I. CALL TO ORDER

The September 10, 2025 Joint Finance & Legislative and Executive Committee meeting was called to order at 3:00 p.m. by Richard Watson.

III. FINANCIAL MATTERS

A. Financial Items ~ Courtney Bott

Bott stated the FY26 Expenditures through August 21, 2025 could be found in the first table under Tab E. As of August 21st, the Board has spent about \$4M of the FY26 budget. The Cash Flow Analysis of Funds and a recap of FY25 was presented. The Board spent roughly \$48.8M of its budget for FY25.

Bott reported the grant fiscal year ended June 30, 2025. Recruitment & Retention Grant: staff awarded roughly \$6.7M to 59 agencies. NIBIN Grant: staff awarded almost \$1.8M to 20 agencies. Camera Grant: staff awarded roughly \$3.2M to 125 agencies. NIBIN and Recruitment & Retention were not allocated any funds for FY26. Bott did note the unused money for FY25 camera grants was rolled into FY26 funds, and staff will continue to work with 33 the agencies to award an additional \$2M. Bott also noted staff has been working with IT to update the grant section of the website. Staff is working with GATU and Amplifund to offer live trainings to grantees for FY26 to bridge the knowledge gap.

Motion was made by Voulgaris, seconded by Michael Jackson (sitting for Idleburg), and carried by all members present to recommend the fiscal report to the Full Board for approval.

FY26 In-Service Spending Approval: Bott stated on June 16, 2025 the Budget bill was signed into law, and the Board was awarded roughly \$20M in appropriations to spend on In-Service training. The breakdown is as follows; Bott is asking for the FY26 In-Service spending to be recommended for approval by the Board.

Motion was made by Michael Jackson (sitting for Idleburg), seconded by Voulgaris, and carried by all members present to recommend the FY26 In-Service Spending to the Full Board for approval.

B. Personnel Matters & DEIA Report ~ Ellen Petty

Petty noted her report can be found under Tab F in the Board book. Petty stated that six individuals have been hired since the June Board meeting, and there are eight hiring sequences currently in process. She expects to have ten additional employees onboarded by the December meeting. Petty described the Small Agency Response Team and how our agency is utilizing that service offered by CMS.

C. Legislative and Litigation Update ~ John Keigher

Keigher's legislative update is as follows. The bills listed below have now been signed into law:

- SB 1491 is now Public Act 104-106: This act allows the Board to offer special certification to CIT officers and co-responders who utilize therapy canines in their work. It ensures the canines and handlers will meet minimum standards, and they may be called out for mutual aid in times of crisis. Staff is working with experts to develop these standards and drafting them as administrative rules.
- SB 1195 is now Public Act 104-84: This ensures that "trauma informed" practices are introduced at the basic academy and included in the in-service mandates. It also requires the sexual assault investigators course to include provisions regarding identifying conflicts of interest and options to address them. The Executive Institute is already working on curriculum revisions to address these requirements.
- SB 1953 is now Public Act 104-158: This revises the background checks required for new hires. It requires candidates to release all prior employment records and

requires past employers to attest to a candidate's fitness for duty. It creates specific law enforcement exceptions to the Personal Record Review Act and creates a liability exemption for agencies disclosing information in good faith. This bill did not create any new mandates for the Board; however, staff is adjusting the appointment forms to ensure that these steps are followed.

- SB 2323 is now Public Act 104-159: This is a human trafficking bill that adds definitions for trauma and trauma informed responses to the Police Training Act. It requires the Board to update existing sexual assault and human trafficking courses to include trauma informed screening procedures developed with independent service providers. It also requires each agency to develop policies on human trafficking investigation procedures. The Illinois State Police has already provided some guidance on these new requirements, and the Executive Institute is exploring curriculum revisions to accommodate these changes.

Keigher then briefly mentioned the five litigation cases. The employment contract case is in the discovery phase. The wrongful termination case is waiting on a revised demand. In the FOIA case, cross motions for summary judgment are pending. The IROCC case has had no activity for over a year, so staff is seeking an official dismissal, and in the Human Rights case all complaints have been dismissed based upon the original complaint, and staff is awaiting possible appeals.

IV. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

SAFE-T Act Update ~ John Keigher

Keigher reported the Certification Review Panel recently held a meeting. They are taking steps to start assigning cases for hearings. Staff has also been working with the Illinois Justice Project which is heading an implementation task force established by the legislature. Staff has participated in their subcommittee meetings on body cameras, the decertification process, Use of Force trainings and the mandatory verification process.

A. Curriculum and School Standards Advisory Committee ~ Mitchell Davis

Davis stated the Committee met yesterday and approved the In-Service, Advanced and Specialized courses submitted through the Mobile Team Units and the Executive Institute, and the Lead Homicide Investigators 32-Hour Continuing Education courses all submitted from May 15, 2025 through August 20, 2025.

Motion was made by Watson, seconded by Redd, and carried by all members present to approve the Curriculum and School Standards Advisory Committee report.

B. Joint Finance & Legislative and Executive Committee ~ Richard Watson

Watson stated the Committee met yesterday and did not have a quorum. However, they did hear the reports, and all were recommended to be moved on to the Full Board.

Motion was made by Redd, seconded by Davis, and carried by all members present to approve the Joint Finance & Legislative and Executive Committee report.

C. Waiver Review Committee ~ Brendan Kelly

This meeting was postponed until December.

X. EXECUTIVE MATTERS

A. Financial Items ~ Courtney Bott

Bott stated her report is under Tab E, and she is looking for approval of the FY26 Expenditures through August 21, 2025. As of August 21st, the Board has spent

about \$4M of the FY26 budget. The FY25 Recap shows the Board spent roughly \$48.8M of its budget for FY25 through August 21, 2025.

Bott moved to grants and reported for the Recruitment & Retention grant, staff awarded roughly \$6.7M to 59 agencies, with actual requests of over \$45M. All funds in appropriations for this grant were exhausted. For the NIBIN grants, staff awarded almost \$1.8M to 20 agencies, with actual requests over \$2.8M. All funds in appropriations for this grant were exhausted. Recruitment & Retention and NIBIN grants were not allocated any funds for FY26. For the Camera grant, staff awarded roughly \$3.2M to 125 agencies, with 215 agencies applying. Bott noted there were application issues with those agencies not awarded funds. Bott did note the unused money for FY25 camera grants was rolled into FY26 funds and commented that staff will continue to work with 33 agencies to award an additional \$2M. Bott stated staff has been working with IT to update the grant section of the website. Staff is also working with GATU and Amplifund to offer live trainings to grantees for FY26 to bridge the knowledge gap. Davis recommended staff utilize the Illinois Chiefs Association to help facilitate this training.

Motion was made by Watson, seconded by Redd, and carried by all members present to approve the FY26 Fiscal report.

Bott stated the Board was awarded roughly \$20M in appropriations for In-Service Training, she is asking for approval for FY26 In-Service spending, listed below, to be approved by the Board.

Petty stated as of today the Board headcount is 53, and she expects to have ten additional employees onboarded by the December meeting. Petty stated there are currently eight hiring sequences in process at this time, and she expects to meet full headcount by early next spring. Petty described the Small Agency Resource Team and how our agency is utilizing that service offered by CMS. She noted

staff has onboarded six new people since the June meeting. Petty then discussed the new CMS initiative for employee engagement, and what her staff is beginning to do to implement this initiative.

C. Legislative and Litigation Update ~ John Keigher

Keigher noted there are four bills that staff is currently watching that have been signed into law and will go into effect the beginning of 2026:

- SB 1491 is now Public Act 104-106: This is the Board's bill which allows the Board to offer special certification to CIT officers and co-responders who utilize therapy canines in their work. It ensures the canines and handlers will meet minimum standards, and they may be called out for mutual aid in times of crisis. Staff is working with experts to develop these standards and drafting them as administrative rules.
- SB 1195 is now Public Act 104-84: This ensures that "trauma informed" practices are introduced at the basic academy and included in the in-service mandates. It also requires the sexual assault investigators course to include provisions regarding identifying conflicts of interest and options to address them. The Executive Institute is already working on curriculum revisions to address these requirements.
- SB 1953 is now Public Act 104-158: This revises the background checks required for new hires. It requires candidates to release all prior employment and disciplinary records and requires past employers to attest to a candidate's fitness for duty. It creates specific law enforcement exceptions to the Personal Record Review Act and creates a liability exemption for agencies disclosing information in good faith. This bill did not create any new mandates for the Board; however, staff is adjusting the appointment forms to ensure that these steps are followed.
- SB 2323 is now Public Act 104-159: This bill adds definitions for trauma and trauma informed responses to the Police Training Act. It requires the Board to update existing sexual assault and human trafficking courses to include trauma informed screening procedures developed with independent service providers. It also requires each agency to develop policies on human trafficking investigation procedures. The Illinois State Police has already provided some guidance on these new requirements, and the Executive Institute is exploring curriculum revisions to accommodate these changes.

Keigher noted there are currently five litigation cases. The employment contract case is in the discovery phase. The wrongful termination case is waiting on a revised demand. In the FOIA case, cross motions for summary judgment are pending. The IROCC case has had no activity for over a year, so staff is seeking an official dismissal, and in the Human Rights case all complaints have been determined in the Board's favor, and staff is awaiting appeals.

D. Division of Professional Standards

1. Professional Conduct Database Quarterly Report ~ *Anthony Cobb*

Cobb reported since the June Board meeting the agency has received 99 Notices of Violations for a total of 227 notices received as of September 5, 2025. During the same period in 2024 the Board received 163 notices.

Motion was made by Watson, seconded by Davis, and carried by all members present to approve the Professional Conduct Database Quarterly Report.

2. Waiver Disposition Quarterly Report ~ Anthony Cobb

Cobb noted the Waiver Reports could be found under Tab G in the Board book. He stated the reporting period for all reports is May 1, 2025 – July 31, 2025, and that his division processed 513 waiver requests during this period. The breakdown of the processed waivers is as follows:

- a. *Law Enforcement – Municipal*
318 waivers approved, 9 denied

Motion was made by Watson, seconded by Redd, with Tyler, Gomez, and Schassburger abstaining, and carried by all other members present to approve the Municipal Law Enforcement Waiver Disposition Report.

- b. *Law Enforcement – Counties*
65 waivers approved, 2 denied

Motion was made by Redd, seconded by Davis, with Schassburger, Voulgaris and Watson abstaining, and carried by all other members present to approve the Law Enforcement Waiver Disposition Report for Counties.

- c. *Law Enforcement – State and Others*
82 waivers approved, 3 denied

Motion was made by Watson, seconded by Davis, with Schassburger, Ryan and Voulgaris abstaining, and carried by all other members present to approve the Waiver Disposition Report for Law Enforcement State and Others.

- d. *Corrections*
26 waivers approved, 3 denied

Motion was made by Davis, seconded by Redd, with Watson, Schassburger and Voulgaris abstaining, and carried by all members present to approve the Waiver Disposition Report for Corrections.

- e. Court Security
4 waivers approved, 1 denied

Motion was made by Watson, seconded by Davis, and carried by all other members present to approve the Waiver Disposition Report for Court Security.

3. Decertification ~ Pat Hahn

Hahn introduced the Board members to Nick Kondelis, the newest attorney handling decertification hearings south of I-80. He then reminded the Board members their required annual trainings are coming due. Hahn stated his report, which lists the individuals recommended for removal from certification can be found under Tab H in the Board book. He stated notice was given to all, a chance to respond was given to all, and none responded. He presented the six officers listed in his report who have received convictions:

Hahn also stated there are three officers who have voluntarily surrendered their certification:

Motion was made by Watson, seconded by Davis, with Smoot abstaining on the Galesburg officer, and carried by all members present to approve the above listed officers be stricken from the role of certified law enforcement officers of the state.

4. Certification Review Panel ~ Andrew Janetzke

Janetzke provided updated information on the Certification Review Panel, established under the SAFE-T Act. The Panel will review findings from

Administrative Law Judges (ALJs) before they are presented to the Board. The Panel held the required in-person training and meeting on August 26, 2025, with similar trainings held in 2023 and 2024. The Panel selected a chairperson and, due to the current lack of ALJs, authorized Board staff to assign three formal complaints to ALJs once they are hired. The Panel also authorized staff to serve formal complaints to the officers involved. The Panel currently has 11 members.

XI. PROGRAM PROGRESS REPORTS AND CONCEPTS

A. Illinois Law Enforcement Executive Institute ~ Heather Hotz

Hotz reported their fall in-person trainings are up 200% from last year this time. She stated she has just returned from the inaugural session of *Lady Justice Rising*, which is the Executive Institute's newest women's leadership workshop. It was developed in collaboration with Blue Line Training and Development and is designed to empower women in law enforcement leadership positions. Hotz also noted the Executive Institute is expanding their collaboration with the MTU's to offer more leadership development opportunities throughout the state.

B. A Statewide System of In-Service Training (ASSIST) Program ~ Paul Petty

Petty stated his report can be found under Tab J in the Board book. Petty reported June 30, 2025 was the end of the first three-year period for the SAFE-T Act mandate requirements. Petty also stated the training costs; hourly, daily, and instructional for officer training, are the lowest they have ever been due to the MTU's training a record number of officers due to the new mandates.

C. CIT, Mental Health Training & Therapy Dog Initiative Update ~ Jennifer Wooldridge

Wooldridge stated the CIT FY26 training is progressing well. The Co-Response models have had an increase in interest, and to meet this need a partnership has begun with Mike Schlosser to build a new Co-Response training course.

Wooldridge then discussed the recent CIT Conference titled *Building Bridges, Strengthening Collaborations and Crisis Intervention*. She highlighted the success of the convention and of the inclusion of therapy dogs in attendance. She thanked the Executive Institute for their invaluable assistance with the conference.

Regarding the Therapy Dog initiative, Wooldridge noted SB1491, now Public Act 104-106, was recently signed into law. She stated the team will bring the implementation plan to the Board at the December Board meeting to be ready by the January effective date. She then welcomed Ghost, and his handler Brian Fengel, from MTU 7 to the team. Wooldridge discussed the many events

Trooper is attending, and noted Trooper has been asked to become a regular visitor at the Hines VA long term care facility.

Wooldridge discussed her and Trooper's recent attendance and presentation at the CIT International Conference in Anaheim, California. Wooldridge and Trooper traveled with pound pups from the Tails of Redemption team to the conference to showcase the Illinois Law Enforcement Therapy Canine Initiative and presented a CIT breakout session where they highlighted all of the trainings that fall under the Illinois CIT umbrella. She noted various states have followed up requesting additional information. Wooldridge and Trooper also recently attended the Cook County Officer Wellness Symposium in Oak Brook, Illinois.

D. Specialized Programs Update ~ *Paul Petty for Barbara Wood*

Petty stated Wood's report is found under Tab L in the Board book. He noted since January 2021 the Board has approved and released 1,130 new certificates in the SRO program, and to date there are 780 active certified SRO's. This is the first year the Board has received more recertification requests than certification requests.

John Keigher advised Wood's report also includes 13 individuals who have passed the test to be approved by the Board as certified Crash Reconstruction Specialists.

E. Information Technology Update ~ *Kelly Ingram*

Ingram stated his report can be found under Tab M in the Board book. He went on to note the data expansion service that was started in April, and is now complete, will allow the agency to have room to store evidence intake, it houses the Legal Hearing System which is complete and went live two weeks ago, and it will house the digital archiving which employees will be able to access on a live basis. Ingram then recognized two of his team members, Andrew Oldfield and Jason Wolfe, for their continued hard work and dedication to the Board.

Motion was made by Watson, seconded by Gomez, and carried by all members present to approve the Program Progress Reports.

XII. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

SAFE-T Act Update ~ *John Keigher*

Keigher reported staff has been working with the Illinois Justice Project regarding the SAFE-T Act. Staff has been in discussions with them on body cameras, the decertification process, Use of Force trainings, and the mandatory verification process.

Motion was made by Redd, seconded by Watson, and carried by all members present to accept the SAFE-T Act Update.

XIII. NEW BUSINESS

PTI Presentation on Canvas App ~ Joe Gallo & Shannon Bridges

Gallo and Bridges gave a presentation on the steps they are taking to modernize the vetted delivery method of the BLE curriculum through the Canvas App at their academy for today's recruits. The presentation is attached.

XIV. PUBLIC INPUT

Sheriff Jeff Bullard, Jefferson County Sheriff's Office and MTU 15 Board Member. Bullard spoke to the Board regarding the MTU policy which does not allow an MTU Board member to be an instructor. He requested the Board change this policy to allow MTU Board members to continue be instructors for the MTU's. Smoot noted that the policy change request has been made and stated things such as conflict-of-interest checks, Illinois State Statute provision checks, and the procurement code, that the Board is bound by, must be reviewed before any policy can be presented to the Board for a change.

Chief Steve Johnson, Fairview Heights Police Department. Johnson reminded the members that the jobs they do at these meetings changes lives. He went on to discuss a recent tragedy which occurred at his police department and thanked the Board for granting his department the requested Recruitment and Retention grant which helped him navigate the tragedy in a positive way.

XV. ANNOUNCEMENTS

Smoot asked attendees to keep in mind the tragedy that occurred over two decades ago, 9/11 should never be forgotten. He then announced the next Committee meetings will be held on December 3, 2025, and the next Quarterly Board meeting will be held December 4, 2025 in Chicago.

XVI. ADJOURNMENT

Motion was made by Watson, seconded by Redd, and carried by all members present to adjourn the meeting at 10:24 a.m.

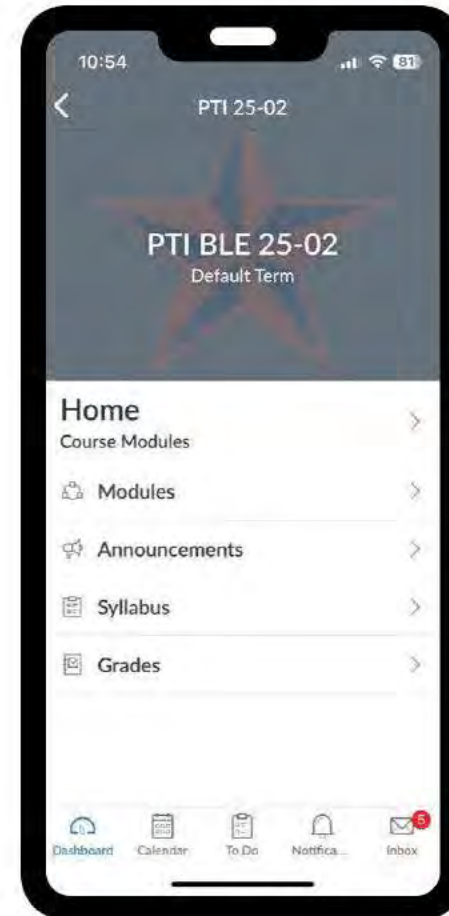

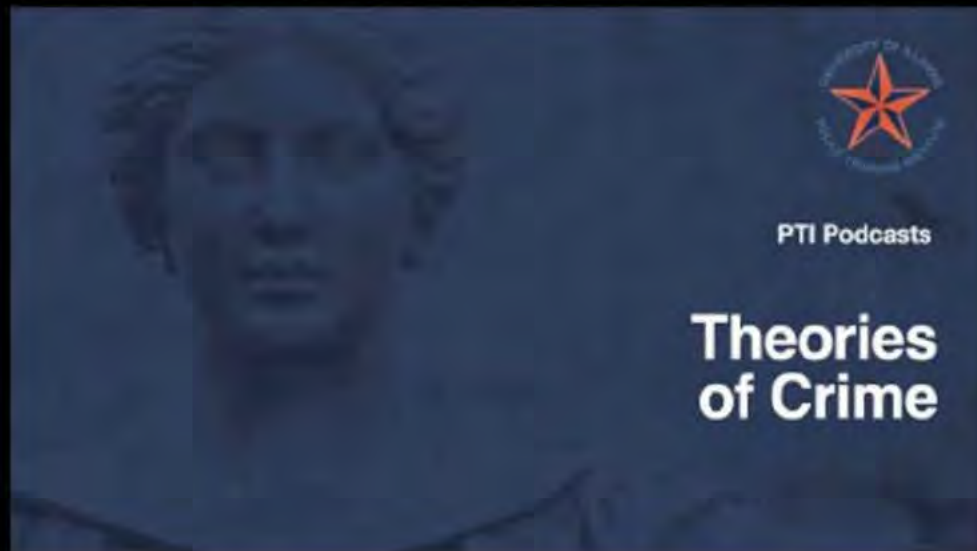

COURSE TITLE: Universal High-Risk Traffic Stop – 8 Hours

INSTRUCTOR(S): Any ILETSB Approved Universal High-Risk Traffic Stop Instructor – 8 Hours

INSTRUCTOR REQUIREMENTS: **Instructor** certification by any recognized entity in High-Risk Traffic Stops or High-Risk Vehicle Stops and approved by ILETSB for course of instruction.

PURPOSE OF COURSE: This 8-hour program has been designed to provide students with High-Risk Traffic Stop related encounters that require applying (or not applying) use of force in accordance with federal and state laws, and department policy in scenario-based training.

COURSE OVERVIEW: This 8-hour program has been designed for students to expose them to realistic traffic stop-related situations they may encounter while on duty. The use of force statutes and relevant Department policies will be used as a tool to evaluate students' responses to situations. The appropriate students' responses will be discussed.

COURSE GOALS: The goals of this course are to expose students to decision-making situations involving high risk traffic stops. The correct application of force, including using no force options, will be examined. Students' actions will be evaluated in comparison to Illinois Use of Force Statute ILCS 5/7 et seq, Department use of force related, and medical aid related law 720 ILCS 5/7-15 and policies.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES:

1. Understand the applicable Use of Force related law.
2. Understand the importance of Agency / Department policy requirements.
3. Understand the Constitutional/Proper use of law enforcement authority in conducting traffic stops.
4. Developing Reasonable Suspicion / Probable Cause to conduct a traffic stop.
5. Identify Circumstances in which High – Risk Traffic Stop techniques should be utilized
6. Understand proper tactical positioning as related to high-risk traffic stops.
7. Understanding how cover, concealment, and time is crucial to ensure officer safety
8. Understand proper vehicle approach and clearing tactics.
9. Properly communicate with assisting officers and suspect(s) during high-risk traffic stops.
10. Understand and demonstrate proper muzzle discipline for pistol and rifle.
11. Understand and demonstrate proper trigger finger placement and discipline.
12. Understand and demonstrate proper muzzle discipline in team environments, in and around vehicles, and around innocent parties during a high-risk vehicle stop.

13. Understand and demonstrate the optimal positioning of squad cars for a high-risk traffic stop and understand why this position is optimal.
14. Understand and demonstrate knowledge and use of the cover and/or concealment provided by a vehicle.
15. Understand and demonstrate the appropriate knowledge of the use of flanks and L shaped coverage.
16. Understand and demonstrate knowledge of traffic stop considerations and what constitutes a high-risk traffic stop.
17. Demonstrate their ability to perform as a member of a team.
18. Demonstrate their ability to utilize clear and concise verbal commands.
19. Demonstrate their ability to conduct various vehicle searching and clearing techniques.
20. Demonstrate their ability to properly employ various types of firearms during team movement and vehicle clearing operations.
21. Demonstrate proper muzzle discipline and trigger finger placement.
22. Demonstrate high-risk traffic stop techniques and tactics.
23. Demonstrate their ability to place offenders into custody.
24. Demonstrate their ability to clear and secure a vehicle once the offender(s) are in custody.
25. Demonstrate an understanding of officer safety techniques to include cover, concealment and time.

COURSE PREREQUISITES: Only sworn law enforcement personnel who are currently employed by a Department/Government Agency in a sworn capacity will be permitted to attend this course.

It is strongly suggested, however, that the students be in attendance for the entire session to maximize upon the knowledge and skill development associated with the training. - 9) Participants will be polled to identify any injury or medical prohibitions for participation.
- 10) Physical drills will be directly monitored, and appropriate injury precautions will be followed.
- 11) A medical (critical incident response) bag will be maintained in the training area.
- 12) An instructor, who has successfully completed the **“ITOA - Realistic Scenario Based Training Instructor and Safety Officer Course”**, or its equivalent, will be designated as the Training Safety Officer (TSO). An assistant instructor will be designated as the Assistant Training Safety Officer (ATSO) as needed.

Description

This course provides law enforcement professionals with guidance on autism-informed responses, procedures, and techniques. Specifically, instructional topics are designed to guide professionals in implementing evidence-based strategies when interacting with neurodivergent individuals who may exhibit unique sensory, communication, or cognitive sensitivities.

Goal

The goal of this Module is to provide law enforcement professionals with an understanding of autism spectrum disorders and the potential implications of law enforcement interactions. Common reasons individuals with autism interact with law enforcement include stimming, wandering / eloping, and meltdowns leading to escalations. Establishing autism-informed responses with tangible and initiative-taking techniques that can be used in any encounter increases the likelihood of having an optimal outcome for everyone.

NOTE: Throughout this Module, we will use **people-first language**. Disability advocates emphasize the importance of focusing on the individual, rather than the disability. Identity-first language includes phrases like "the autistic individual," compared to people-first language, "the individual with autism." Using people-first language demonstrates a holistic and ability-focused viewpoint.

(20 Ill. Adm. Code 1705.100-199) Applications for this opportunity must be submitted to the Board via AmpliFund by 5:00 p.m. CST on Wednesday, December 31st, 2025. More information can be found on our website under Resources – Grant Information.

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REPORT ON PERSONNEL MATTERS

December 2025 Quarterly Board Report

HIGH LEVEL OVERVIEW OF HIRING PROGRESS SINCE THE PASSAGE OF THE SAFE-T ACT

- 69 positions have been filled as of 11/1/25:
 - 13 internal promotions.
 - 4 internal transfers.
 - 21 new hires to State of Illinois employment.
 - 23 promotions from other agencies.
 - 1 reinstatement from another agency.
 - 7 transfers from other agencies.
- 7 employees have transferred out to other agencies.
- 8 employees have retired.
- 1 employee resigned to take a different job.
- 3 employees have been discharged.
- 1 employee was returned to work due to an arbitration award & then retired.
- 1 employee returned to work after a 4-year leave of absence.
- 2 retired employees returned on a 75-day temporary appointment – both are now ended.
- 10 positions are currently in various stages of the hiring process.
- 5 (or more) additional jobs will need to be posted to backfill before the end of FY26, due to internal promotions and movements.
- 2 new job descriptions are in the process of being developed, approved, posted, and filled through the end of FY26.
- 15 additional job descriptions still remain to be developed, approved, posted, and filled through the end of FY27.
- The agency headcount included in the approved FY26 budget allows for 66 employees.
- FY27 budget includes a request for a headcount of 86 (+20).

PERSONNEL UPDATES SINCE LAST QUARTERLY REPORT

- Headcount as of November 1st is 53, unchanged from the September report due to one new hire, one internal promotion, and one transfer out to another agency during that period.
- There have been two job offers made and accepted which will result in at least two additional new hires being onboarded between 11/1/25 and the December Board meeting.
- There is a possibility of two or three more job offers being made prior to the Board meeting which could potentially result in internal promotions or movements.

DETAILED STATUS OF HIRING SEQUENCES CURRENTLY IN PROGRESS

1. Legal Administrative Assistant – Anticipate job offer to be made by December meeting.
2. Operations Counsel & Ethics Officer – Anticipate job offer to be made by mid-December.
3. Specialized Programs Assistant – Job offer has been accepted – Onboarding December 1st.
4. Field Tech Support Specialist– Anticipate two job offers to be made by mid-December.
5. Investigations Manager - Public Service Administrator “PSA” Option 7 – This supervisory position falls under the Investigations Section of the Professional Standards Division and will report to the Deputy Director of Professional Standards. There has been a delay in getting interviews posted due to so many interviews being scheduled throughout October and November. Due to December Board meeting and decreased staffing during holiday season, these interviews are anticipated to be scheduled for January.
6. Certifications Manager – Anticipate job offer to be made by December meeting.
7. Manager of Basic and Part-Time Training – Anticipate job offer to be made by December meeting.
8. Assistant to the Associate Director of Information Services – Job offer has been accepted – Onboarding December 1st.
9. Certification Specialist – Job posted to backfill after an employee transferred to another agency. Anticipate job offer via contractual rights to be made by mid-December.

STATUS OF REMAINING FY26 HIRING SEQUENCES PLANNED

10. Director’s Confidential Assistant – This position has been vacant since August 16th due to the resignation of the incumbent to accept another position. This is an appointed position. As soon as the Director has identified a suitable candidate, this appointment will be made.
11. Training Division Counsel – Public Service Administrator “PSA” Option 8L – This training attorney position falls under the Legal Section and will report to the Chief Legal Counsel, but will coordinate closely with the Training Division. This position has been developed, but establishment request has been withdrawn to determine if another classification other than PSA would be appropriate. Awaiting guidance from CMS Classifications on how best to proceed.
12. Chief Accountability Officer – Former CAO has been appointed to the position of Chief Fiscal Officer effective October 1st. Edits have been made to remove assistant fiscal officer duties from this position and as soon as the edits have been approved by CMS Classifications, the position will be posted to backfill.
13. Audit Liaison & Reporting Manager – Governor’s Office on Management and Budget (GOMB) has indicated a strong need for all agencies to include a position with these duties. This position establishment has been submitted for approval, and as soon as it has been approved by CMS Classifications, the position will be posted to fill. *GOMB has indicated that we will be approved to exceed our headcount by one in order to fill this position, if we reach our headcount max by June 30, 2026.*

Once we fill the positions above and have backfilled any additional positions which have been vacated due to internal promotions, transfers, and separations, we will have reached our FY26 headcount of 66 (*or possibly 67*) employees. We remain on track to reach our approved headcount for the first time in at least a decade.

We will continue to work on the creation of the remaining job descriptions and the preliminary work for posting those additional positions so that we can begin posting in May 2026, in order to be able to onboard new hires on or as soon as possible after July 1, 2026, which is the first day of FY27.

When determining minimum in-service training requirements that a police officer must satisfactorily complete, only Board-Certified courses that comply with Board approved guidelines will be considered.

Board Policy Adopted September 22, 2016

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Key Autism-Informed Law Enforcement Responses, Procedures, and Techniques

P.A. 103-0949 amended the Police Training Act and mandated training for all officers in autism law enforcement responses, procedures, and techniques. In order to assist law enforcement agencies in accessing in-service **autism-informed law enforcement response** Training, the training may include, but is not limited to, the following:

- ▶ Identifying and appropriately responding to individuals with autism spectrum disorders;
- ▶ Recognizing the signs and symptoms of an autism spectrum disorder;
- ▶ Responding to the needs of a victim with an autism spectrum disorder;
- ▶ Interview and interrogation techniques for an individual with an autism spectrum disorder; and
- ▶ Techniques for differentiating an individual with autism spectrum disorder from a person who is being belligerent and uncooperative.
- ▶ Reducing barriers to reporting crimes against persons with autism.

Key Civil Rights Guidelines

In order to assist law enforcement agencies in accessing the widest possible variety of in-service mandated **Civil Rights** Training (P.A. 99-352), the Training Board has outlined the types of in-service training that would meet the mandate.

Any certified training course that contains any of the following **Civil Rights** Guidelines would be eligible to comply with the mandate:

- ▶ Constitutional Rights
 - ▶ Freedom of Assembly
 - ▶ Crowd Control Search & Seizure

- ▶ Identifying conflicts of interest and options to address those conflicts when a responding or investigating officer is familiar with the victim or accused. (P.A. 104-0084)
- ▶ Instruction on screening of victims of sexual assault and sexual abuse for human trafficking. (P.A. 104-0159)
- ▶ Applicable Illinois sexual assault/abuse laws

Any Certified training course that contains all the above would be eligible to comply with the mandate.

Key Trauma-Informed Programs, Procedures, and Practices meant to minimize traumatization of the victim

P.A. 104-0084 (**Anna's Law**) amended the Police Training Act and mandated training for all officers and investigators in trauma-informed programs, procedures, and practices meant to minimize traumatization of all victims.

- ▶ trauma-informed responses designed to ensure the physical safety and well-being of a child of an arrested parent or immediate family member;
- ▶ understanding the trauma experienced by a child while maintaining the integrity of the arrest and safety of officers, suspects, and other involved individuals
- ▶ Techniques designed to promote effective communication at the initial contact with crime victims and ways to comprehensively explain to victims and witnesses their rights under the Rights of Crime Victims and Witnesses Act and the Crime Victims Compensation Act.

Key Use of Force Guidelines

1. Executive Summit – Supervisor Liability; Matt Dolan; October 2, 2025; Bloomingtondale PD

A promotion to a supervisory position is an invitation to enter the world of risk management. Far too many supervisors are learning about these challenges through the process of trial and error—at great expense to themselves, their agencies, the people they lead, and the public that they serve. It is vital to agency operations that supervisors are continuously considering the ramifications of their leadership decisions in the context of liability and risk management. In this course, case law and recent real-world case studies will be utilized to illustrate the most common and costly liability issues confronting supervisors in law enforcement and effective strategies for minimizing that liability. This training is designed to prepare law enforcement supervisors to take preventative steps to limit supervisor liability, maintain organizational standards, and protect public trust.

Course Topics include:

- Your people—your greatest asset and your greatest liability
- Making legally and ethically defensible hiring decisions
- The FTO and probationary process
- Combating the diffusion of responsibility and the bystander effect

- Fair and consistent discipline designed to save careers
- Officer termination and the liabilities incurred by the failure to act

Matt Dolan is a licensed attorney who specializes in training and advising public safety agencies in matters of legal liability, risk management and ethical leadership. His training focuses on helping agency leaders create ethically and legally sound policies and procedures as a proactive means of minimizing liability and maximizing agency effectiveness.

2. Executive Summit – Advanced Search & Seizure; Anthony Bandiero; October 7, 2025; Fairview Heights

The Illinois Advanced Search & Seizure course is a comprehensive program specifically designed for Illinois law enforcement professionals who aspire to be proactive and legally defensible in their actions. Through fast-paced instruction, we use real-world case law to explain the intricacies of searches and seizures in federal and Illinois courts. The course is divided into several modules, beginning with a thorough understanding of the Fourth Amendment and its key principles. We then delve into the requirement of state action and what constitutes a Fourth Amendment search and seizure. Finally, we cover the legal issues surrounding the most commonly used searches and seizures by police officers, including citizen-consensual encounters, apparent authority to consent to search, investigative detentions, and more. The approach is high-energy and interactive, ensuring that students remain engaged and motivated throughout the course. Upon completion, all students will receive the Search & Seizure Survival Guide, which will serve as a valuable reference for future use.

Attending this course is an opportunity to equip yourself with the skills and knowledge needed to make legally defensible decisions in search and seizure situations. The outcome will be reduced liability for yourself and your agency and officers who possess the requisite knowledge to provide the highest level of service to the communities they are sworn to protect.

Mandates: Procedural Justice (1 hr); Legal Updates (3 hrs); Human Rights (0.5 hrs); Const. Use of LE Authority (1 hr); Civil Rights (1 hr).

3. Live Webinar – Empathy and Inclusion; Katharine Manning; January 16, 2025; Zoom

Empathy is a workplace superpower. It forges bonds, builds inclusion, and enhances long-lasting engagement and productivity. This foundational training provides the skills to build empathy at work for better collaboration and stronger teams. This ninety-minute session covers the definition of empathy and why empathy at work is so important. Attendees will then learn the practical steps we can all take to increase our empathy at work, and how to identify and confront common barriers to empathy, like distancing assumptions about others' backgrounds and experiences.

Mandate: Officer Wellness/Mental Health (1.5 hrs.)

4. Executive Summit – Meta Communication for Law Enforcement Executives; Judy Pal; October 16, 2025; Peoria

Developing and delivering communication in various forms that build trust and legitimacy with diverse audiences is an important part of a leader's skill set. This course explores the process of communicating effectively from a management perspective and finishes with strategies for communicating effectively with one's community using both traditional and emerging tools. The goal of this course is to help further develop leaders' skills in situational analysis and develop effective methods of advanced professional, strategic, and purposeful communication.

The course covers internal communication and personal analysis of one's communication style and studies the components and challenges of the unique internal culture of police agencies and the processes and efficiency of both internal and external communication.

Mandates: Crisis Intervention (2 hours), Officer Wellness/Mental Health (1 hour), and Procedural Justice (4 hours).

6. Executive Summit – GOLD SERIES – Intentional Leadership; Dean Crisp; October 28-30, 2025 ; Yorkville; and November 18-20, 2025; Mt. Vernon

This course is designed for the current, new, or soon-to-be leader who wants to understand and practice the best leadership techniques available today. In this fast-paced, multi-day class, the student will be introduced to the soft-skill side of leadership and its importance in motivating and leading today's workforce.

Module 1 of 3: Introduction to Intentional Leadership

Instructional Goals:

This module introduces the idea of Intentional Leadership by creating a partnership between the instructor, the student, and their peers. It also seeks to provide real-life examples of leadership, establish a challenging learning environment, provoke deep thought among participants, and help them refocus their leadership mindset with intention and professional action.

Performance Objectives:

Upon completion of this module, attendees will be able to:

1. Understand what Intentional Leadership means
2. Understand how to lead with purpose
3. Re-evaluate their mindset
4. Understand maturity levels of leaders
5. Understand the importance of personal and organizational values
6. Understand their “why” of leadership
7. Understanding emotional intelligence
8. Understand strategic acumen
9. Understand the “Leadership-Partnership-Relationship Creates Synergy” Model

Module 2 of 3: Understanding the LRPS Model and Dean's Simple Truths of Leadership

Instructional Goals:

This module introduces the participants to what constitutes Intentional Leadership: creating an intentional relationship with your employees, thus leading to an intentional partnership with them that ultimately creates synergy within the organization.

Module 3 of 3: Mentoring and Critical vs. Crucial Conversations

This module introduces the participants to the importance of mentoring as part of being an Intentional Leader.

- 1. Know the difference between a critical conversation vs. a crucial conversation

This webinar provides insights into the prevalence of trauma in the professions, how it impacts criminal justice professionals, and strategies to counter its effects.

9. Executive Summit – Justice for your Wallet; Timothy Cooney; December 4, 2025; O’Fallon

This interactive course provides officers with the tools, strategies, and confidence to achieve financial stability and success. When members go "above and beyond" their assigned duties is some form of "thank you" appropriate? When leaders do not convey gratitude for extra and exceptional efforts, are there consequences? Does a lack of gratitude pose officer wellness issues? Do only those who directly receive a "thank you" receive some benefit in the expression of gratitude? Additionally, when members merely do the work they are paid to do, are they also "owed" some expression of gratitude?

Should gratitude be a guiding factor in how police leaders lead? How might core management activities be impacted by a “gratitude leading” leadership approach? This course will provide essential guidance in how police leaders should answer these questions.

Learning Objectives

The presentation provides instruction in support of procedural justice and officer wellness. The session will utilize a PowerPoint presentation to organize the concepts within a participatory lecture approach.

The training objectives include:

- A review of key scientific research into gratitude and its impact on others and self.
- Understanding gratitude expectations and enhancement opportunities within police agencies.
- The ability to apply gratitude as a leadership approach among key management responsibilities within the police agency setting.

Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board Executive Institute

This report provides an update of the Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board Federal Homeland Security Grant funded through the Illinois Homeland Security Advisory Council (HSAC).

TRAINING AND FUNDING

ILETSB has been a voting member of the Illinois Homeland Security Advisory Council and recipient of homeland security funds since 2002. ILETSB has four active awards, Federal Fiscal Years 2021, 2022, 2023, and 2024; years 2021, 2022, and 2023 the award is \$391,000. For FFY 2024 the award is in the amount of \$136,000. The decrease is the result of a 10 percent reduction to the State of Illinois Homeland Security Grant Program. This 10 percent reduction impacted all stakeholders receiving homeland security funds in Illinois. ILETSB is currently in Federal Fiscal Year 2022 with the performance period ending June 30, 2026.

ILLINOIS HOMELAND SECURITY ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Acting IEMA-OHS Director Ted Berger and OHS Deputy Director Beth Windisch provided opening remarks. An unclassified/FOUO intelligence briefing was provided by ISP Intelligence Chief Aaron Kustermann. Jason Bowen from the Department of Innovation and Technology (DoIT) provided a cyber security update.

IEMA-OHS staff provided an update on the FFY 2025 Homeland Security Grant Program. Chicago UASI and Illinois' share received less funds than were initially awarded. The State of Illinois has gone to court to remedy the additional cuts. IEMA-OHS feels confident that Illinois will prevail and receive the appropriate amount of federal dollars that was awarded.

Next full quarterly meeting of the HSAC will be on January 28, 2026 at 10:00 am at IEMA.

LAW ENFORCEMENT MUTUAL AID COMMITTEE

LEMAC did not meet during this quarter.

CENTER FOR HOMELAND SECURITY LEADERSHIP

Program Director – Derek Carle

Derek Carle continues to serve on the Illinois Homeland Security Advisory Council (IHSAC) and serves on three sub-committees of the IHSAC: Law Enforcement Mutual Aid Committee, Cyber Security Committee and, Prevention Committee.

Derek serves on three national committees pertaining to law enforcement and incident management. Derek is a member of a law enforcement committee to address incident command/NIMS to law enforcement executives, command staff and officers. Derek is also on the Incident Commander and Intelligence/Investigations committees.

Derek is also a credentialed Type 2 Incident Commander for the State of Illinois.

Planning Workshops

During this quarter the Mobile Training Units held 14 workshops for 284 officers totaling 4,924 hours of training. UASI held 0 workshops. The workshops were paid out of the FFY2021 HSGP.

The ILETSB-Executive Institute using Homeland Security funds introduced a two-day advanced drone operators' course. Two of these courses were held at University of Illinois – Springfield and Elgin Police Department. The advanced drone operators' course includes instruction on interior flight, mapping, counter drone operations and area searching, culminating in two practical exercises. Additional classes will be offered in the Spring.

Illinois Active Threat Master Instructor Course

The fall 2025 Illinois Active Threat Master Instructor Course (IATMIC) has been completed. 29 Illinois officers graduated the fall class on October 24th at T1G. One officer had to drop out week 2 due to an on-the-job injury. The next IATMIC will be held in the fall of 2026.

The Illinois Active Threat Master Instructor Certification Program builds upon the ITOA's (Illinois Tactical Officers Association) TPO (Tactical Patrol Officer) program by offering an advanced certification for current instructors throughout the state.

The 4-week program will certify instructors to teach: Use of Force, Safety Officer/Scenario Based Instruction, High Risk Patrol Tactics, Active Threat/Rapid Deployment, Solo Officer Response, Rescue Task Force, and Urban Tactic/MACTAC (Multiple Assault Counter Terrorist Action Capabilities).

Homeland Security Workshop Catalog

With guidance from Mobile Team Unit Coordinators, staff continues to review and revise the workshop catalog. Coordinators are encouraged to submit new workshops for consideration.

Based on the desire of the Illinois Homeland Security Director and the IHSAC, the homeland security grant guidance and catalog will be going through a small revision. The core courses for the catalog will consist of the Active Threat Master course, Active Threat End-User courses,

Community Behavioral Threat Assessment (different from school based Behavioral Threat Assessment), Digital Threat Assessment, Cyber Security, Domestic Violent Extremism, Soft Targets/Crowded Spaces and a few of the popular courses that address the Vision 2028 Homeland Security Strategy.

Illinois School and Campus Safety Program

The Illinois School and Campus Safety Program provides awareness and preparedness training to enhance organizational capacity to plan for, respond to, and recover from an emergency or disaster. The Program also runs the Illinois School and Campus Safety Resource Center website.

Presentations and Work Groups

Derek Carle, the new Program Director for the Illinois School and Campus Safety Program, serves on the Law Enforcement Mutual Aid Subcommittee, the Prevention subcommittee, and the Cybersecurity Subcommittee of the HSAC. Derek participated and presented during a school safety webinar co-hosted by the Illinois State Police and the Illinois State Board of Education on Oct. 8th. He attended the Illinois Tactical Officer's Association Conference, as well as the Active Threat & Mental Wellness Conference in Joliet. He also attended (and the Illinois School and Campus Safety Program had a booth at) the Joint Annual Conference.

National Domestic Preparedness Consortium (NDPC)

The Illinois School and Campus Safety Program works in collaboration with NDPC members, including the Energetic Materials Research and Testing Center at New Mexico Tech, to bring a variety of courses to Illinois, including classes on Understanding and Planning for School Bombing Incidents and Surviving Bombing Incidents for Educators. The Program is working on the schedule for 2026 and plans on scheduling sessions of both classes.

Readiness and Emergency Management for Schools Technical Assistance Center (REMS TA Center)

Unfortunately, the REMS TA Center closed this Fall. The Illinois School and Campus Safety Program has been downloading resources from the REMS TA Center website to preserve them for potential future use and to be able to upload the PDFs to the Illinois School and Campus Safety Resource Center website in the event that the links that currently route to the REMS TA Center website cease to function.

Behavioral Threat Assessment and Online Threat Assessment

The Illinois School and Campus Safety Program is working to deliver training regarding the threat assessment & management process and online threat assessment.

The Program continues to work with David Okada, past President of the Association of Threat Assessment Professionals, on sessions of the K-12 class Threat Assessment Team Training (TATT).

The Program continues to work with Dr. Gene Deisinger and Jeffrey Cugno on both the K-12 class Behavioral Threat Assessment and Management in a School Setting (BTAM) and the higher ed class Campus Threat Assessment and Management (CTAM).

Furthermore, the Program continues to work with Safer Schools Together on sessions of Digital Threat Assessment® (DTA) and Advanced Digital Threat Assessment® (ADTA), as well as with

Rich Wistocki on sessions of Preventing Targeted Violence Through Leakage and Cyber Investigations (PTVTLCI).

The Program held a session of CTAM on Oct. 14-15th, a session of DTA on Oct. 17th, a session of DTA on Oct. 30th, a session of ADTA on Nov. 7th, a session of CTAM on Nov. 10-11th, a session of CTAM on Dec. 3-4th, and a session of PTVTLCI on Dec. 15-16th.

For 2026, the Program has sessions of DTA scheduled for Feb. 17th and March 9th, has a session of TATT scheduled for March 5-6, and is in the process of scheduling additional sessions of TATT, BTAM, CTAM, and PTVTLCI.

New for 2026, the Program will also be hosting monthly (except for July & August) 2-hr Current Online Behavioral Trends and Updates classes, which are scheduled for Jan. 22nd, Feb. 27th, March 25th, April 23rd, May 27th, June 25th, Sept. 24th, Oct. 22nd, Nov. 19th, and Dec. 17th.

Cybersecurity and Cyber Safety

The Illinois School and Campus Safety Program is working with Safer Schools Together on sessions of the Cyberbullying, Sextortion, and the Pathway to Radicalization class. The Program has sessions of the class scheduled for Jan. 28th and March 2nd, 2026.

Additionally, the Program is working on scheduling classes on Cybersecurity in Education: Risk Assessment, Mitigation, and Management with Safer Schools Together for 2026.

Site Safety Security Assessment

The Illinois School and Campus Safety Program is working to deliver sessions of the Site Safety Security Assessment training throughout Illinois. The Program is working on the schedule and plans to hold around 8 sessions of the training in 2026.

Crisis Communications

The Illinois School and Campus Safety Program is working with Deputy Chief Chris Covelli on sessions of Effective Communication Principles Before, During, and After Critical Incidents. The Program is working on schedule and plans to hold around 8 sessions of the training in 2026.

Crisis Response and Reunification

The Illinois School and Campus Safety Program is working with the “I Love U Guys” Foundation to schedule sessions of the 2-Day SRM-REx training, which includes a full-day SRP/SRM (Standard Response Protocol and Standard Reunification Method) Train the Trainer and a full day of reunification exercises. The Program has contacted 7 potential hosts so far and plans on launching a series of the SRM-REx trainings throughout the state in 2026.

The Program is also working on Critical Incident Response and Management classes with Safer Schools Together for 2026.

Trauma-Informed Practice and Interpersonal Violence

The Illinois School and Campus Safety Program continues to work with Michelle Denault to hold sessions of her class “It IS Your Business”: Grooming and Sexual Assault Awareness for K-12 Schools and Institutions of Higher Education.

The Program is working with Safer Schools Together on sessions of their Trauma-Informed Safe and Caring School Communities class. The Program has sessions scheduled for Feb. 10th and April 7th, 2026.

Website

The Illinois School and Campus Safety Program continues to promote and update the Illinois School and Campus Safety Resource Center website. The website features a comprehensive resource compendium of school safety topics, has a multimedia platform that features public service video work, features many of our collaborative state and federal partners, and provides information about the Illinois School and Campus Safety Program. We are continuing to seek input from both K-12 and higher education institutions and associations to drive the content of the website. Staff is currently working on adding additional resources and topic areas to the website, as well as testing and updating links.

Weekly Update Emails

The Illinois School and Campus Safety Program continues to promote school safety topics and spread awareness through our Weekly Update emails, which go out weekly to over 23,000 individuals in the School and Campus Safety directories. The Weekly Update emails feature important school safety topics, share breaking news/resources, promote upcoming classes, and provide links to the Illinois School and Campus Safety Resource Center website. Past Weekly Update emails are added to the Resource Center website to make their content accessible to individuals who do not receive them via email.

K-12 School Directory and Institution of Higher Education Directory

Staff continue to update the K-12 public and private school directory and the statewide institution of higher education directory. Presently the directory has over 23,000 contacts. For October through December, staff worked on updating the K-12 directories for ROE 20, ROE 21, ROE 30, ROE 56, and Chicago.

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The Executive Institute A.S.S.I.S.T. Program (A Statewide System of In-Service Training) was started at the end of July 2023. This program consists of three major sections: State Law Enforcement Agencies (Course Certification, Instructor Approval, and class recognition), ILETSB K9 Certification and the ILETSB IROCC (Illinois Retired Officer's Concealed Carry) Program, along with several entities that do not fall within these sections directly. The EI - A.S.S.I.S.T. Program also works directly with the rest of the Executive Institute and ILETSB staff with assistance in conferences and training, along with the administration of the IDOT Grant. Since the inception of the EI – A.S.S.I.S.T. Program, several State Law Enforcement agencies have used our program to get their courses ILETSB certified, along with getting their instructors approved to provide the instruction. This is helping agencies to fulfill mandate requirements per the Illinois Safe-T Act.

We held another EI-A.S.S.I.S.T./State Law Enforcement Agency Training Coordinator meeting on September 23rd at the ILETSB building involving several State Law Enforcement Agencies throughout the state. Present at the meeting or via Webex were several agency representatives that showed up such as: ILETSB, Illinois Attorney General's Office, Illinois Secretary of State Police, Illinois State Police, Illinois Department of Revenue, Illinois Department of Natural Resources, Illinois Gaming Board, CMS Illinois State Police Protective Services Unit, Illinois Supreme Court Marshals Office, along with Heather Hotz from Executive Institute. Heather went into great detail regarding what the Executive Institute Offers from online learning to conferences that they can attend, answering any questions they had. ILETSB Deputy Director Cobb gave an overview of ILETSB's Certification process and answered several questions regarding Certification and the Officer Portal. The meeting itself was informal, with open discussions, suggestions, and questions. This meeting, putting several State Law Enforcement Agencies in the same room, was highly beneficial and probably does not happen normally. Their information was shared, so they have a direct contact on each agency, along with agencies sharing trainings that they conduct in-house, which they will open up for other State Law Enforcement Agencies to attend when available. The Agencies understand the importance of the trainings, the Safety Act, along with the required mandates and they strive to train beyond the minimum. There was an overwhelming reception on what was discussed, and we are planning to have this meeting twice a year.

The VirTra System located at the ILETSB Building is being utilized by departments with more looking to start. We have added even more ILETSB certified courses for the system, to give more opportunities to get training and mandates needed. More courses are being reviewed to add as well.

The K9 Certification/Re-certification team, which includes ILETSB Legal Counsel, has been working on ways of updating the program. This is to help ensure accurate information on forms and keep the certification process up to date. This program has scheduling in several locations around the state with dates scheduled throughout the year to assist the Department's K9 handlers and the K9 assessors. We have gone back to using a fiscal year calendar for record keeping. For updates on the 2nd quarter of fiscal year 2026 K9 Program statistics, see the included report. On 11/03/25 we held a K9 Assessor's meeting at the ILETSB Building and discussed updated changes on the website, discussed the latest trainings reference Fentanyl and ideas to look at to improve the program.

The IROCC, which consists of nearly 10,000 applicants yearly and has been working alongside Levi, Ray and Shoup, Inc. in the updating of the website and application process to help with the vetting of applicants and making operations more efficient. The good news is that we are now in the testing and final changes phase of the process. For details of updates on the IROCC Program calendar year 2026 numbers, see the included report.

This report provides an update on the administration of the ASSIST Program including: the 2nd Quarter Report for FY26. Presented below are some of the ASSIST administrative matters to include Training and Fiscal reports.

Attachment I contains the ASSIST program training activity report results through the 1st quarter of Fiscal Year 2026 to include all thirteen MTU's, Executive Institute, State ASSIST, and DOJ/COPS Training Portal. This chart provides information from each Mobile Team Unit: number of training course hours, total number of students attending the training programs, man hours and number of courses offered. The Fiscal Year totals for the first quarter are listed below: (It should be noted that MTU 3 & Executive Institute data is provided to IT at ILETSB and is not automatically generated or uploaded like all others and can cause delays in reporting).

Cost remain consistent as each quarters challenge is maintaining consistent numbers regarding attendees to each training. These numbers often fluctuate based on training cycles for departments and individual department scheduling needs.

Attachment II provides a financial overview of the total budgets operationally for the MTU's including expected Specialized Training requests along with the MTU's ten percent match of the state's fifty percent cost. To date, the Board has approved release of one payment to the Mobile Team Units including one payment to CPD for their in-service training needs. 2nd Quarter vouchers have been signed and presented to fiscal for review, approval and release of funds.

(Addition to the map includes the State ASSIST Division located within ILETSB office in Springfield that represents all state agencies for In-House Training Applications, Instructors, and Certification)

Attachment V represents the current Part-time Police Training Academy dates and graduations as set by each entity.

Closure

In-Service training continues to be a focus of our MTU Directors and their staff with the vision of ensuring a 100% compliance for officers A-G in their first verification period in January 2026. As the Training Division rolls out the new LETM Platform buildout, MTU's will work to immediately transition updated officer information, instructor information, and course selection. This rollout will enable MTU's to be more efficient with course selection for both In-Service and In-House material storage and presentation to eligible instructors.

This report is a summary of the most significant staff activity related to the administration of the ASSIST Program during the second quarter of Fiscal Year 2026. This report reflects the dedication, commitment, and partnerships involving the MTU's, the Executive Institute, Certification, IT, and the Fiscal Divisions within the ILETSB office.

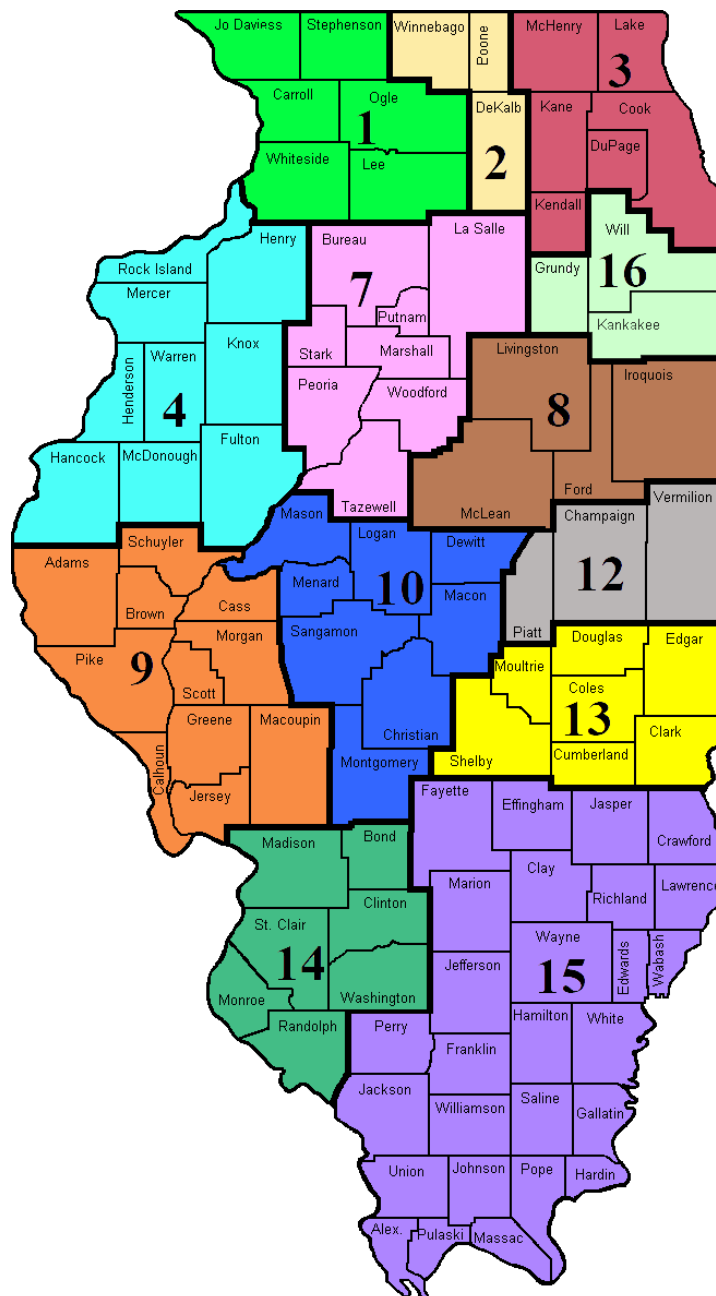

This report provides an update on the administration of the Board's Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) training programs, therapy dog initiative and various related mental health and de-escalation trainings.

CIT Training Courses/Series:

As reported to this body at the September Quarterly Board meeting, interest in the CIT training programs and related mental health related trainings remain strong. This includes not only training for our officers, but of late, more and more other crisis responders such as clinicians, social workers, firemen, EMT's and the like. We are grateful for our training team and MTU partners and thank them all for their assistance with all these important programs.

In follow up to a topic brought before you in September, we have recently partnered with consultants for assistance with the creation of a statewide CIT co-response training curriculum. With that, I'm happy to share that I will be bringing this statewide model to the Curriculum committee for consideration at their December meeting. If approved, we will begin offering this course in early 2026. (matrix included in this report)

I know that I briefly mentioned a request for assistance from the Haymarket Center of Chicago but wanted to give you a quick follow up. The Haymarket Center (whose mission is to aid people with substance use disorders in their recovery) reached out to see if our trainers would be able to provide (6) one-day trainings (which include role play) for their entire staff on de-escalation/CIT concepts. In lieu of payment, they have offered in-kind assistance for these trainings to include participation in our 40-hour CIT training courses (sharing stories/journeys/recovery and resources), assistance with recruiting and training those with lived-experiences for work in our trainings as well as other in-kind assistance. Since last reported in September, our team has begun training for the Haymarket Center staff and the feedback we received from their team was overwhelmingly positive (copy of email attached to my report). We are excited about this partnership and look forward to working with them.

CIT K-9 Therapy Dog Initiative:

Since last reported at the September Board meeting, I'm excited to share that this initiative continues to grow and make positive impacts not just in Illinois but beyond! Through community events including (but not limited to) stops at schools, the Brookfield Zoo to help welcome visitors, honor law enforcement and visit with the veterinary staff, to domestic violence court and a Veterans Day visit to the Hines VA Hospital to honor those who served, these law enforcement therapy k-9's and their handlers are making waves throughout the state. I'd also like to share that a couple of us (K-9 Trooper and K-9 Zilly and his handler, Director Jerry Roman, CCSO/TOR) also traveled to Evergreen Colorado the week after our September Board meeting to lend a hand (comforting paw) to that community after a high school shooting. From our continuing training and community outreach with these special pups, it is so apparent that even when our visits are short, the lasting impact these gentle pup souls have on those they encounter is life altering (if even just for that particular day). I'm humbled to be part of such an amazing journey and look forward to seeing it grow.

Here are some other highlights of the therapy dog initiative since last reported in September:

*** Continuing Training and Community Events:**

Trooper and I have attended not only CIT trainings around the state, but also TOR sponsored continuing skills training for K-9 therapy dogs and their handlers (meet at least once monthly). These trainings reinforce basic skills, provides tricks to acquiring more advanced techniques/approaches, and allows for team interacting events and site visits. Here's some highlights since last reported in September:

- Castle Rock and Evergreen Colorado following a school shooting (please see attached press release) for additional information (September 2025)
- Brookfield Zoo – for visits with their various veterinary staff (September 2025)
- Domestic Violence Court (during domestic violence awareness month - was featured on CBS in Chicago – Trooper also made the front page of the Chicago Law Bulletin) (October 2025)
- Hines VA Hospital (Veterans Day Program) (November 2025)
- Brookfield Zoo (Veterans Day Program) (November 2025)
- Taft School – Harvey Illinois (visit with the school children and administration) (November 2025)

*** Implementation of PA 104-106**

As the Board has already approved the outline for this crisis response therapy dog certification program for law enforcement and those working with first responders in a CIT or related capacity, Board staff, our consultants, and our TOR partners have developed the parameters for this specialty k-9 certification, including eligibility and course outline (matrix is attached to this report). As will be presented to the Curriculum Committee at their December quarterly meeting; to be eligible to participate in the law enforcement crisis response therapy dog certification, applicants must be attached to a law enforcement roster (even those responding as a civilian in a co-response fashion) with their respective therapy dog working for that agency. Officers who want to become certified with their k-9 partners must have completed the forty-hour certified CIT training course prior to submitting their application. Civilians working with law enforcement in a co-response fashion who wish to participate in the crisis response therapy dog certification program, must have successfully completed the Board's new certified Co-Response

Training program to be eligible. For those officers and co-responders interested in participating, they would need to complete an application (which will soon be available on the Board's website). Once Board staff has reviewed the application and necessary documentation (including veterinary records), the officer or co-response team member along with their therapy dog will be eligible to participate in the in-person course. Upon successful completion of this no-cost to departments training and assessment by TOR approved evaluators (MOU with Cook County/TOR to be established), you will then be entered into the PTB database, receive a numbered certificate and CIT therapy dog patch for your k-9, be eligible for continuing monthly trainings, be a part of the statewide call-out team and have your therapy dog featured on the Board's CIT webpage. To maintain your certification, annual continuing training will be mandated for the team. As Illinois is the first state to offer a statewide law enforcement therapy dog certification program, all eyes are on us to set meaningful standards. We believe we have done just that! These are truly exciting times for which I'm so proud to have been a part of!

So mark your calendars and join us for this important event!

CESSA:

Just a quick update to let you know that the CESSA statewide group continues to meet as well as the subcommittees. Progress is being made for implementation around the state; however, because of the enormous task at hand, a new legislative extension (via bill) has been submitted was approved to extend the deadline until July 2027. I will keep the Board apprised of substantive updates.

Along the same lines, the CESSA Training Subcommittee has approached the Board for assistance in creating an 8 hour in-person de-escalation course (including scenarios) for all PSAP's (public safety answering point). We are currently working on an Intergovernmental Agreement with the Department of Human Services to accomplish this task.

CIT and Mental Health Awareness Training and Resource Institute:

As the Board has been offering the basic CIT training since 2003 and various off-shoots of mental health training including the CIT series, Mental Health Awareness and Response – and Intro to CIT, peer support pilot programs, officer wellness, etc. we are looking to the future to the possibility of creating a CIT and Mental Health Awareness Training & Resource Institute – perhaps in conjunction with the 988/CESSA roll out. It is really just a larger defined umbrella to the works we are already doing including but not limited to:

- CIT training series for in-service
- Intro to CIT training in academies (CIT Concepts)
- CIT resources
- MHA and Response Training and Resources
- Peer support training and resources (model policies and best practices)
- Support pilot programs on peer support
- Officer wellness training and resources
- Resources for families of law enforcement officers
- Co-responder model policy and best practices
- Therapy/Comfort dog assistance – Tails of Redemption (TOR) through the Cook County Sheriff's Office and Operation TT through the PBPA
- Add on training for social workers, paramedics, fire and additional courses for dispatch (as allowed)
- De-escalation training by CIT Instructors
- Provide opportunities for ICAT training
- Summits/conferences (may also assist with training mandates)
- Increase awareness of resources via first responder app
- Become a repository for best practices statewide
- Create a reporting mechanism (to assist with getting federal funds)
- Ongoing research and curriculum updates/development

Although we have not yet begun on this initiative, as soon as the Board retains additional staff to help support such an extensive resource platform, we will move forward with this concept.

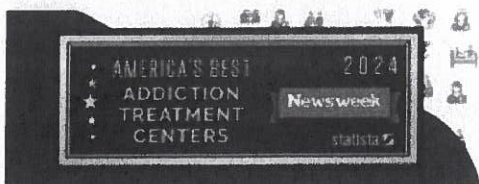

Illinois Therapy K-9 Teams Provide Trauma Support in Colorado Following School Shooting

SPRINGFIELD, IL – Therapy K-9 teams from the **Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board (ILETSB)** and the **Cook County Sheriff's Office (CCSO)** were deployed in September to Colorado to provide specialized crisis support following the school shooting at Evergreen High School. This rapid, multi-jurisdictional response highlights the critical role of therapy K-9s in trauma-informed public safety efforts.

The mission featured **State CIT Coordinator Jennifer Wooldridge** of ILETSB with her therapy K-9, **Trooper**, and **Cook County Sheriff's Officer Jerry Roman** with his therapy K-9, **Zilly**.

The deployment began with the teams mobilizing quickly to offer support following a recent shooting incident. Roman utilized his professional network, reaching out to the **Castle Rock Police Department** to offer assistance. The department, located near the impacted community, immediately welcomed the Illinois teams.

The team departed Monday morning, driving over **1,000 miles** to arrive in Colorado early Tuesday, ready to begin their work.

The therapy teams spent two days delivering vital community support across multiple locations, including **Castle Rock High School** and the **Evergreen** middle and grade schools.

The community expressed immense gratitude to the therapy K-9s, Trooper and Zilly, for their role in providing emotional healing.

A community member expressed their thanks saying, "**Our house is your house; we can't believe you traveled that distance for us.**" Notably, a teacher reported that a non-verbal young boy found comfort with the dogs, saying "**he loved the black and yellow dogs because they made him feel safe.**"

The four-day deployment underscored the initiative and dedication of Illinois first responders. The team's presence was a source of great comfort to the small Colorado community, including local staff voiced praise "**We heard a team from Chicago was in town for us, we can't believe the support**" and "**we are so thankful for you.**"

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SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER (SRO) PROGRAM

December 2025 Quarterly Board Report

Barbara Wood, Manager of Specialized Programs

In the wake of multiple school tragedies, the Illinois General Assembly addressed the use of police personnel within the school setting by passing PA 100-984 in Spring of 2018. Beginning January 1, 2021, any officer serving in the role of School Resource Officer (SRO) must obtain a certificate by the Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board ("Board"). These SRO certificates are good for two (2) years before an officer/agency must reapply. Officers serving as SRO's must either complete specialized training developed through ILETSB and other stakeholders or attain a waiver by the Board.

To date since January 2021, the Board has provided a total of approximately 1653 new certificates to SROs throughout the state. Currently there are approximately 798 active SROs certified by ILETSB in the state. For this quarter the Board office processed approximately 50 new requests for certification and 65 requests for recertification.

To further assist our SROs with recertification, an 8-hour SRO recertification course was created and presented to Paul Petty, Manager of In-Service Training for approval. This new course in no way is trying to replace our current 16-hour SRO recertification course, this is simply an additional resource for our SROs to obtain their recertification hours. This course will strictly focus on the classroom portion of our 16-hour recertification course. The Juvenile Law and Officer and Youth Interaction portions of the recertification requirements seem to be what most SROs struggle with obtaining. So, this course was developed in response to that. A handout of this recommended course has been provided to the Board members for review.

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STATE CERTIFIED CRASH RECONSTRUCTION SPECIALIST PROGRAM

December 2025 Quarterly Board Report

In September 1986 the Illinois Law Enforcement Training & Standards Board adopted a formal Crash Reconstruction program, in order to validate the professional expertise of individuals engaging in crash reconstruction in Illinois.

This program requires that an applicant complete specific training programs from vendors that are certified by the Board. Upon completion of these courses an application is submitted to Board staff for review. If the application is approved, the applicant is required to take and pass all three parts of a state exam with a score of 70% or better. Finally, upon recommendation of the Manager of Specialized Programs the individuals will be approved for certification by the Board.

The following individuals have successfully completed all portions of the certification exam and Board staff recommends these 4 individuals be approved, as Board certified as Crash Reconstruction Specialist.

Since ILETSB began tracking LHI certification and recertification in January 2012 there have been 15,982 officers approved or waived for the LHI program. Currently there are 4,884 active LHI certified officers in the state of Illinois.

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INFORMATION SERVICES BOARD REPORT

December 2025 Quarterly Board Report

ILETSB In-House Applications:

Steering Committee meetings are conducted on a weekly basis with ILETSB Departmental Representation for opportunity to provide input of functional improvements, reporting provisions and legal requirements of the applications - With the expansion of Application provisions, consideration is being given to adding an additional programmer to development services

PTB/LEDI:

PTB is utilized internally to provide records management to ILETSB Staff in the areas of basic training, specialized certification, Professional Conduct records, and data reports for officers and their agencies - LEDI serves as a document records submission portal, to assist agencies in reviewing and maintaining compliance with legal requirements to State of Illinois mandates - Development of the applications continue with regular improvements and feature enhancements

LETM:

Law Enforcement Training Management (LETM) development continues with weekly Meetings and concurrent recommended modifications and enhancements – The application is undergoing a full re-write to incorporate necessary changes - Through the efforts of review and development, a restructure of the application will provide enhanced functionality and a more intuitive end-user experience – Targeted development will include Instructors/Classes, Active/Inactive Filters and an extensive analysis to ensure the inclusion of existing reporting and functional services – Internal Testing with ILETSB Staff has begun, with MTU Testing to follow - The updated version of the application is expected to complete 2nd/3rd quarter of FY2026

Officer Portal:

Provides Officers with the opportunity to review their own Law Enforcement Records and Requirements – With the integration of the Professional Conduct Database, individuals are able to review and respond to Professional Conduct Reports Electronically – Mandate Expiration notices are sent weekly to Officers to provide advance notice of Mandates that will expire within 60-days - Hard Copy notifications regarding training, certification status and complaints are provided with direct correspondence to the officer's personal mailing address – The procedures to integrate the Certification Verification process are being identified to comply with the recurring 3-year mandate - The Officer Portal now supports more than 25,582 registered accounts, which is approximately 60% of Active Law Enforcement Officers throughout the State of Illinois - Developmental review of the Portal is on-going in conjunction with the PTB-LEDI application.

ILETSB In-House Applications: (Continued)

Legal Hearing System:

To be utilized for tracking and storing the documentation of hearings pertaining to Officer reactivation and decertification – With additional reporting needs identified, development and end-user testing continues – Go-Live and full utilization is slated for early 2026

CIT Therapy Dog Tracking:

System being created to track the certification State of Illinois Therapy Dogs and their handlers - Discovery dialogues are currently underway to identify application requirements

Emergency Event Notification System:

Information Services Staff are working alongside DoIT and Vendor to incorporate an advanced Emergency Notification System to provide Staff, both In-House and Remote, with real-time alerts regarding emergency events, safety concerns and weather related issues - These notifications will be provided via Audible Broadcast, Cellular and eMail Services - The project is currently in-process of acquiring licensing and establishing installation dates – Completion of implementation is expected by 3rd Quarter of FY26

On-Line Testing:

Digital On-Line Testing Services for State of Illinois Law Enforcement Candidates and Officers continues with success – Testing locations have expanded beyond the ILETSB Chicago and Springfield Offices to include our Partner MTUs and Academy Facilities -These additions have provided Candidates with opportunity for convenient On-Line Testing based on proximity to their Training Locations – Approximate 3,500 On-Line Tests have been conducted since the introduction of on-line testing services

Network & Security Services:

Progress continues in the incorporation of Microsoft's Enterprise Configuration Management (ECM) Services and Cisco's Identity Services Engine (ISE) Management Software – Both ECM and ISE have improved technical services and infrastructure reliability, while providing insight into the network's digital traffic and potential vulnerabilities – Splunk, a network data retrieval and reporting application, has been incorporated into Network Services to compliment both the ECM and ISE – Network Firewall and VPN Services have been enhanced in both reliability and a reduction of cyber-based vulnerabilities - Regular Penetration Scanning for potential vulnerabilities of public-facing web services continues for awareness of potential network security vulnerabilities - 100% of ILETSB Staff Systems were upgraded to Windows 11 prior to the October discontinuation of Windows 10 - New VMware clusters have been created on internal and external environments, as well as Distributed Switching, which will allow the transfer of servers between environments with minimal downtime - New Production Servers for Web and Database upgrades have been established in anticipation of migrating to the new Server Environment – The initial stages of implementing Windows Server 2025 has been completed for future Server upgrades – The ILETSB WebSite is undergoing review to comply with ADA Requirements

Data Services:

Information Services Team continues to utilize the Data Storage Expansion - The expansion will provide the space required to house Evidentiary Video Submissions, Legal Hearing Recordings

and Document Archives - Additional Servers are being determined and established to suit the changing operational needs of ILETSB Network Services – The process of creating additional Public-Facing Servers for Web and Database Services continues with focus being on individualized services for management and service availability needs – Active Directory Service restructuring has streamlined data collaboration and availability –Departmental Data Mapping is reviewed regularly to provide the most efficient back-up and restoration capabilities in the event of a catastrophic failure or compromised data – With the implementation of the Data Storage Expansion, future Back-Up Services will provide real-time synchronization and preservation of ILETSB Databanks

Chicago Office:

Several projects are in-process at the ILETSB Chicago Office

- ILETSB continues to work with CMS Property Services on implementation of Security Cameras & Door Badging - The process is currently with CMS Project Management with updated expectation that completion will occur prior to close of FY26
- 11.05.25 - Cabling began for the Camera & Badging System
- Two Testing and Meeting Rooms are under review for additional Audio-Visual Hardware to accommodate the needs for Trainings, Testing & Legal Hearing Presentations - ILETSB is working in conjunction with DoIT Services for fulfillment by end of FY26
- Cellular Extenders are to be installed at the facility to enhance Telecom Services for Staff and Guests – To be completed FY27

IT Help Desk Staffing:

The hiring process is near completion of on-boarding (2) Information Services Help Desk Positions - These positions will supplement the provisions of current Information Services Staff and bolster the fulfillment of technical requests made by ILETSB Staff and its constituents
