Paul Petty read the following statement: If the Mobile Team declines the delivery of any course within its region for reasons other than duplication, the Board may determine whether the course is otherwise certifiable and/or reimbursable based upon the best interests of law enforcement.

Courses are only certified for the calendar year they are submitted, except at the Board's December quarterly meeting, courses are reviewed and certified for the following calendar year.

If modifications are made to a certified course that exceeds 10% of course content as originally presented for approval; that course must be resubmitted for certification through LETM. Please consult Board Staff whenever course revisions are made to determine if this provision is applicable.

Wood requested a motion to approve the Lead Homicide Investigators 32-Hour Continuing Education Courses submitted for January 1, 2025 – December 31, 2025 found under Tab E in the Board book.

#### VIII. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

#### A. POWER Test: Work Group Report ~ Mike Schlosser

Work Group Chair Mike Schlosser presented the Committee with a presentation on the recommended changes to the Illinois P.O.W.E.R. Test as an entry level Academy Fitness Entrance exam. The Work Group determined the P.O.W.E.R. test should remain to not only make sure future officers are fit enough to make it through the academy, but to also remove any liability issues. Schlosser discussed the problems with the currently used Cooper Test which is not validated for police. The Work Group determined a new P.O.W.E.R. test needs to be created and validated and recommended using FitForce. FitForce has been in business for over three decades, and their standards are legally defendable and designed to withstand court scrutiny. Policy development is important to FitForce, and they offer expert witness support and litigation. They also have a transportability option to validate a state. This involves comparing officers in similar states to transport the same standards from another comparable state which saves both time and money. Wisconsin used this option, and they are now using both an entrance and exit fitness exam for their recruits, however Illinois could tailor to determined needs. The Work group recommends moving away from the Cooper Institute Standards and moving forward with FitForce, possibly as a sole provider, to develop a program that will hold up in court with their legal option, and also their availability of the transportability option. Attorney John Keigher added that he has no issues with FitForce. Keigher noted that when Cooper removed themselves from police validation their employees involved with this went off on their own and created FitForce. Keigher then discussed some of the legal benefits of FitForce and how they can address what is coming next for law enforcement, specifically gender identity. Keigher stated FitForce will not only allow the Board to make the necessary changes, but also put Illinois a stronger legal position going forward.

Motion was made by Bulnes, seconded by Ryan, and carried by all members present in support of the POWER Test Work Group moving forward to explore a sole source option and move forward with a new single standard, regardless of gender, with the Board respecting transgender and non-binary individuals, one single test for all.

#### B. Court Security Curriculum ~ Eric Danford

Danford stated the new 80-hour online course will open in January. It must be completed and passed with a 70% or higher grade to move into the in-person session. The first in-person session will open and run February 3-28, 2025. There are slightly more than 350 current Court Security Officers who will need this training, and the goal is to get the existing CSOs through within 18 months.

Motion was made by Bulnes, seconded by Ryan, and carried by all members present to approve the Court Security Officer curriculum.

#### C. Part Time Academy ~ Paul Petty

Petty stated the mandatory annual review (JCAR Part 1770, Sections 105 & 202) requires the Board to annually review the curriculum. The Executive Institute will handle any updates and changes needed for their online curriculum. In addition, lesson plans have been requested from the academies. There are currently four active part time academies: MTU 3, MTU 4, MTU 10 and MTU 14. There have been 66 part time officers graduate in good standing in a little over a year and a half. These numbers have been decreasing which is a concern. There are currently 2,754 part time officers in Illinois with 41% serving north of I-80, and 58% serving south of I-80. Petty stated staff will continue to review the part time academies to be fiscally responsible. The required number [for class attendance] in the past has been 16 though staff is reviewing options to see if there needs to be a consolidation of the part time academies.

#### IX. **NEW BUSINESS**

Tuition Increase ~ John Keigher for Cheryllynn Williams

Keigher stated the cost for supplies and services has increased dramatically. The academy directors submitted a report to staff discussing the increases. Staff has reviewed the report and recommends a 10% increase. Keigher noted that Cook County Corrections is more than a 10% increase because they have not taken any increases in the BCO revisions for several years. Keigher stated these amounts are the maximum amounts the Board will pay for tuition reimbursement requests. The new amounts are located in under Tab F in the Board book.

#### III. FINANCIAL MATTERS

#### A. Financial Items ~ Stormie DeJaynes for Steven Pingolt

DeJaynes stated the FY25 expenditures through November 15, 2024 and the cash flow analysis of funds could be found under Tab F in the Board book. Since the guarterly report was completed there has been an additional \$750,000 in bills paid out to date. DeJaynes noted there are no budget issues.

Motion was made by Nugent, seconded by Watson, and carried by all members present to approve the fiscal report as presented.

#### B. Personnel Matters & DEIA Report ~ Ellen Petty

Petty noted her report could be found under Tab G in the Board book. Staff is currently working on the bargaining unit rights positions that include the Payroll/Timekeeper position, two Certification Specialists, the GATA/GATU Unit Supervisor and six GATA/GATU Specialists. If there are no applicants with rights, then these positions will go to interviews. Petty stated interviews for the Assistant Fiscal & Chief Accountability officer will begin this week, and an offer will be made to the Public Information Officer tomorrow. Three new HR, two new Assistant

Certification Counsel positions (Sangamon and Cook County), and a Special Projects Policy Advisor position will be posted soon. Petty also mentioned she recently attended a Labor Relations meeting, and the takeaway was to expect a hiring freeze in late January or early February.

#### C. Legislative and Litigation Update ~ John Keigher

Keigher mentioned the legislative veto session wrapped up last week, and there were no bills of interest pertaining to the Board. He noted staff continues to watch the Hate Crimes Bill to see if it moves. Staff continues to work on the seven drafts for next session. Keigher stated there are no updates on litigation, all cases are still in their last status.

Director Brendan Kelly arrived and was added to roll.

#### IV. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

#### A. SAFE-T Act Update ~ John Keigher

Keigher stated staff is adding new attorneys, and therefore the Board is getting closer to conducting Administrative Hearings. Since the last Board meeting there have been three meetings conducted around the Administrative Rules for the Administrative Hearings. Staff received over 90 public comments pertaining to those rules and are awaiting the mediator report before moving forward. There is a draft revision of the rules included in the Board book under Tab I. Keigher expects a few minimal changes from the JCAR office and intends to ask for a motion to approve tomorrow so staff can move forward. The draft does include the reasonable and acceptable changes, including but not limited to, following standard of notice processes, redefining the relationship with the Administrative Law Judge (ALJ), providing more time for pre-trial conferences, making sure police reports are not automatically admissible, and making sure the ALJ gives a decision in 60 days. Staff is currently working on the second notice filing, which is required through JCAR, and will be the public notice of the changes made. Chairman Smoot noted that staff went to significant lengths to ensure all parties involved were notified of the public meeting and invited to participate to give input into these rules.

#### B. Grant Updates ~ John Keigher

Keigher reported all three grants are now open for the FY25 cycle; NIBIN for \$2 MM, Camera Grants are currently at \$30 MM, and the Recruitment and Retention grant is at \$6.5 MM. He noted staff was able to accommodate the BIMP agreement to allow for more advanced funding options. It was noted the reporting requirements are more involved for the advanced funding option verses the reimbursement option.

#### V. NEW BUSINESS

#### A. Officer Reimbursement Agreements ~ John Keigher

Keigher stated staff is still reviewing issues involving agencies which require officers to sign reimbursement agreements. The issue which caused this review was settled out of court, however staff is waiting on some opinions from the Department of Labor regarding these types of officer and employee contracts. Keigher asked to table this discussion until the opinions are received.

#### B. Academy Tuition Increase ~ John Keigher for Cheryllynn Williams

Keigher stated staff has been reviewing evidence of increased costs of supplies and services from the academy directors requesting a tuition increase. After review, staff concluded a 10% increase to all academies would be recommended. There were additional funds added to the Cook County Sheriffs Office as they have not taken any of the past several increases.

Motion was made by Watson, seconded by Carroll, and carried by all members present, with Brendan Kelly recusing himself, to approve John Keigher's report which includes the Academy tuition increase as presented.

#### X. REPORT OF STANDING AND ADVISORY COMMITTEES

A. Curriculum and School Standards Advisory Committee ~ Ghida Neukirch Neukirch reported the Committee met yesterday and approved recertification of various academy courses which included the 2025 Basic Law Enforcement courses, Basic Corrections courses, Part-Time Basic Law Enforcement courses, Courtroom Security, 200-Hour Basic Arson Investigator course and the 120-Hour transition course for 2025. The policy for Mandatory Firearms Training was reaffirmed. The Committee approved courses for MTU's including courses in High-Risk Traffic Stops, DWI Detection and Advanced Roadside Impairment Driving Enforcement. Dr. Schlosser presented on the POWER Test Work Group progress and recommended an agreement with FitForce. The Committee also supported the increase in academy tuition rates for 2025.

Motion was made by Redd, seconded by Tyler, and carried by all members present, to approve the Curriculum and School Standards Advisory Committee report and their recommendations.

#### B. Finance & Legislative Committee ~ *John Idleburg*

Idleburg reported the Committee met vesterday and discussed the FY25 expenditures through November 15, 2024. He stated the funds approved for FY25 are \$147,626,600, and the expenditures are \$52,689,762.22 as of November 15, 2024. He noted the academy tuition rates were all increased by 10%. The Board staff approved headcount budget allows for a total of 66 employees for FY25. As of October 31, 2024 staff headcount was at 45 employees, and 13 positions are in various stages in the hiring process.

Motion was made by Price, seconded by Watson, and carried by all members present, to approve the Joint Finance & Legislative and Executive Committee report and their recommendations.

A. Illinois Law Enforcement Executive Institute ~ Heather Hotz Hotz reported her office continues to facilitate trainings at the highest rates in their 31 years of existence. Hotz discussed their Executive Summits, and their numbers are up 60% over last year. She highlighted a current Summit, Grant Writing for Law Enforcement Agencies Workshop. Hotz then discussed the ASSIST program reporting that IROCC has vetted over 10,000 renewal and new applications this year. The program also acquired a VirTra machine for scenario simulation training where officers can train for mandated training credit. The program has also been working with state agencies to get courses

Motion was made by Tyler, seconded by Redd, and carried by all members present to approve the Illinois Law Enforcement Executive **Institute Report.** 

- B. COPS Office ~ Deborah Spence, Assistant Director, U.S. Department of *Justice - Office of Community Oriented Policing Services* Spence expressed that her team is pleased with the partnership with ILETSB and the COPS Training Portal. This portal allows officers in Illinois more ways to meet their training requirements. Spence stated that across the nation the COPS portal has had over 35,000 new enrollments this calendar year, which includes a little over 2,300 new registered users in Illinois. She discussed some of the technical issues Illinois officers had but appreciates the dedication from ILETSB. Spence reported that as well as the portal being a useful tool for officers, it was also opened up to individual agencies to be able to track training for their staff. It is appreciated that ILETSB saw an opportunity with the portal and chose to use it to help Illinois officers meet their goals. The COPS office is here to help in any way they can.
- C. A Statewide System of In-Service Training (ASSIST) Program ~ Paul Petty Petty reported the ASSIST program report can be found under Tab K and Tab E in the Board book. There are seven attachments that pertain to the fiscal and training responsibilities of the MTU's. Chairman Smoot spoke to the new model pursuit policy and stated the roll out involves using the COPS portal.

Motion was made by Neukirch, seconded by Tyler, and carried by all members present to approve the ASSIST Report.

#### D. CIT and Mental Health Training Update ~ John Keigher for Jennifer Wooldridae

Keigher stated the report can be found under Tab L in the Board book. He highlighted the CIT Conference is scheduled for June 25-26, 2025 in East Peoria. The theme will be Building Bridges. Keigher also noted that Trooper has been very active, he recently visited the Argo High School, and the Argo Elementary School. It was an event organized by the Tails of Redemption (TOR) program. The schools had been through a tragedy and Trooper and the other TOR dogs assisted; Trooper was a student favorite. Trooper and his TOR friends also spent time at Brookfield Zoo greeting children. Keigher said staff is looking into introducing a bill initiative for the CIT Crisis Response K-9 provider.

Motion was made by Redd, seconded by Watson, and carried by all members present to approve the CIT and Mental Health Training Update.

#### E. Specialty Training Update ~ Barbara Wood

Wood stated her report can be found under Tab M in the Board book. She reported that no one sat for the Crash Reconstruction Specialist exam since the last board meeting. Neukirch asked if there is any SRO training for School Administrators, how it pertains to their role, and when to call in their officers. Wood responded that there is no training for them at this time however, they are encouraged to attend Board certified conferences. Smoot suggested we collaborate with the state Association of School Administrators and possibly speak at their conferences. It was noted that Eric Arnold [with Executive Institute works directly with schools on their threat assessments and speaks at their conferences.

Motion was made by Neukirch, seconded by Redd, and carried by all members present to approve the Specialty Training Update.

#### F. <u>Information Technology Update ~ *Kelly Ingram*</u>

Ingram noted his report is under Tab N in the Board book. He added that the updates to the Chicago office are underway, this includes adding workstations, cameras, badging systems, and things are running smoothly with the help of Director Calloway. Ingram also stated a second developer has been hired to the team with Andrew Oldfield working as his mentor. The goal is to have LEDI, LETM and PTB applications all on one platform. One additional goal is to have all testing online by end of 2025.

Motion was made by Watson, seconded by Tyler, and carried by all members present to approve the Information Technology Update.

#### A. Mandated Annual Training for Board Members ~ Pat Hahn

Hahn reminded Board members and staff to be sure to complete all mandated trainings by December 31, 2024, and to contact him with any issues.

#### B. SAFE-T Act Update ~ John Keigher

Keigher noted the top priority is getting the certification Review Panel up and running. Staff is currently working on the Administrative Rules for conducting proceedings. The Rules were filed in October, and three public meetings were offered for discussion. He stated 40% of the comments received from the public meetings were adopted, 40% of the comments were not applicable, and 20% were rejected. Keigher noted a revised draft of the rules can be found in Tab I of the Board book and went on to discuss some of the changes and the public meeting process.

#### Motion was made by Carroll, seconded by Price, and carried by all members present to approve the SAFE-T Act Update.

Director Kelly arrived and was added to the roll.

#### C. Grant Updates ~ John Keigher

Keigher reported that all three FY25 grants are now open. NIBIN Grant has \$2 MM in funding, the Recruitment and Retention Grant has about \$6.5 MM in funding and the Camera Grant currently has \$30 MM in funding. All three grants are now available for advance payment as well as reimbursement.

#### Motion was made by Watson, seconded by Redd, and carried by all members present to adopt the Grant Updates.

#### D. POWER TEST: Work Group Report ~ Mike Schlosser

Dr. Schlosser commended ILETSB for implementing wellness within the academy, and for officers throughout their career. He discussed the disadvantage of using the Cooper Test, which lacks validation for public safety personnel, and stated the Work Group recommends moving forward with FitForce. Schlosser discussed how FitForce specializes in validation, they confirm legal compliance, they make sure there is fairness and inclusivity, they offer transportability, and they will defend if necessary. Keigher then spoke to the success Wisconsin is having using FitForce. A discussion followed noting the importance of ongoing officer wellness, both physical health and mental health.

Motion was made by Price, seconded by Watson, and carried by all members present to approve the POWER TEST: Work Group Report and to explore procurement opportunities to move forward with implementation of a new fitness test.

#### E. Military Police and Department of Army Civilian Police – State Reciprocity ~ Chris Haubrich

Haubrich stated his September presentation can be found under Tab B in the Board book. Haubrich then introduced Steven Herman, a Civilian Aide to the Secretary of the Army for the State of Illinois. Herman discussed the disservice to Military Police (MP) in not allowing them to continue what they are trained to do once retired. He went on to discuss that if they were given credit for their service, and for what they have been trained to do, Illinois would become an attractive place for MPs to move to continue their career and serve in a police capacity.

Motion was made by Neukirch, seconded by Gomez, and carried by all members present to support [allowing Military Police reciprocity], subject to final review by the Director and Legal Counsel, and once IACP gives feedback on the training component as it pertains to reciprocity to make sure Military personnel are getting the appropriate training to what Illinois Law Enforcement Officers are receiving at the academies.

At this time Chairman Smoot suggested the Board move back to the tabled item.

Motion was made by Kelly, seconded by Watson, and carried by all members present to remove the report and recommendation of the Executive Nominating Committee from the table for consideration by the Board.

Executive Nominating Committee Chair Brendan Kelly stated the Committee met recently, and noted the positions of Board Chairman and Vice Chairman were opened up to anyone wanting to be considered for the positions. No members of the Board expressed any interest except for the current Chair, Sean Smoot, and current Vice Chair, John Idleburg. Kelly presented Smoot and Idleburg to the Board for a vote, and nominations were opened up from the floor. There were no nominations from the floor.

Keigher reported that the Body Camera act requires the Board to establish guidelines for any agency using body cameras. Now that the Act is more mandated the guidelines need to be updated. Keigher stated the draft was distributed at the last meeting, and it can be found under Tab I with changes noted in red. It should be noted all of the changes were taken from the Act itself. A discussion followed and one change was suggested, Keigher stated it will be corrected before publishing.

## Motion was made by Carroll, seconded by Price, and carried by all members present to approve the updated Basic Guidelines of Officer-Worn Cameras.

#### B. <u>Officer Reimbursement Agreements ~ John Keigher</u>

Keigher reported staff is waiting on guidance from the Department of Labor. He noted the case that brought this issue to light was settled out of court without Board involvement. Keigher asked the Board to table this issue at this time.

### Motion was made by Watson, seconded by Redd, and carried by all members present to table XIV, B. under New Business.

#### C. <u>Police Pursuit Guidelines ~ Paul Petty</u>

Petty stated the Police Pursuit Guidelines can be found under Tab I. The guidelines were originally adopted in 1994 and revised in 2019. Petty discussed the recommended changes and asked for approval.

## Motion was made by Watson, seconded by Redd, and carried by all members present to approve the Police Pursuit Guidelines as presented.

#### D. <u>Academy Tuition Increase ~ John Keigher for Cheryllynn Williams</u>

Keigher discussed the concerns from the academies relating to the significant increase in the costs of services and goods. The academies submitted reports relating to this issue, and after staff review it was determined that an across the board 10% increase would be justifiable. The proposed 10% increase would begin in calendar year 2025. It must be noted these numbers are the maximum allowed. In addition, the Cook County Sheriff's Correctional Academy has not received an increase in several years. After review of their records staff determined their increase should be a bit more to bring them in line with the other academies. The new academy tuition recommendations can be found under Tab F in the Board book.

Keigher noted that any Board member who has an academy would need to recuse themselves from this vote.

Motion was made by Watson, seconded by Neukirch, and carried by all members present, with Marlon Parks, Brendan Kelly and Migdalia Bulnes recusing, to approve the recommended Academy Tuition Increases.

#### XV. PUBLIC INPUT

<u>Barron Alston, Cook County Sheriff Department, Retired Investigator</u>: Mr. Alston asked the Board why he cannot acquire his IROCC card. He discussed an incident that occurred while he was out of state where a person he previously arrested approached him. He said his family was involved in this incident and he wants to know why as a former Corrections Officer, and then Investigator, why he cannot have an IROCC card.

Marcus Hargrett, Cook County Sheriff Department, Retired Sergeant: Mr. Hargrett stated the IROCC Program Director had sent letters to his fellow retirees stating they are being refused IROCC cards as they are not entitled to receive the privileges granted by LEOSA. Hargrett asked how the Cook County Corrections Officers do not meet these criteria. He referred to 730 ILCS 125/26-1. He then asked why Chairman Smoot has not been removed from the Board and prosecuted for fraudulently obtaining an IROCC card while denying their rights. Hargrett noted the IROCC issues started when Dart became sheriff, as prior to Dart, retired Corrections Officers were given IROCC cards.

Luis Chaves, Illinois Department of Corrections, Staff Development Specialist: Mr. Chaves stated that he will never be able to qualify for IROCC based on the LEOSA guidelines. Chaves referenced the same Administrative Code that Hargrett mentioned earlier. He mentioned that LEOSA is a federal act, and he finds it concerning that the Board is using the definition of a law enforcement officer from the Illinois Police Training Act, and the federal act prevails in this incident. He is detailed to the Department of Corrections Parole Division and discussed the dangers of the job. Chaves noted that they have statutory powers of arrest and LEOSA does not give a limit to this. He wonders why the Board is sticking with a state statute instead of the federal act. He also spoke to the fitness of officers and noted how overworked officers currently are.

<u>Tiffany Brand, Illinois Department of Corrections, Parole Agent</u>: Ms. Brand stated she has 26 years with IDOC, with 21 years of that as a parole agent. Like all officers, Corrections Officers take an oath to uphold the law, and to serve and protect the State of Illinois. They carry this oath into retirement, and because of all they have done and seen they should be protected into retirement. She asked for HB4667 to be placed on the agenda at the March meeting to start the process to implement protection for Correctional Officers, Parole Agents, Cook County Sheriffs and others not able to receive an IROCC card.

It was noted there was an incorrect graduation date for PTI Academy it should be April 24, 2025, not April 4, 2025.

Chairman Smoot announced the next Curriculum and School Standards Advisory Committee meeting, and the Joint Finance & Legislative and Executive Committee meeting, will be held on March 5, 2025 in Springfield, Illinois. The next Board meeting will be held on March 6, 2025 in Springfield, Illinois.

#### CANINE REPORT MARCH 2025 BOARD MEETING



This is to propose changes to the current Canine Training Minimum Requirements to enable agencies to certify cannabis detection certification to existing non-cannabis certified canines. The recommendation is to add:

#### Section 1745.113:

- a) Should the Employing Agency elect to add additional drug odor(s) pursuant to 50 ILCS 705/10.12 "Cannabis Control Act, the Illinois Controlled Substances Act, or the Methamphetamine Control and Community Protection Act" to a canine after the canine team's Initial Qualification, a supplemental requirement for additional training must be completed.
- b) This supplemental course must consist of at least 40 hours of training conducted in consecutive weeks and must be presented to the Canine Handler and the Drug Detection Canine as a team in Illinois that possesses a current drug detection Qualification through the State of Illinois.
- c) The Employing Agency may choose any canine provider that conducts a course of training which is capable of meeting the requirements set forth in Section 1745.112. The canine should not be utilized for the purposes of search & seizure until the canine team has achieved a new qualification after the 40-hour minimum cannabis imprinting process has concluded and Daily Training Reports have been approved by the Board.
- d) The Canine Handler must maintain daily records of training content and activity during Initial and/or Supplemental Drug Detection Training Course. Upon conclusion of the Supplemental Course to where drug odor(s) have been added to the skill set of the canine, these records should be provided to the Administrator of the Supplemental Drug Detection Canine Training Course and the Trainer(s) shall verify the accuracy of the records to the best of their knowledge and ability. Once the team's Daily Training Reports have been approved, the team will be scheduled as a "New Canine Team" and participate in an Initial Drug Detection Compliance Qualification Assessment.

### HIGH LEVEL OVERVIEW OF HIRING PROGRESS SINCE THE PASSAGE OF THE SAFE-T ACT

- 52 positions have been filled as of 2/16/25:
  - o 9 internal promotions.
  - o 4 internal transfers.
  - o 15 new hires to State of Illinois employment.
  - o 16 promotions from other agencies.
  - o 1 reinstatement from another agency.
  - o 7 transfers from other agencies.
- 6 employees have transferred out to other agencies.
- 8 employees have retired.
- 2 employees have been discharged (One was grieved and went to arbitration.)
- 1 employee was returned to work due to an arbitration award & then retired.
- 1 employee returned to work after a 4-year leave of absence.
- 2 retired employees returned on a 75-day temporary appointment both are now ended.
- 18 positions are currently in various stages of the hiring process.
- 4 new job descriptions are currently under development to be completed and posted to fill in FY25.
- The agency headcount included in the <u>approved</u> FY25 budget allows for 66 employees.

#### PERSONNEL UPDATES SINCE SEPTEMBER QUARTERLY REPORT

• Headcount as of February 16<sup>th</sup> is 45, an increase of 2 employees from the last report. We have 3 additional employees starting in their new positions on March 1<sup>st</sup> to include a promotion from another agency, a new appointment to state service, and an internal promotion.

#### DETAILED STATUS OF HIRING SEQUENCES CURRENTLY IN PROGRESS

1. <u>Public Information/Communications Officer</u> – HIRED - This employee was onboarded on January 6<sup>th</sup> and is new to the State of Illinois.

- 2. <u>Chief Certification Counsel</u> HIRED This employee was transferred from another position within the agency on November 16, 2024. That other position will need to be posted to backfill.
- 3. <u>Assistant Certification Counsel Sangamon County</u> Interviews for this position are scheduled for late February.
- 4. <u>Assistant Certification Counsel Cook County</u> Interviews for this position are scheduled for late February.
- 5. <u>Assistant Fiscal Officer & Chief Accountability Officer</u> HIRED This employee is scheduled to be onboarded on March 3, 2025 and has been promoted from a position with the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity.
- 6. <u>GATA/GATU Unit Supervisor</u> HIRED This employee was promoted from another position within the agency with an effective date of March 1, 2025.
- 7. <u>GATA/GATU Specialist</u> Executive I Interviews for this position were concluded in early February and as soon as background checks have been completed on the three top candidates, job offers will be negotiated with start dates of March 16<sup>th</sup> or April 1<sup>st</sup>.
- 8. <u>Payroll/Timekeeper & Telecom Coordinator</u> As soon as background check has been completed on this candidate, job offer will be negotiated with a start date of March 16<sup>th</sup>.

- 10. <u>Classifications, Transactions, Leave, & Recruiting Specialist</u> Human Resources Specialist Interviews for this position have been scheduled for late March.
- 11. <u>Benefits & Retirement Representative</u> Human Resources Representative This job description has been created and submitted to CMS Classifications for approval and upload into the Employee Central system for posting. We anticipate this job will be posted in late March or early April. This is an AFSCME bargaining unit covered position.
- 12. <u>Special Projects & Policy Advisor</u> Senior Public Service Administrator "SPSA" Interviews for this position have been scheduled for mid-March.
- 13. <u>Private Secretary II</u> Confidential Secretary Cook HIRED This existing position is 4d1 exempt and can be selected and appointed by the Executive Director without posting. Candidate was vetted by the Lt. Gov's office and background checked by the agency, and is scheduled to be appointed with an effective date of March 1, 2025.

- 15. <u>Internal Tech Support Specialist</u> Information Services Specialist "ISS" I This position falls under the IT Section of the Administration Division and would provide tech support to internal users of the agency systems, servers, and applications. This job is in the process of being created and will be posted as soon as the job description is approved by CMS. This is an AFSCME bargaining unit covered position.
- 16. <u>Investigations Manager</u> Public Service Administrator "PSA" This supervisory position falls under the Investigations Section of the Professional Standards Division and is a high priority. It is currently in the process of being developed and will be posted as soon as the job description is approved by CMS and union inclusion/exclusion is determined.
- 17. <u>Certification Manager</u> Public Service Administrator "PSA" This supervisory position falls under the Certification Section of the Professional Standards Division and is a high priority. It is currently in the process of being developed and will be posted as soon as the job description is approved by CMS and union inclusion/exclusion is determined.

# ONCE WE FILL THE POSITIONS ABOVE, AND BACKFILLED ANY POSITIONS VACATED DUE TO INTERNAL PROMOTIONS AND TRANSFERS, WE WILL HAVE REACHED OUR FY25 HEADCOUNT LIMIT AND WILL NOT BE ABLE TO FILL ANY ADDITIONAL POSITIONS UNTIL FY26, which begins on July 1, 2025.

- 18. <u>Manager of Basic and Part-Time Training</u> Public Service Administrator "PSA" This split-class supervisory position falls under the Basic Training Section of the Training Division and is a high priority. It is currently in the process of being developed and will be posted as soon as the job description is approved by CMS and union inclusion/exclusion is determined.
- 19. <u>Curriculum Legal Specialist</u> Public Service Administrator "PSA" Opt 8L 4d5 This high priority split-class position falls under the Legal Section of the Administration Division but works closely with the Basic Training Section. It is currently in the process of being developed and will be posted as soon as the job description is approved by CMS and union inclusion/exclusion is determined.
- 20. <u>Basic Law Enforcement (BLE) Curriculum Specialist</u> Executive II This position falls under the Basic Training Section of the Training Division and will develop, maintain, and oversee the BLE curriculum. It is currently in the process of being developed and will be posted as soon as the job description is approved by CMS. This is an AFSCME bargaining unit covered position.
- 21. <u>Basic Correctional Officer & Court Security Officer (BCO/CSO) Curriculum Specialist</u> Executive II This position falls under the Basic Training Section of the Training Division and will develop, maintain, and oversee the BCO & CSO curriculums. It is currently in the process of being developed and will be posted as soon as the job description is approved by CMS. This is an AFSCME bargaining unit covered position.
- 22. <u>Academy Auditor</u> Executive II This position falls under the Basic Training Section of the Training Division and will perform auditing functions of the ILETSB certified academies throughout the state. It is currently in the process of being developed and will be posted as soon as the job description is approved by CMS. This is an AFSCME bargaining unit covered position.

- 23. <u>Intake Specialist</u> Office Specialist This position falls under the Professional Standards Division. It is currently in the process of being developed and will be posted as soon as the job description is approved by CMS. This is an AFSCME bargaining unit covered position.
- 24. <u>LHI & Crash Reconstruction Administrator</u> Executive I This existing position falls under the Specialized Programs Section of the Training Division. This job has already been created and can be posted with only minimal formatting changes to accommodate the new system. This is an AFSCME bargaining unit covered position. This position is under consideration for elimination it has been moved to low priority until a decision is made.
- 25. <u>Professional Standards Secretary</u> Executive Secretary I This existing position falls under the Professional Standards Division and will be re-written to provide secretarial and administrative support for this division. This job can be posted with only minimal formatting changes to accommodate the new system. This is an AFSCME bargaining unit covered position. This position has been moved to low priority until the Manager positions have been created and filled in Professional Standards.
- 26. <u>Internal Auditor</u> This position is newly added to the hiring plan. It will fall under the Operations Division and Fiscal Section. It is yet to be determined what the classification and job details of this position will be, aside from its main duty of internal auditing. More details to come.

#### DIVERSITY, EQUITY, INCLUSION & ACCESSIBILITY (DEIA)

The mandatory <u>Diversity</u>, <u>Equity</u>, <u>Inclusion</u>, <u>and Accessibility Training</u> and <u>LGBTQIA+ Equity and Inclusion Training</u> for 2025 is now available on OneNet. This training is due to be completed by all staff and Board members by December 31<sup>st</sup> of each year. Thank you to everyone who completed their 2024 training by the deadline.

ILETSB's former Human Resources Associate was promoted to the DEIA/EEO/AA & Recruiting Specialist\_position effective February 16, 2025. She has now taken over these duties from the HR & Labor Relations Manager and has been immersed in training.

#### HUMAN CAPITAL MANAGEMENT (HCM) PROJECT STATUS

During February 2025, ILETSB was given clearance to finally submit 2024 pending transactions into the system. This included all transactions from February 2024 up through December 2024. They are still working out bugs on the CMS and DoIT side as they're discovered, but we are getting closer to being able to use this system as intended each month.

The Payroll, Time & Attendance, Learning Management, and Performance & Goal Management modules of the HCM project were originally planned to be rolled out at various times between now and the end of 2025. However, due to the extended timeframe and difficulties with the roll out of Employee Central, it is likely that those additional modules will not be rolled out until a later date.

#### MISCELLANEOUS PROJECTS & REPORTS

HR staff has now taken all required online annual trainings for 2025 on Interviewing, Conflicts of Interest, and Confidentiality, and on the use of the new Position Management portal on the Personnel Workbench. In addition, there will be in-person training offered by CMS Bureau of Personnel during the months of May through August, which HR staff will be attending, as well.

HR staff has been working in conjunction with CMS Labor and CMS Classifications on final stages of a reclassification project regarding Police Training Specialists (Field Investigators). Once this project is complete, those employees will be reclassified due to the additional minimum requirements of the positions under the SAFE-T Act and they will receive a pay increase. (The amount of that increase is currently being negotiated with AFSCME by CMS.)

The ILETSB FY25 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter EEO/AA Report was completed and submitted as required on January 14, 2025.

Responses have been sent to the external auditors regarding final follow-up requests and clarifications regarding personal services matters.

Eighteen tabs of the agency's ISL document and related narratives have been completed and submitted to the Fiscal Officer for FY26 budgeting related to agency hiring and personnel.

One employee started a Medical Leave of Absence at the end of August 2024. This leave has been extended until March (and may possibly be extended again).

One employee was placed on Administrative Leave in mid-November, 2024 for a Fit for Duty evaluation. Upon receipt of Fit for Duty report, the employee was then placed on a Medical Leave of Absence until mid-April, pending recommended treatment and follow up evaluation to determine fitness to return to work.

Research, investigation, discussions, and documentation is ongoing regarding both a grievance and a discrimination complaint received from an employee in January. This process has involved the agency Ethics Officer, Legal staff, a staff investigator, CMS Personnel Legal, and CMS Labor Relations. Grievance was denied at Step 1 and has since been moved to Step 3 by the union.

#### TRAINING OVERVIEWS

LEAD Series – Police Supervisory Role in the 21st Century; January 13 – 31, 2025; Elgin PD

This updated 80-hour course delivers the fundamental skills that new and experienced first-line supervisors who have not completed formal supervisory training need to be successful. PSR21C focuses on the role and functions of the first-line supervisor and builds a rock-solid introduction to management-level decision-making. The course is designed against the backdrop of current challenges in policing to provide a leadership foundation for the upwardly mobile supervisor.

Course topics and content may change or be modified from time to time, ensuring that topics are recent and relevant, to address emerging issues impacting policing and provide the most up-to-date information meeting the current needs of law enforcement leaders.

**Course Format** – PSR21C consists of two one-week (40 hours per week), in-person, classroom sessions led by Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board Executive Institute instructors, supplemented by reading and writing assignments. In addition to classroom discussions, this course provides participants with the opportunity to network with supervisory staff members from other agencies.

**Prerequisites** – Applicants must be sworn law enforcement officers or law enforcement support personnel employed by a local, state, or federal agency who have first-line supervisory responsibilities (implementing agency procedures and supervising/evaluating personnel) or who are preparing for advancement to a supervisory position within six months.

#### Live Webinar – Empathy and Inclusion; Katharine Manning; January 16, 2025; Zoom

Empathy is a workplace superpower. It forges bonds, builds inclusion, and enhances long-lasting engagement and productivity. This foundational training provides the skills to build empathy at work for better collaboration and stronger teams. This ninety-minute session covers the definition of empathy and why empathy at work is so important. Attendees will then learn the practical steps we can all take to increase our empathy at work, and how to identify and confront common barriers to empathy, like distancing assumptions about others' backgrounds and experiences.

#### **Presenter: Katharine Manning**

Katharine Manning is the author of The Empathetic Workplace: Five Steps to a Compassionate, Calm, and Confident Response to Trauma on the Job (HarperCollins Leadership 2021) and the President of Blackbird DC. She has worked on issues of trauma and victimization for more than 25 years.

As a Senior Attorney Advisor with the Executive Office for United States Attorneys, for fifteen years Manning guided the Justice Department through its response to victims in cases ranging from terrorism to large -scale financial fraud to child exploitation. Some of the cases she advised on include the Boston Marathon bombing, the Pulse nightclub and South Carolina AME church shootings, the uprising in Charlottesville, the Madoff investment fraud, and the federal case against Larry Nassar, doctor for the U.S. Women's Olympic Gymnastics team.

Manning now uses her expertise to help organizations prepare for and respond to the challenges they face involving employees and clients who may be in trauma. A member of the bar in Washington, D.C. and California, Manning also served as an attorney with the law firm Pillsbury Winthrop in San Francisco, where she represented Fortune 500 companies in class actions, insurance, and media cases. She is a graduate of Smith College and the University of Virginia School of Law and teaches at American University and in the Master's in Trauma-Informed Leadership Program at Dominican University.

#### Live Webinar – Foundations of Motor Vehicle Crash Investigations; Kiersten Reif; February 25, 2025

Foundations of Fatal Motor Vehicle Crash Investigations is a live two-hour webinar designed to provide law enforcement officers with in-depth instruction on investigative techniques for various considerations in fatal motor vehicle crash (MVC) investigations. In 2023, Illinois alone saw 1,169 fatal crashes – all of which required law enforcement officers to make determinations on critical aspects of these incidents. While many courses cover the vehicle dynamics of fatal crashes (a crucial component to MVC investigations), the purpose of this webinar is to discuss additional crash elements to assist investigators with drawing conclusions such as mechanism of injuries, occupant seating positions, and crash types. In addition to injury mechanisms and crash types, this webinar will cover the different causes and manners of death associated with MVCs and methods investigators can use to assist the death investigation agency with coming to these conclusions. The instructor will review multiple case studies to further expound upon the complex aspects of a MVC investigation and encourage critical thinking, prompting officers to prepare for the application of investigative and evidence procedures at their agencies.

Presenter: Kiersten Reif

Kiersten Reif, D-ABMDI is an experienced instructor and law enforcement professional with over a decade of varied experience in patrol, investigations, and crime scene processing. After earning her bachelor's degree, she started as a patrol officer and major crash investigator for the Highland Park Police Department. She then pursued a career in the medical field while continuing to work as a patrol officer and major crash investigator. As a death investigator certified by the American Board of Medicolegal Death Investigators at the Lake County Coroner's Office, she conducted death investigations and collaborated with local agencies. Kiersten utilizes her knowledge as a former death investigator and current patrol officer and evidence technician on the Lake County Major Crime Task Force to instruct new and veteran officers in various topics related to death investigation and evidence processing throughout the state at local departments, MTUs, conferences, webinars, and the Homeland Security Training Institute. PER21C is an executive development program designed to expand and enhance senior law enforcement leaders' strategic leadership knowledge, skills, and abilities. Participants completing this program will build their individual, team, and organizational leadership competencies to address the challenges of emerging organizational and community needs.

This course is designed for chief executives, senior managers, and command staff who ultimately will lead police agencies

**Course Format** – The 100-hour course consists of three weeks of classroom modules, selected article reviews, textbook readings, and writing assignments that will require homework and will be graded.

**Prerequisites** — Applicants must be sworn law enforcement officers or law enforcement support personnel employed by a local, state, or federal agency who are senior law enforcement leaders (Chiefs, Deputy Chiefs, Captains) responsible for overseeing the development of policy and procedures in law enforcement agencies; and Lieutenants/Commanders who have completed the *Police Mid-Management Role in the 21st Century* course, or equivalent training, and have a minimum of 5 years in current rank.

Mandates: Civil Rights, Crisis Intervention, Cultural Competency, Officer Wellness/Mental Health, Procedural Justice, Use of Force (100 hrs.)

#### Workshop – Grant Writing for LE Agencies; Evan Sorg; March 19 - 20, 2024; Mount Vernon PD

Law Enforcement Grant Writing 101 is a two-day, 14-hour training program designed to provide the knowledge, tools, and skills required for law enforcement agencies to successfully apply for federal, state, and foundation grant funding for equipment, technology, training, personnel, and more. The overall goals for the course include:

- (1) providing participants with the requisite knowledge to write effective and winning grant applications and
- (2) preparing students for the grant writing process by having them compile all information/data necessary to write applications and enter this information into the provided grant writing toolkit.

To pass the training, students must receive a 70% or greater on the post-test administered at the conclusion of the course. This course is tailored for sworn and civilian law enforcement employees entrusted with, or aspiring to undertake, grant writing responsibilities for their departments. Past participants have included Chiefs of Police, executive-level supervisors, line-level supervisors, and officers, as well as civilian administrative staff employed by law enforcement agencies. Participants receive the custom-made grant writing workbook, the proprietary grant writing toolkit, and state and federal grant examples.

Presenter: Evan Sorg

Evan Sorg is a former New York City Police Officer, the Principal and lead grant writer for Police Grant Writing LLC, and an Associate Professor of Law and Justice Studies at Rowan University. He has been working with and training law enforcement on topics such as grant writing, for over 10 years. He served as a grant reviewer for the Department of Homeland Security, Department of Justice and has reviewed manuscripts for over 25 different criminal justice journals. The New Jersey State Police contracted him to complete a statewide gang assessment as part of a \$2.1 million dollar COPS Anti Gang Initiative grant in 2016. This report provides an update of the Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board Federal Homeland Security Grant funded through the Illinois Homeland Security Advisory Council (HSAC).

#### TRAINING AND FUNDING

ILETSB has been a voting member of the Illinois Homeland Security Advisory Council and recipient of homeland security funds since 2002. ILETSB has four active awards, Federal Fiscal Years 2021, 2022, 2023, and 2024; years 2021, 2022, and 2023 the award is \$391,000. For FFY 2024 the award is in the amount of \$136,000. The decrease is the result of a 10 percent reduction to the State of Illinois Homeland Security Grant Program. This 10 percent reduction impacted all stakeholders receiving homeland security funds in Illinois. ILETSB is currently in Federal Fiscal Year 2021 with the performance period ending June 30, 2024.

#### ILLINOIS HOMELAND SECURITY ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Illinois Homeland Security Advisory Council met on January 22, 2025. The national and state homeland security updates were provided by STIC.

Chief Security Information Officer Jennifer Rominger provided a cyber security briefing.

HSAC members voted and approved on unspent funds going towards projects submitted by HSAC membership.

Next full quarterly meeting of the HSAC will be on May 7, 2025 at 10:00 am at IEMA.

#### CENTER FOR HOMELAND SECURITY LEADERSHIP

#### **Program Director - Derek Carle**

Derek Carle continues to serve on the Illinois Homeland Security Advisory Council (IHSAC) and serves on two sub-committees of the IHSAC: Law Enforcement Mutual Aid Committee and the new Prevention Committee.

Derek serves on three national committees pertaining to law enforcement and incident management. Derek is a member of a law enforcement committee to address incident command/NIMS to law enforcement executives, command staff and officers. Derek is also on the Incident Commander and Intelligence/Investigations committees.

Derek is also a credentialed Type 2 Incident Commander for the State of Illinois.

#### **Planning Workshops**

During this quarter the Mobile Training Units held 25 workshops for 405 officers totaling 4,192 hours of training. UASI held 0 workshops. The workshops were paid out of the FFY2021 HSGP.

#### **Active Threat Master Course**

Funding has been provided by ILETSB to conduct our fifth class in the spring of 2025. Thirty-one law enforcement officers will be attending the spring course. Twenty-six officers are from municipal agencies, 2 from county agencies, 2 from university agencies, and 1 from the Illinois Secretary of State Office. Tentative dates are: March 10-14, April 7-11, April 28-May 2, and May 19-23.

The Illinois Active Threat Master Instructor Certification Program builds upon the ITOA's (Illinois Tactical Officers Association) TPO (Tactical Patrol Officer) program by offering an advanced certification for current instructors throughout the state.

The 4-week program will certify instructors to teach: Use of Force, High Risk Patrol Tactics, Active Threat/Rapid Deployment, Solo Officer Response, Rescue Task Force, and Urban Tactic/MACTAC (Multiple Assault Counter Terrorist Action Capabilities).

## **Homeland Security Workshop Catalog**

With guidance from Mobile Team Unit Coordinators, staff continues to review and revise the workshop catalog. Coordinators are encouraged to submit new workshops for consideration.

Based on the desire of the Illinois Homeland Security Director and the IHSAC, the homeland security grant guidance and catalog will be going through a small revision. The core courses for the catalog will consist of the Active Threat Master course (every other year), Active Threat End-User courses, Community Behavioral Threat Assessment (different from school based Behavioral Threat Assessment), Digital Threat Assessment, Cyber Security, Domestic Violent Extremism, Soft Targets/Crowded Spaces and a few of the popular courses that address the Vision 2025 Homeland Security Strategy.

#### Illinois School and Campus Safety Program

#### **Presentations and Work Groups**

Eric Arnold, Program Director for the Illinois School and Campus Safety Program, co-chairs the Prevention subcommittee, and continues to serve on the Law Enforcement Mutual Aid Subcommittee, the Emergency Management Subcommittee, and the Cybersecurity Subcommittee of the HSAC. Eric is actively participating in the statewide Targeted Violence Prevention Initiative.

Eric continues to partner with the Illinois State Board of Education, the Illinois Association of Regional Superintendents, the University of Illinois Chicago, Safe2Help Illinois, Southern Illinois University Carbondale, Southern Illinois University Edwardsville, Northwestern University, University of Illinois Champaign, Illinois State University, ROE 39, ROE 30, ROE 20, ROE 21, Macomb CUSD 185, and the West Cook Intermediate Service Center on a strategic partnership for health life safety, behavioral threat assessment, and mental health first aid initiatives.

#### National Domestic Preparedness Consortium (NDPC)

The Illinois School and Campus Safety Program works in collaboration with NDPC members, including the Energetic Materials Research and Testing Center at New Mexico Tech and Louisiana State University's National Center for Biomedical Research and Training (LSU), to bring a variety of courses to Illinois, including classes on Understanding and Planning for School Bombing Incidents, Incident Response to Terrorist Bombings, and Surviving Bombing Incidents for Educators.

# Readiness and Emergency Management for Schools Technical Assistance Center (REMS)

The Illinois School and Campus Safety Program works in collaboration with the REMS TA Center to bring courses to Illinois. The REMs TA Center provides training on developing emergency operations plans, earthquake preparedness, behavioral threat assessment, reunification, and more.

#### Behavioral Threat Assessment

The Illinois School and Campus Safety Program is working in collaboration with the U.S. Department of Homeland Security to deliver training regarding the threat assessment & management processes. Additionally, the program is collaborating with U.S. Department of Homeland Security on targeted violence prevention, and is also working with Evan Schleicher of the U.S. Department of Homeland Security National Threat Evaluation and Reporting (NTER) Office, and Randy McAllister, NTER Certified Master Trainer, on threat assessment training.

The program is working with David Okada, President of the Association of Threat Assessment Professionals, on sessions of Threat Assessment Team Training. The program held a session in March, has 4 sessions scheduled from April-June, and is working on scheduling additional sessions. The program continues to work with Dr. Gene Deisinger, and now Jeffrey Cugno, on Higher Ed Behavioral Threat Assessment classes. The program held four sessions of the Campus Threat Assessment and Management class January-March, has 1 session scheduled so far for April-June, and is working on scheduling additional sessions.

Furthermore, the program continues to schedule sessions of Digital Threat Assessment (DTA) ®, Advanced Digital Threat Assessment (ADTA) ®, Behavioral and Digital Threat Assessment (BDTA<sup>TM</sup>), and Preventing Targeted Violence Through Leakage and Cyber Investigations (PTVTLCI). The program held a session of DTA® in March, and has 3 sessions DTA®, 2 sessions of ADTA®, and 1 session of BDTA<sup>TM</sup> scheduled for April-June. The program held 2 sessions of PTVTLCI in February, has a session scheduled for April, and is working on scheduling additional sessions.

#### Site Safety Security Assessment

The Illinois School and Campus Safety Program is conducting sessions of the Site Safety Security Assessment training. The program is currently working on scheduling a session with NIPSTA.

#### Active Threat Incident Management

The Illinois School and Campus Safety Program continues to collaborate with the IFSI on the Basic, as well as Advanced, Active Shooter Incident Management training.

## **Active Threat Response**

The Illinois School and Campus Safety Program, in coordination with the Center for Homeland Security Leadership, continues to collaborate with the Illinois Tactical Officers Association on the advancement of the Illinois Active Threat Master Instructor Certification program. A session of the course started in March. Additionally, the program is working with IFSI and ITOA on the development of a Joint Rescue Task Force curriculum.

#### **Crisis Communications**

The Illinois School and Campus Safety Program is working with Deputy Chief Chris Covelli on sessions of Effective Communication Principles Before, During, and After Critical Incidents. The Program currently has a session scheduled in Aurora in July, and is working on scheduling additional sessions.

#### Reunification

The Illinois School and Campus Safety Program, in coordination with The "I Love U Guys" Foundation, is conducting Standard Response Protocol (SRP) and Standard Reunification Method (SRM) trainings, as well as Standard Reunification Method – Reunification Exercise (SRM-REx), across the state. The program is currently working on sessions with ROE 30, ROE 11, and Kaskaskia College.

#### Website

The Illinois School and Campus Safety Program continues to promote and update the Illinois School and Campus Safety Resource Center website. The website features a comprehensive resource compendium of school safety topics, has a multimedia platform that features public service video work, features many of our collaborative state and federal partners, and provides information about the school and campus safety program. We are continuing to seek input from both K-12 and higher education institutions and associations to drive the content of the website. Staff is currently working on adding additional resources and topic areas to the website, as well as testing and updating links.

## **Weekly Update Emails**

The Illinois School and Campus Safety Program continues to promote school safety topics and spread awareness through our Weekly Update emails, which go out weekly to 23,000 individuals in the School and Campus Safety directories. The Weekly Update emails feature important school safety topics, share breaking news/resources, promote upcoming classes, and provide links to the Illinois School and Campus Safety Resource Center website. Past Weekly Update emails are added to the Resource Center website to make their content accessible to individuals who do not receive them via email.

## K-12 School Directory and Institution of Higher Education Directory

Staff continue to update the K-12 public and private school directory and the statewide institution of higher education directory. Presently the directory has 23,000 contacts. For January through March, staff worked on updating the K-12 directories for Chicago, West Cook ISC, South Cook ISC, North Cook ISC, and the Cook County Private Schools.

The Executive Institute A.S.S.I.S.T. Program (A Statewide System of In-Service Training) was started at the end of July 2023. This program consists of three major sections: State Law Enforcement Agencies (Course Certification, Instructor Approval, and class recognition), ILETSB K9 Certification and the ILETSB IROCC (Illinois Retired Officer's Concealed Carry) Program, along with several entities that do not fall within these sections directly. The EI - A.S.S.I.S.T. Program also works directly with the rest of the Executive Institute and ILETSB staff with assistance in conferences and training, along with the administration of the IDOT Grant.

Since the inception of the EI – A.S.S.I.S.T. Program, several State Law Enforcement agencies have used our program to get their courses ILETSB certified, along with getting their instructors approved to provide the instruction. This is helping agencies to fulfill mandate requirements per the Illinois Safe-T Act.

Fortunately, the ILETSB Building is available for training use by Executive Institute, which we have been taking full advantage of. We recently co-hosted a course for the Illinois Department of Natural Resources for De-escalation Instructor that was taught by an outside company. It had officers from different areas of the state attending, from Peoria County Sheriff's Office to Belleville Police Department. We are currently working with the Illinois Secretary of State Police on hosting courses for State Law Enforcement Agencies on De-escalation Courses, due to them not having the resources either by manning levels or MTU offerings to obtain the training. This in-turn will help them not only in obtaining mandates, but to be able to instruct at their agency, along with utilizing the VirTra System at our location with providing an instructor to teach the courses. An email was sent out to State Law Enforcement Agencies reference the VirTra System and its availability. It was also sent to a local MTU to be distributed to departments in the area.

We have had meetings with State Law Enforcement Agencies at our location, discussing the use of the VirTra System, along with development of courses that are used with the system that have already been ILETSB certified. Here is a brief of what was sent out to State Law Enforcement Agencies, along with MTU 10 to be dispersed:

"As many of you know, we have been lucky enough to get a VirTra 4K simulator system at our location. It is state of the art, being it's one of only two of this particular system in the state. It offers a true surround system of training with (5) 4K resolution screens, which is located on a stage that puts the trainee(s) in the scenarios. We have submitted several courses that have been ILETSB certified for; Crisis De-escalation, Mental Illness De-escalation, Injured Officer Handgun Manipulation, etc. and keep adding more. These trainings are at different time lengths from (2) hours up to (7) hours, depending on the course. These courses contain everything needed for the training, including power-points that are on the VirTra system. ILETSB has six trained operators of the system with the ability to train others within a department to implement known law enforcement practices and standards as adopted by individual departments policy and procedures, while following their agencies legal recommendations for use of force training. Since we are just operators of the system, we need for each department that is going to be doing the training to provide an ILETSB Approved Instructor for that particular discipline to cover the instruction aspect of the training. We want to provide the best training that we can for your departments, and this is a great way to provide some of the best scenario training available. If you have someone in mind that you want to instruct one of our courses or work with us on a different course, please have them reach out to us. We are limiting the trainees to groups of eight at this time, so that they get as much scenario time as they can."

We are currently working with Jeff Schelling at MTU 2, who has graciously offered his help in providing a training location in his area for the highly requested Modified High-Risk Traffic Stop Course that Executive Institute / EI-A.S.S.I.S.T. had developed with ITOA. This was created for certain State Law Enforcement Agencies, that do not fit in the criteria of other law enforcement agencies pertaining to traffic stops. We are planning two dates in May and then one date during the summer in central Illinois and a third in southern Illinois.

The K9 Certification/Re-certification team, which includes ILETSB Legal Counsel, has been working on ways of updating the program. This is to help ensure accurate information on forms and keep the certification process up to date. This program has scheduling in several locations around the state with dates scheduled throughout the year to assist the Department's K9 handlers and the K9 assessors. For updates on the calendar year 2025 K9 Program statistics up to 02/06/25, see the included report.

The IROCC, which consists of nearly 10,000 applicants yearly, has been working alongside Levi, Ray and Shoup, Inc. in the updating of the website and application process to help with the vetting of applicants and making operations more efficient. For details of the calendar year 2024 totals and for updates on the IROCC Program year 2025 numbers, see the included report.

The IDOT Grant Program has submitted for the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter payments being paid on qualifying courses put on by the MTU's.

As you can see, the Executive Institute A.S.S.I.S.T. Program has achieved a great deal in a short amount of time and continues to strive as a program





## QUARTERLY REPORT MARCH 2025 BOARD MEETING

(Oct 1, 2024 – Dec 31, 2024)

This report provides an update on the administration of the ASSIST Program including: the 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter Report for FY25 and FY24 Governors' Report which is located at <a href="https://www.ptb.illinois.gov/">https://www.ptb.illinois.gov/</a> under MTU Reports. Due to the length of this report, only the online version is being provided for your review. Presented below are some of the ASSIST administrative matters to through Training and Fiscal reports.

**Attachment I** represents the ASSIST program training activity report results through the second quarter of Fiscal Year 2025 to include all thirteen MTU's. This chart provides information from each Mobile Team Unit: number of training course hours, total number of students attending the training programs, man hours and number of courses offered. The Fiscal Year totals for the first & second quarters are listed below: (It should be noted that MTU 3 & Executive Institute data is provided to IT at ILETSB and is not automatically generated or uploaded like all others and can cause delays in reporting). Additional numbers represented include State ASSIST & DOJ/COPS performance.

**Attachment II** provides a financial overview of the total budgets operationally for the MTU's including expected Specialized Training requests along with the MTU's Ten Percent match. To date, the Board has approved release of three payments to the Mobile Team Units including three payments to CPD for their training for two quarters along with a third payment submitted for release at the time of this report.

**Attachment III** provides one graph listings with ALL Certified Training for MTU's and the reported total number of hours as well as a breakdown as to the number of hours within each of the Mandated Training areas. This graph provides the wide range of In-Service Training as well as the attention placed on each mandate as it relates to the demand within each MTU. A total of **41,885** hours of Certified Training is currently available to officers state-wide with Use of Force Courses reporting the highest demand with **6140.75** in De-escalation Techniques, **1,516** hours in High-Risk Traffic Stops, **1,197.5** in Officer Safety Techniques, and **916.75** hours in Stops, Searches, and the 4<sup>th</sup> Amendment. Additionally, a total of **5,767** scenario hours have been provided in High-Risk Traffic Stop Training and De-escalation Technique Training. This quarterly report is filed with roughly four months left in the FY which will end the three-year period of compliance and roll the Training Division into the Verification Process for the next three years.

**Attachment IV** represents the current listing of MTU directors and locations of MTU offices and training sites. (Addition to the map includes the State ASSIST Division located within ILETSB office in Springfield that represents all state agencies for In-House Training Applications, Instructors, and Certification)

**Attachment V** represents the current listing of MTU geographical locations and represented agencies and officers being trained and listed within each MTU area.

**Attachment VI** Graph represents the current number of full & part-time law enforcement officers in Illinois by MTU.

**Attachment VII** represents the current Part-time Police Training Academy dates and graduations as set by each entity.

**Attachment VIII** represents ALL In-Service Courses presented for Approval during the 2nd Quarter of FY25.

#### **Governors' Report for Fiscal Year 2024**

A comprehensive summary of Mobile Team Unit training activity and funding for Fiscal Year 2024 has been created and disseminated to both the Governors' Office and the State Legislature as required by law. This annual report is required to be submitted to the Governor and to the General Assembly prior to February 1, 2025 (annually by the 1st of February). FY24 report is located at <a href="https://www.ptb.illinois.gov/">https://www.ptb.illinois.gov/</a> under MTU Reports. The information contained with this this report is collected throughout the FY while other information is submitted over 120 days following the conclusion of the FY.

#### **Application for Fiscal Year 2025**

The Board will announce Mobile Team Unit funding application procedures February 2025 for the next fiscal year. Board staff will be in the process of updating and compiling the Fiscal Year 2025 application materials and letter of announcement. Those packets of information and instructions will be sent and made available to all interested parties prior to March 1st, 2025. MTU's will be afforded the opportunity to submit the budget application electronically. Conditions of Award for Fiscal Year 2026 will be reviewed and amended as necessary based upon an MTU's needs and funding availability. MTU Coordinators and Manager of In-Service Training along with other vital Training Division employees, will schedule budget request and review meetings prior to announcement of awards in May 2025 to present to the Board at the June 2025 meeting.

#### **Closure**

The Board has been extremely pleased with the MTU's and their coordinator's response to the ever changing and challenging duties brought about by the SAFE-T Act. Our Coordinators, their staff and local MTU Boards have adapted to the demands of training needs in our efforts to drive compliance numbers near 100%. Part of the greatest challenge MTU's have had is the aspects of delivering the standards, interpretations, and promise to officers throughout the state that we can and will provide the opportunity to ensure the resources to be in compliance by July 2025 for all certified law enforcement officers. ILETSB has certified over **4,913** plus courses to which MTU's have conducted over **3,458** classes throughout the state in all aspects of training during the Second Quarter of FY25.

The ILETSB Training Division continues to build upon the ASSIST Program and is partnering with Professional Standards Division and the IT staff to ensure that all data and history can be available for transparency, historical perspective, and growth in the profession regarding training. It is vital to recognize over the course of the last three years since the SAFE-T Act that each division within the ILETSB office has played a vital roll in assisting the ASSIST Program along with the MTU Directors and their leadership.

This report is a summary of the most significant staff activity related to the administration of the ASSIST Program during the second quarter of Fiscal Year 2025. This report reflects the dedication, commitment, and partnerships involving the MTU's, the Executive Institute, Certification, IT, and the Fiscal Divisions within the ILETSB office.

# CRISIS INTERVENTION TEAM TRAINING (CIT) QUARTERLY REPORT MARCH 6, 2025 BOARD MEETING

This report provides an update on the administration of the Board's Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) training programs as well as various related mental health and de-escalation trainings.

## **CIT Training Courses/Series:**

As has been the case with past fiscal years, the CIT training series remains at the forefront of course requests from around the state. Staff has approved more than 290 CIT, mental health, suicide prevention, officer wellness, autism, de-escalation and related courses for this fiscal year through our Mobile Teams and Chicago P.D. I thank the Board and our MTU partners for their continued support of these important programs. Particular items to note: Board staff is continuing to work with the Chicago Police Department's CIT training unit to ensure their curriculum is up to date (and in line with the modifications approved by this Board) as well as ensuring their instructors and content experts have all the necessary documentation filed and approved by our office. One other concept that I mentioned previously was adding additional actors to our state CIT team. I'm happy to report that our team held a casting call with the cooperation of Second City Chicago (improv theatre group) and will soon be onboarding additional actors for use in our scenario training portions of classes. As the demand for CIT and related trainings remains ever increasing (i.e. assisting with ICAT trainings), adding additional actors is not only timely but most welcome by the CIT training program. These additional actors will assist in providing enhanced skills for all attendees.

I'd be remiss if I didn't also mention the commendable work of Chatham Police Sergeant, Travis Schaal. Sergeant Schaal was recently recognized for his life-saving intervention of a local resident who was in crisis. Sergeant Schaal credited the CIT training he had received for his enhanced communication skills and techniques allowing him to better engage with empathy and understanding. We are thankful for Sergeant Schaal and applaud him for his actions. It's stories like this that emphasize the value and essence of CIT training. (Chairman Smoot's Press Release is attached to my report)

## CIT K-9 Therapy Dog Initiative:

Since last reported at the December Board meeting, Trooper continues to make appearances statewide. He's helped greet test takers and training attendees at our Springfield office, attended various CIT trainings, participated in community events or local outings, attended the Senate State Government Committee and was most recently invited to attend Glenwood High School's teen mental health awareness event where he helped welcome those in attendance. Trooper's gentle soul continues to win hearts over!

I'm happy to report that our partnership with Operation TT, the Tails of Redemption Program and the Cook County Sheriff's Office K-9 team are progressing nicely and we are on track to expand the CIT K-9 Therapy Dog program around the state. With that, I am happy to announce the next step to the program; Certification of K-9 Therapy Dogs. Going before the Board's Curriculum Committee is a Certification K-9 Therapy Dog Program outline for review and approval (copy attached to this report). This volunteer certification program was developed by the Cook County Sheriff's Office and is pending AKC approval. This certification is comparable to that of Brevard County Florida, where Trooper and I received our Multi Discipline Therapy K-9 Team Certification. The purpose of the certification is to evaluate prospective teams for suitability and demonstrate that the K-9 and handler have a rapport and ability to work together effectively. Having this certification is an important step in ensuring K-9 therapy dog teams used throughout the state for CIT trainings, officer wellness, community events, etc., all have the proper temperament and behavioral characteristics needed to be successful. Along those same lines, I'd like to share that SB 1491 – Intervention Team-Therapy Dogs, is an initiative of ILETSB which codifies that ILETSB would develop a course and certification program for certified therapy dog teams. As of this writing, the bill passed out of Senate State Government Committee and is currently on second reading. We thank Senator Mary Edly-Allen for assisting us with this important initiative and look forward to sharing more with the Board as the bill progresses.

Another very exciting update is that Trooper, the Cook County Tail's of Redemption Program, Operation TT and the Board approved statewide K-9 Therapy Dog Initiative will be a feature story on an upcoming segment of the Department of Justice's "What's New in Blue". Although details are still being finalized, production is tentatively scheduled for mid-April. I'll keep the Board apprised as information becomes available.

And, finally, along those same lines, I just wanted to share how truly innovative this K-9 therapy dog initiative is setting out to be. I follow/participate in the International Association of Chief's of Police - Officer Wellness and Mental Health member forum. A recent question posed was asking if anyone knew of larger scale therapy dog programs. From the various state's responses, it was apparent no large-scale program, especially through a POST is in place. I took the opportunity to add what ILETSB had in store and WOW, was the response favorable! I had people reach out to let me know how impressive this initiative was, that states were interested in following our progress and in fact, I received a call from an individual in Delaware, who said he received my information from an officer in Ohio (who saw my IACP post). So, word is getting out there – we're onto something good!

## **CIT Statewide Conference:**

Save the Date.....the 2025 CIT State Conference will be held on June 25 and 26, 2025 at the Embassy Suites in East Peoria. As we know that CIT is more than training, our theme this year is Building Bridges: Strengthening Collaborations in Crisis Intervention. to discuss moral injury, Darren Ivy to highlight hope and resilience and Johnny Crowder on using the power of mental health to transform your relationships, your work and your life! Our break-out sessions will focus on prioritizing mental wellness, integrated crisis response teams, cultivating collaborations, peer support programs, K-9 therapy dogs and more! ICAT – Board staff has been working with the ICAT team in Decatur as they were in need of professional actors for their ICAT training program and inquired if we could assist. I'm happy to report that we will be working/partnering with ICAT and the local MTU to assist them with their training needs.

## CESSA:

Just a quick update to let you know that the CESSA statewide group continues to meet as well as the subcommittees. Progress is being made for implementation around the state; however, because of the enormous task at hand, a new legislative extension (via bill) has been submitted was approved to extend the deadline until July 2027. I will keep the Board apprised of substantive updates.

Along the same lines, the CESSA Training Subcommittee has approached the Board for assistance in creating an 8 hour in-person de-escalation course (including scenarios) for all PSAP's (public safety answering point). Although discussions have just recently begun, we hope to have a live training ready for implementation by July 2025.

## **Healing Centered Illinois Task Force:**

Pursuant to PA 93-103, the Chairman of ILETSB (or their designee) was included on the State's new initiative to make Illinois a Healing Centered state. As such, I have been asked to serve as the ILETSB designee on the Healing Centered Task Force. The HCTF was created to advance the State's efforts to become trauma-informed and healing-centered through improved alignment of existing efforts, common definitions and metrics and strategic planning for long-term transformation. I'm happy to report that the various subcommittees have met numerous times throughout the past few months and have come up with preliminary recommendations that was submitted to the General Assembly prior to the December 2024 deadline. Although the recommendations are just a begging, they are important steps to further guide us to a more

healing state. I'm proud to have been a part of this initiative and look forward to continuing with these efforts.

## Girls - We Lead Initiative:

I'm happy to report that Deputy Director Williams and I have been selected to participate as mentors in the Lieutenant Governor's Office: Girls – We Lead Initiative. Cheryllynn and I will host a high school student interested in leadership roles women hold in state government and the impact they have on Illinois. Participants will shadow their mentors for three days to learn about the policy issues that their respective office is working on and be as immersed as possible so that they can complete their required research paper. We are looking forward to meeting and assisting our mentee in the very near future. We will keep the Board apprised of this initiative.

## CIT and Mental Health Awareness Training and Resource Institute:

As the Board has been offering the basic CIT training since 2003 and various off-shoots of mental health training including the CIT series, Mental Health Awareness and Response – and Intro to CIT, peer support pilot programs, officer wellness, etc. we are looking to the future to the possibility of creating a CIT and Mental Health Awareness Training & Resource Institute – perhaps in conjunction with the 988/CESSA roll out. It is really just a larger defined umbrella to the works we are already doing including but not limited to:

- CIT training series for in-service
- Intro to CIT training in academies (CIT Concepts)
- CIT resources
- MHA and Response Training and Resources
- Peer support training and resources (model policies and best practices)
- Support pilot programs on peer support
- Officer wellness training and resources
- Resources for families of law enforcement officers
- Co-responder model policy and best practices
- Therapy/Comfort dog assistance Tails of Redemption (TOR) through the Cook County Sheriff's Office and Operation TT through the PBPA
- Add on training for social workers, paramedics, fire and additional courses for dispatch (as allowed)
- De-escalation training by CIT Instructors
- Provide opportunities for ICAT training
- Summits/conferences (may also assist with training mandates)
- Increase awareness of resources via first responder app
- Become a repository for best practices statewide
- Create a reporting mechanism (to assist with getting federal funds)
- Ongoing research and curriculum updates/development

Although we have not yet begun on this initiative, as soon as the Board retains additional staff to help support such an extensive resource platform, we will move forward with this concept.

# ILETSB Chairman Smoot's Statement on Impact of Crisis Intervention Team Training

Chatham police sergeant's compassionate actions prevent tragedy, saving a life

**SPRINGFIELD, IL** — Today, Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board (ILETSB) Chairman Sean Smoot issued the following statement on the life-saving impact of Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) training in law enforcement, as demonstrated recently by Sergeant Travis Schaal of the Chatham Police Department:

"Late one night while on patrol, Sergeant Schaal noticed a vehicle parked on train tracks in the 200 block of North State Street. Hours later, the vehicle remained in the same location, prompting his concern. Trusting his instincts, he approached the car and found an 18-year-old woman who initially claimed she was fine. However, relying on the skills and techniques he gained through CIT training, Sergeant Schaal engaged the young woman in conversation and created an atmosphere of trust.

"During their discussion, she revealed her true intentions: she had been struggling at home and in school and was planning to take her own life by waiting for an oncoming train. Through empathy, understanding, and professionalism, Sergeant Schaal convinced the woman to leave the tracks and come to the police department, where she could receive further assistance. She was later transported to a local hospital for mental health treatment.

"Approximately a week later. Segreant Schaal received a handwritten thank-you note from the woman. In the note, she thanked him for 'treating her like a human being' and credited him with saving her life. She noted that she had always been wary of first responders but that his kindness and compassion had changed her perspective.

"The actions of Sergeant Schaal exemplify the value and necessity of CIT Training. This program equips officers with the tools and understanding to deescalate mental health crises with care and empathy. Stories like these are a testament to the transformative nature of this training."

ILETSB remains committed to expanding CIT training statewide to ensure that law enforcement professionals have the resources and knowledge they need to handle complex situations with professionalism and compassion.

We are pleased to provide this letter of support for the Cook County Sheriff's Office *Tails of Redemption* Law Enforcement Therapy K9 Certification. The purpose of *Tails of Redemption* is to evaluate prospective teams of dogs and handlers for therapy dog work.

A comprehensive review of *Tails of Redemption* indicates that this is a high-quality program utilizing best practices in animal assisted therapy. Specifically,

- Dogs are screened for good manners and a lack of aggression, characteristics that are critical for dogs working with the public.
- Positive procedures (i.e., no harsh corrections) are used for training and handling the dogs.
- Training and assessment in practical real-world settings such as shopping centers, schools, stores, and other community settings is provided. This ensures that dogs behave appropriately and are safe in public settings.
- Dogs must demonstrate basic skills that show they are under instructional control. Some of these behaviors include sit, stay, down, recall, tolerating physical exams and supervised separation.

In addition to the basic skills required of K9s working in the community, dogs are trained and tested on Police K9 specific behaviors such as:

- Tolerating movement (e.g., vehicles) and loud noises.
- Allow petting by unfamiliar people and walking through a crowd.
- Remain under control in the presence of another dog.

Further, when a handler is interviewing a member of the public, dogs are trained/tested to be comfortable in this situation with no signs of aggression, nervousness, or shyness. In keeping with best practices, because canine behavior can change over time, dogs are recertified every two years.

The CCSO ensures that the program meets recognized standards by interacting with other agencies that have similar certification programs (e.g., Brevard County, FL), and with organizations (such as the American Kennel Club) that have nationally recognized therapy dog programs.

As a result of the quality of this outstanding program, K9 Therapy teams certified through the Cook County Sheriff's Office *Tails of Redemption* K9 program are recognized by the American Kennel Club as eligible to apply for AKC Therapy Dog titles.

The purpose of the Cook County Sheriff's Office "Law Enforcement Therapy K9 Team" certification is to evaluate prospective teams of dogs and handlers for suitability in this discipline as well as to demonstrate that the K9 and handler have a rapport and are able to work together effectively. The dog must be sociable and well-behaved. The handler must be able to recognize changes in his/her dog's behavior, advocating for the K9 as it is the handler's responsibility to ensure they are ready to adapt to dynamic environments.

Any dogs previously trained in personal protection, patrol/apprehension etc. or those exhibiting aggressive behaviors will not be permitted for use as a therapy K9s. There will be no cruel or abusive corrections displayed at any time and will result in immediate dismissal.

This evaluation consists of several sections. This includes applying techniques discussed during in-class training and prior to testing. Much of the training and evaluation will be conducted during public exposure exercises (such as a shopping center, retail store, school, parking lot, etc.). We are not looking for perfection, but rather at the team's ability to navigate new and challenging scenarios. We need to see that the handler is aware of his or her surroundings and that the dog can be confidently handled appropriately. The handler must be willing to commit to regular training to achieve a higher degree of efficiency. Regular training, play and practice will help create a stronger bond and confidence, this will be reflected when they are in the public and "on display". The team must not only reflect the mission and values of their own agency but also of the entire law enforcement Therapy K9 community. The team should always take steps to project professionalism and foster stronger relationships with all those we serve.

An advanced copy of the certification requirements will be made available to the handler/dog team prior to testing. Each phase of testing will be explained to the handler prior to that certification exercises. The handler may ask for clarification of any certification exercises.

## **Obedience/ Control Evaluation:**

The following exercises may be completed in any sequence specified by the evaluator. There are obedience and sociability activities, which are sometimes mixed during public exposure. The evaluator may choose to combine exercises during public exposure. Obedience and friendliness, for example, can be observed and rated while out engaging with the public. Each team will be allowed to repeat

any exercise (3) times, a maximum of 2 separate exercises before being excused from certification. If excused the team will not be eligible for a retest for 30 days. The evaluator will have the discretion to excuse any team if it is determined the team is not prepared and requires additional training.

- 1. This assessment illustrates the dog's training and the handler's control, executed on a loose lead. The handler is required to demonstrate the dog's responsiveness to handler's actions for a left turn after heeling the dog ten feet from the start position. The team will continue in a heel for 10 feet and then perform an about face and return in the same direction. The evaluator will ask the team to stop, at which point the team must stop and the K9 is required to sit. The evaluator will prompt the handler to finish. At this point the handler will heel the K9 back to the starting point, following the original path, returning to the start position and again performing a sit. The team will then be asked to repeat this exercise but instead, perform a right turn and heel for 10 feet, then an about face retracing their original path. The evaluator will again prompt the handler to stop. The team will stop and the K9 must sit and wait for the evaluator to prompt the team to "Finish". The team will then follow back the same path to the starting point and again perform a sit. Engaging with the dog and offering praise during the exercise is allowed and encouraged from the handler. See illustration.
- 2. **Sit Stay**. Upon the evaluator's instruction, the handler will position the dog in a sit at the designated start line, command it to "stay," and then proceed to move 20 feet away then turn and face the dog. The dog must stay in position until the evaluator directs the handler to return to the dog after three seconds. The handler should be able to return to the dog and pick up the leash without the dog breaking the "sit"/ "stay" command. Minor adjustments in position during the exercise are allowed, but the dog must stay stationary and not break. See illustration.
- 3. **Down Stay and Recall**. Upon the evaluator's instruction, the handler will position the dog in a down, and command it to "stay." The handler will proceed to move ten feet away then turn and face the dog. Once directed by the evaluator, the handler will call the dog to return to him/her. This indicates that the dog will respond to the handler's recall when prompted. The handler may provide encouragement to persuade the dog to come. See illustration.
- 4. **Physical examination**. The objective of the physical examination conducted by the evaluator is to assess the dog's tolerance to having an unfamiliar individual handle their body. The evaluator must examine the dog's teeth, inspect the ears, and gently pull the tail. The evaluator must also lift the front feet to assess for sensitivity and appropriate reaction. The evaluator must assess whether the dog is receiving adequate basic care, is clean, in excellent health, and alert. This examination can be conducted with the dog

- either seated or standing. The handler may communicate with the dog, offering praise for appropriate conduct.
- 5. **Supervised separation**. This assessment illustrates that if required the dog may be entrusted to a reliable individual and will uphold its training and proper behavior. The evaluator might state, "May I supervise your dog?" and thereafter take the leash. The handler will be out of view for three minutes. The dog is not required to remain in position but must refrain from incessant barking, whining, or unnecessary pacing, and should not exhibit anything beyond mild restlessness or uneasiness. Evaluators may converse with the dog, but must refrain from excessive dialogue, caressing, or efforts at management.

## **K9** Behavior Evaluation:

The following exercises assess the dog's temperament, sociability, and reaction to people, dogs, and/or distractions. If available, and to the evaluator's discretion, these exercises will be conducted in any variety of venues (a daycare, high school, hospital, or police department etc.) The dog is allowed to show a willingness to engage but cannot panic or attempt to flee at any point.

- 1. While walking in, did the dog react to any vehicles in movement?
- 2. Did the dog react to any loud noises from the public?
- 3. When interacting with strangers...
  - a. Was the dog receptive to the stranger's approach?
  - b. Did the dog sit or stand in a courteous manner to allow for petting?
  - c. When walking through a crowd (three or more people) did the dog engage with handler without showing signs of overstimulation or hesitation? The dog is permitted to show curiosity of surroundings but cannot jump or pull.
- 4. Did the handler acknowledge the dog's positive behavior and/or offer gentle correction/redirection when necessary?
- 5. Did the dog remain under the handler's control when in the presence of another dog?
- 6. Without moving forward to meet or becoming overstimulated, did the dog stay in place when the handler stops to engage in a casual conversation or shake hands with another handler and their friendly dog?

## **Interview Response:**

The interview exercise may be staged or organic. The purpose of the interview is to observe the handler's approach to the public and the incorporation of their K9 partner. The handler is to engage simultaneously with both their dog and the

person being interviewed. The handler is required to elicit a conversation with the person being interviewed and be aware of their dog's behavior, making corrections if necessary.

- 1. Was the dog comfortable and show interest/curiosity to the person being interviewed without becoming overwhelming?
- 2. Was the handler successful in calming and resetting the dog if necessary?
- 3. Was the dog friendly and silent for the entirety of the interview?
- 4. Did the dog ignore distractions? The dog may show curiosity but may not jump or pull away from the handler.
- 5. Did the dog show any signs of nervousness or shyness?

## **Recertification:**

The certification for "Law Enforcement Therapy K-9 Team" is a two-year certification. These requirements for maintaining the certification are as follows:

- 1. The initial certification is conducted in-person by approved evaluators from Cook County Sheriff's Office Tails of Redemption (CCSO TOR) Unit.
- 2. At the end of the first year, determined by the anniversary date of initial certification, the team must submit a signed letter with approval from the organizational supervisor to the CCSO TOR Unit verifying that, within the last year, the team has maintained a minimum of 8 hours of training per month and a minimum of 4 deployments per month. This includes all continuing education the team has undergone.
- 3. At the end of the second year, based on the anniversary date, an in-person certification conducted by CCSO TOR Unit approved evaluators is required.

The Cook County Sheriff's Office "Law Enforcement Therapy K9" certification is recognized by the American Kennel Club (AKC) and K9 teams receiving their certification by the CCSO are eligible for AKC Therapy K9 Titles.

## SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER (SRO) PROGRAM QUARTERLY REPORT

March 6, 2025

In the wake of multiple school tragedies, the Illinois General Assembly addressed the use of police personnel within the school setting by passing PA 100-984 in Spring of 2018. Beginning January 1, 2021 any officer serving in the role of School Resource Officer (SRO) must obtain a certificate by the Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board ('Board"). These SRO certificates are good for two (2) years before an officer/agency must reapply. Officers serving as SRO's must either complete specialized training developed through ILETSB and other stakeholders or attain a waiver by the Board. To date since January 2021, the Board has provided a total of approximately 985 certificates to SROs throughout the state. Within the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter the Board office processed approximately 30 new requests for certification and 50 requests for recertification.

As a reminder, Initial SRO Certification and SRO Recertification forms are available on the Board's website. Information on courses as related to SRO certification/waivers and SRO recertification are also listed on the Board's website.

This concludes my report on the progress of the School Resource Officer (SRO) training program. I would be happy to answer any questions the Board may have.

**SUBJECT:** Recommendation for Crash Reconstruction Specialist Certification

## **State Certified Crash Reconstruction Specialist Program**

In September of 1986 the Illinois Law Enforcement Training & Standards Board adopted a formal Crash Reconstruction program, in order to validate the professional expertise of individuals engaging in crash reconstruction in Illinois

This program requires that an applicant complete specific training programs from vendors that are certified by the Board. Upon completion of these courses an application is submitted to Board staff for review. If the application is approved, the applicant is required to take and pass all three parts of a state exam with a score of 70% or better. Finally, upon recommendation of the Manager of Specialized Programs the individuals will be approved for certification by the Board.

The following individuals have successfully completed all portions of the certification exam within the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of FY25 and Board staff recommends they be approved, and Board certified as Crash Reconstruction Specialist.

## Information Services Board Report 1st Quarter – March 2025

## **On-Line Testing:**

Digital On-Line Testing Services for State-Wide Law Enforcement entities and individuals continues with successful results and acceptance – Testing continues in both the Springfield and Chicago Offices, with plans to begin testing in March at affiliated Training and Testing facilities - Additional sites will be implemented based on location within the State, space accommodations, network capabilities and security requirements – Final expansion of On-Line Testing is anticipated to complete by year's-end 2025

#### **Data Services:**

Efforts are underway to build-out ILETSB's current Data-Storage — This Project will provide the necessary space for Evidentiary Submissions, Legal Hearing Recordings and Document Digitalization. Anticipated to complete this Summer, the expansion will Quintuple ILETSB's Digital Capacity - Additional Servers will continue to be established to suit the changing operational needs of ILETSB Network Services — The process of creating new Public-Facing Servers Web and Database Services continues with focus being on individualized services - Directory Services restructuring is on-going to streamline data collaboration and logistical availability — Data Mapping is regularly reviewed to provide the most efficient back-up and restore capabilities in the event of catastrophic failure — With the implementation of the Data Expansion, future efforts will allow Back-Up Services to ideally provide real-time synchronization and assurance of ILETSB Databanks

#### **Network & Security Services:**

To enhance the security of Staff Remote Services, efforts are underway to replace the Board's Firewall and upgrade VPN Client Services – Progress continues in implementing Microsoft's Enterprise Configuration Management (ECM) Services and Cisco's Identity Services Engine (ISE) Management Software – Both ECM and ISE have improved technical services, structure and reliability, while providing insight into the network, digital traffic and potential vulnerabilities – MCM will be designed to create hardware inventory reports and software distribution to Staff Systems and ILETSB Servers – Efforts are currently underway to upgrade all Staff Systems to Windows 11 by Fall 2025 – Penetration Scanning for potential vulnerabilities of public-facing network and web services continues on a weekly basis

## **Disaster Recovery/Contingency Planning:**

Information Services is conducting a review of its current Disaster Recovery Plan (DRP) - In the event of Catastrophic Failure or Cyber-Compromised Events, future protocols will include the synchronous data integration of the Springfield and Chicago Offices for redundancy and Off-Site Storage of data preservation and restoration — Updated redundant Power Supply Services have been completed at the Springfield Facility and are slated to be implemented in the Chicago Office to offer a more reliable provision of power to essential Network and Data Services in the event of a power-loss

### **ILETSB In-House Applications:**

Steering Committee meetings are conducted on a weekly basis with pertinent ILETSB Division Personnel for opportunity to provide input of functionality improvements, necessary modifications and reporting provisions of the applications - Next Wave Modifications have been identified, prioritized and are currently in the process of development

### **Legal Hearing System Portal:**

This System will be utilized for tracking and storing the documentation of hearings pertaining to Officer reactivation and decertification – Development and implementation of the new Application for ILETSB's Legal Division is nearing fulfillment – Anticipated completion of the Portal is slated for late March

#### LETM:

Law Enforcement Training Management (LETM) development has begun with the on-boarding of an additional On-Staff Developer – The application is undergoing a full review, and necessary modifications and improvements are being identified – With the inclusion of Departmental input, a full re-write of the application will be conducted to incorporate additional beneficial features and service provisions

## PTB/LEDI:

PTB is utilized internally to provide records management to ILETSB Staff in the areas of basic training, specialized certification, Professional Conduct records, and data reports for officers and agencies - LEDI serves as an agency records submission portal, while assisting agencies in reviewing and maintaining compliance with requirements to ILETSB. Development of the PTB-LEDI Applications has been temporarily paused to allow focus on other Development Projects

## **Officer Portal:**

Enables Officers to review their own Law Enforcement Records and Requirements – With the integration of the Professional Conduct Database individuals are afforded the opportunity to review and respond to Professional Conduct Reports Electronically – Developmental review of the Portal is on-going in conjunction with the PTB-LEDI application

#### **Evidentiary Video Submissions Repository:**

Future plans to establish a secure, readily accessible and expandable digital environment apart from Board Data to accommodate the ever-growing number of Digital Video Submissions provided by Municipal, County and State Entities for storage, availability and preservation – Potential solutions identified

#### **Document-Archiving:**

Digital scanning and storage of ILETSB "Hard-Copy" Files for data preservation and archival retrieval purposes – In-process of planning and consideration of potential solutions and vendors – Full review of process for implementation to be established
