helps to map and to define the geographic areas known as Mobile Team Units that currently exist today. Officers have the flexibility to attend training opportunities throughout the state and are not restricted to the defined boundaries in order to reach the educational proficiency necessary to become an effective officer. Illustrations #3 and #4 give a complete summary of funding provided to the Mobile Team Units in Fiscal Year 2023 as well as a full account of each MTU in Illustration #11.

Mobile Team Unit Productivity in Fiscal Year 2023

The Mobile Team Training Units training activity was negatively impacted by COVID-19 in Fiscal Year 2021 and transitioned slowly to a return of normalcy in 2022. However, in 2023 law enforcement training would again be thrust into the challenge of more changes with the implementation of the SAFE-T Acts first full-year for MTU's. Nonetheless, the Mobile Teams conducted 44,776 hours of instruction at various sites and locations throughout the state which was

an increase of more than 7,000 hours from 2022. A total of 179,025 registrations were processed for courses tracked by the Mobile Team Units. Law enforcement agencies throughout the state committed 967,522 man-hours to training conducted through the Mobile Team Units. This high level of Mobile Team Unit training activity provides convincing evidence of their continued value and acceptance by the local law enforcement community to not only train, but to follow the lead of both the Governor and Legislation following the implementation of the SAFE-T Act. Illustration #5 provides a summary, by Mobile Team Unit and in total, of program activity/productivity in Fiscal Year 2023. In addition, this years' report provides the overall view of training, costs, and investments by each MTU throughout the state.

Mobile Team Unit Cost Effectiveness in Fiscal Year 2023

The delivery of training through the 13 Mobile Team Units continues to be justified by measures of efficiency and cost effectiveness. In Fiscal Year 2023, the Mobile Team Units provided a high volume of training at a cost per instructional hour, per trainee hour, and the per training man-hour. These three measures have three different values based upon the dollars calculated in their expenditures. Those three vital costs include: State Funds Only that are allocated, State & Federal funds combined, and finally, ALL training costs including: State, Federal, and Local costs. Local costs include membership dues as well as soft-match which is those local dollars expended to pay officers while in training. Considering the volume of training delivered, the cost effectiveness ratio seems to be well within acceptable parameters and all three costs are seen in Illustration #12. Perhaps the most notable cost is that of State, Federal, and membership funds which equates to: \$200.52 per instructional hour and \$ 10.09 per training hour. Illustration #6 provides a breakdown of Mobile Team Unit training cost effectiveness data for Fiscal Year 2023 to which comparisons can be made to the increase in number of Registrants following COVID which has allowed the cost to see a decrease (costs not included as in 2022 was the soft-match provided by departments). Additionally, Illustration #12 shows all three funding comparisons and their costs with Illustration #6 & Illustration #12 providing the most accurate cost of training when considering projected and actual training dollars invested.

Lastly, the Board and the Mobile Team Units conducted Mandatory Firearms Training Courses for law enforcement officers throughout the State consistent with mandatory provisions of the Illinois Peace Officer Firearm Training Act (P.A. 86-1324). The Mobile Team Units offered 146 Mandatory Firearms courses to 466 officers. Illustration #7 provides a summary of courses offered and total officers trained in Mandatory Firearms. In 2022, this Mandatory Training for all Officers saw a drastic adjustment to the training standard by increasing the qualification score to pass from 70% to 80% and the reported growth of both classes that were offered and officers trained display the training standard clearly rising across Illinois and within all MTU's. Mobile Team Unit and Academy firearms ranges are inspected for safety and Board standards by qualified Board range staff each fiscal year. During Fiscal Year 2023 Board staff inspected all ranges used to conduct Mandatory Firearms Instruction. Each completed range inspection has a written report on file at the Board office and includes a documented articulation of the inspection as well as photos. In addition,

ILETSB has seen an increase in requests for further inspections to create and certify more qualified ranges throughout the State of Illinois so as to meet the high demand of additional hours of training in the USE of FORCE as set by the SAFE-T Act.

Current and Future Funding

As detailed in Illustration #4 of this report, the State of Illinois provided funding totaling \$10,356,191.79 to 13 Mobile Team Units through the ASSIST Program, under the provisions of the Intergovernmental Law Enforcement Officers In-Service Training Act. Anticipating that adequate state funds are available; the Board would hope to provide the 13 Mobile Team Units with funding, to include grants and specialized training, that will allow the Illinois Law Enforcement Training & Standards Board to continue the evolution of law enforcement training that will most certainly allow Illinois to remain upon the leader board for In-Service Training across the country. Following the SAFE-T Acts first full year, our office has been able to evaluate the needs, plan for additional changes, and be the innovative structure necessary to prepare and continue to provide the most effective and proficient law enforcement, correctional officer, and court security officer for all to mirror.

Illustration #8 & #10 provide an in depth look at areas of Specialized Training (CIT) while Illustration #9 provides a look at the Traffic Safety Grant administered through the Illinois Department of Transportation in partnership with ILETSB and the Mobile Training Units.

Summary

Through the efforts of Governor JB Pritzker, the Illinois General Assembly and the Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board; state and local law enforcement officers are provided an opportunity to attend "a greater level of professional development" and "in-service" training upon completion of their academy assignment. The MTU programs are and will continue to evolve around the state's law enforcement needs with the assistance and guidance of the Governor, Legislature, and the MTU's as well as our office, community stakeholders, and our citizenry. MTU's continue the innovation of "In-House Training", due to the enormous and focused effort on Use of Force Curriculum Development and Scenario Based Role Playing. ILETSB will continue building our instructor pool and training curriculums as both the need is obvious, and the demand remains. It is these specific trainings that will better prepare officers in simulated real-life situations to enhance their skills and abilities in the decision-making process given such incidents can occur within seconds. The State of Illinois and its citizenry deserve the very best from their Policing Community and each of their Law Enforcement Officers and Administrators have a responsibility to provide this to them. Illinois residents have always been protected by professionally trained, competent men and women, who recognize their responsibility to maintain top job performance. Today more than ever, this need has grown immensely given the ever-changing demands placed upon our Men and Women in uniform. The Law Enforcement Community has openly accepted the responsibility and need for

more and greater training. It will be the common goal of ILETSB & ALL our partners in the training arena, to openly discuss, identify, build, and acknowledge the need for added training, criticism, the development of better training, and most importantly a concerted and honorable look at where our profession stands today and who we want serving this profession and the community in the future.

Please kindly accept the 2023 ILETSB Fiscal Report on behalf of Director Keith Calloway and each Mobile Training Unit Coordinator and their staffs.

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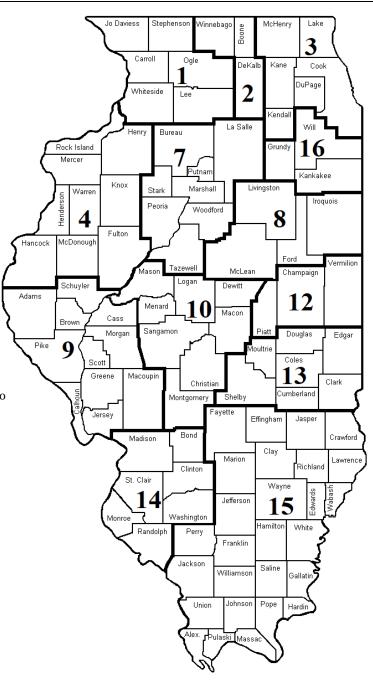

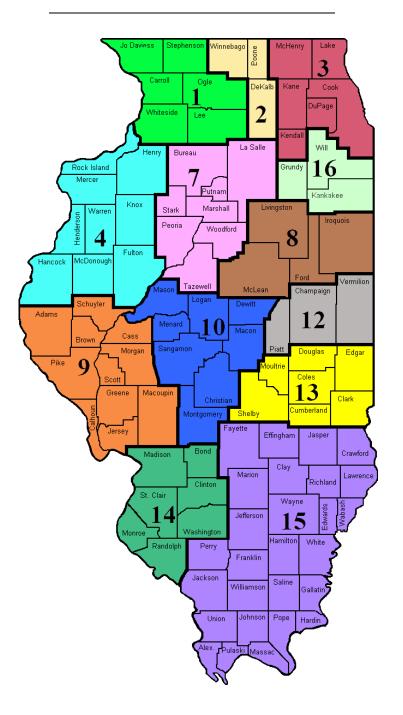

APPENDIX A

LOCAL GOVERNMENT

(50 ILCS 720/) Intergovernmental Law Enforcement Officer's In-Service Training Act.

(50 ILCS 720/1) (from Ch. 85, par. 561)

Sec. 1. Short title. This Act shall be known and may be cited as the "Intergovernmental Law Enforcement Officer's In-Service Training Act".

(Source: P.A. 82-674.)

(50 ILCS 720/2) (from Ch. 85, par. 562)

Sec. 2. Definitions.

"Board" means the Illinois Law Enforcement Training Standards Board created by the Illinois Police Training Act.

"Director" means the Executive Director of the Board.

"Chairman" means the Chairman of the Board.

"Appointed Member" means a member of the Board appointed by the Governor pursuant to the Illinois Police Training Act and designated by the Director to serve on an Advisory Board.

"Mobile Team In-Service Training Unit" or "Mobile Team" means an organization formed by a combination of units of local government and the Board and established under this Act to deliver in-service training at scheduled times and selected sites within a geographic region to (i) local and State law enforcement officers (whether employed on a full-time or part-time basis) and (ii) retired law enforcement officers qualified under federal law to carry a concealed weapon.

"Advisory Board" means a Board composed of a representative number of county board members, mayors, chiefs of police, and sheriffs of participating units of local government, and the Director, Chairman or appointed member of the Illinois Law Enforcement Training Standards Board. The composition and number of each Advisory Board will be determined by the participants. Members of the Advisory Board shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for reasonable expenses incurred in carrying out their duties.

"Unit of local government" means a unit of local government as defined in Article VII, Section 1 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970 and includes both home rule units and units which are not home rule units.

(50 ILCS 720/3) (from Ch. 85, par. 563)

Sec. 3. Powers and Duties.

- (a) Powers and Duties of the Advisory Board.
- (1) To incorporate as a general not-for-profit corporation or other appropriate structure under Illinois law.
 - (2) To adopt By-Laws and Operating Procedures.
 - (3) To designate a Financial Officer who is an elected local government official.
- (4) To employ a coordinator and to approve the employment of such other full or part-time staff as may be required.
 - (5) To develop and approve the total budget for the Mobile Team annually.
 - (6) To determine equitable formulae for providing the local share of cost of the

Mobile Team, and to assure receipt of such funds from participating units of local government.

- (7) To oversee the development of training programs, the delivery of training, and the proper expenditure of funds.
- (8) To carry out such other actions or activities appropriate to the operation of the Mobile Team including but not limited to contracting for services and supplies, and purchase of furniture, fixtures, equipment and supplies.
- (9) To exercise all other powers and duties as are reasonable to fulfill its functions in furtherance of the purposes of this Act.
- (b) Powers and Duties of the Illinois Law Enforcement Training Standards Board.
 - (1) To act as the State agency participant on each Mobile Team Advisory Board.
- (2) To act as the State agency to coordinate the actions of Mobile Teams established in the State.
- (3) To determine that the Mobile Team meets the criteria for the receipt of funds from the State in accordance with Section 4 of this Act.
- (4) To budget for and authorize quarterly disbursement of State funds up to 50% of the total approved budget of the eligible Mobile Team.
- (5) To establish such reasonable rules and regulations as the Director deems necessary to carry out the duties described in this Act, including those relating to the annual certification of retired law enforcement officers qualified under federal law to carry a concealed weapon.
- (c) Powers and Duties of the Coordinator of an Advisory Board.
 - (1) To manage and coordinate the ongoing operations of the Mobile Team.
 - (2) To employ and supervise additional authorized full or part-time staff.
- (3) To arrange for qualified instructors from among the employees of State, local or federal Departments or agencies wherever practical and to obtain other instructional services as required.

(50 ILCS 720/4) (from Ch. 85, par. 564)

- Sec. 4. State Funding-Minimum Criteria. A Mobile Team In-Service Training Unit which meets the minimum criteria established in this Section is eligible to receive State funds to help defray the costs of operation. To be eligible a Mobile Team must:
- (1) Be established and operating pursuant to the Intergovernmental Cooperation Section Article VII, Section 10, of the Illinois Constitution of 1970 and must involve two or more units of local government including at least one county and the Board.
- (2) Establish an Advisory Board composed of elected local officials and chief law enforcement officers from participating units of local government and the Director, Chairman or appointed member of the Board to oversee the operations of the Mobile Team and make such reports to the Board as the Board may require.
- (3) Designate an elected local official to act as the financial officer of the Mobile Team for all participating units of government, and to receive and expend funds for the operation of the Mobile Team.

- (4) Limit its operations to in-service training of law enforcement personnel employed by the State, by units of local government or by the Federal government or their agencies and departments in the administration of justice or retired law enforcement officers qualified under federal law to carry a concealed weapon.
- (5) Cooperate with the Board in order to assure compliance with this Act and to enable the Board to fulfill its duties under this Act, and to supply the Board with such information as the Board deems necessary therefor.
- (6) Receive funding of up to 50% of the total approved budget of the Mobile Team from the participating units of local government.

(50 ILCS 720/5) (from Ch. 85, par. 565)

Sec. 5. Determination of eligibility - Amount. The Board shall monitor the operation of all Mobile Teams and determine their eligibility to receive State funds under this Act. From monies appropriated annually by the General Assembly for this purpose, the Director shall determine and certify to the Comptroller the amount of funds to be disbursed to each designated Mobile Team financial officer. The amount of the State funds which a Mobile Team receives hereunder shall equal up to 50% of the total approved budget of that Mobile Team. (Source: P.A. 82-674.)

(50 ILCS 720/6) (from Ch. 85, par. 566)

Sec. 6. The Director shall report annually, no later than February 1st, to the Governor and the General Assembly on the operations of the Mobile Teams. The report will also include a breakdown of the appropriation for the current fiscal year and the budget for the next fiscal year indicating the amount each Mobile Team received and will receive in the next year.
