I. CALL TO ORDER

The February 27, 2026 Joint Finance & Legislative and Executive Committee meeting was called to order at 12:00 p.m. by Chair Sean Smoot via WebEx.

III. REVIEW OF PENDING LEGISLATION

A. HB 4645: Juvenile Officers (Rep. Hirschauer):

This bill establishes a specialty certification program for juvenile officers, with continuing training requirements and background checks. Director Calloway stated the Board has the authority to move forward and set a curriculum without the bill. It was determined that staff will watch the bill during this session and bring it to the June Board meeting if necessary.

B. HB 4775: Illinois State Police (ISP) Reciprocity Training (Rep. Vella):

This bill exempts retired state troopers from the Board's review and any mandates or training. It also requires that the Board give the trooper an automatic certification and waiver. Keigher noted that the SAFE-T Act requires certification for everyone, and staff continues to have extreme difficulty obtaining training records for these officers from ISP. Calloway stated the standards are set and every officer under the Board must meet them, with no exceptions. Staff are preparing an alternate amendment for this bill.

C. HB 5517: SAFE-T Act Trailer (Rep. Slaughter):

This version of the bill has to do with items involving ILETSB, mainly certification. The main item being when a discretionary decertification happens the officer or their attorney can introduce mitigatory evidence. However, there is no option for the Board to go with a mitigated option. They want the Board to create a new division for certification with a new Deputy Director. Staff are opposing this bill even though some of their suggestions have been added.

Director Brendan Kelly joined the meeting.

D. HB 4249: Trauma Informed Training (Rep. West)

E. HB 4234: Epilepsy Training (Rep. Briel)

F. SB 3306: Epi-Pen Training (Sen. Koehler)

In reference to items D, E, & F, all three of these bills have merit, but they are trying to wedge them all into the triannual mandates which becomes a burden for the chiefs. HB 4249 bill relates more to officer wellness. It will require mandates and environmental safety components for officers. Staff would prefer these three to be included with existing mandates which place the burden on ILETSB. Staff are looking to write amendments for these three.

G. Other Bills of Interest

- *SB 4043 (Sen. Preston):* ILETSB staff drafted this. It is Section 7, which is where all of the mandates are located. This is a much-needed clean-up of the section, Keigher and Janetzke discussed a few of the changes and noted this is mostly a reorganization.
- *SB 2350 (Rep. Johnson):* This was filed last year and has been reinvigorated. It allows camera grant funds to be used for auxiliary officers.
- *HB 5137 (Rep. DeLuca):* This would allow the Comptroller's office to create a police department.
- *SB 3697 (Sen. Feigenholtz):* This is the Hate Crimes Bill which stalled in the House last year, but the Senate has picked it up. Staff are comfortable with this version of the bill.
- *HB 3053 (Rep. Mayfield):* This bill, which may be reactivated from last year, aims to add two seats to the ILETSB Board; two members from a statewide lodge (FOP members).
- *HB 4920 (Rep. West):* This bill creates a universal licensing scheme for Illinois. It would streamline reciprocity with other states, great idea, however, police training is very different than other trainings so staff will be watching this one.
- *SB 3798 (Sen. Peters/Rep. Cassidy):* CESSA Bill. This bill proposes injecting CESSA training into the Board's CIT course.

- *SB 2819 (Sen. Bryant)*: This bill proposes to allow IDOC corrections officers to qualify for IROCC. The Board has no access to monitor or track IDOC officers so staff would have some complications with this.
- *SB 3564 (Sen. Johnson)*: This bill requires the Board to set statewide policy for facial recognition technology in law enforcement. Smoot recommended instead of creating a mandate, maybe create a model policy.

Smoot then gave Director Kelly a chance to weigh in on HB 4775. Director Kelly stated he is waiting for clarification from his people on a few items and will then be in contact with Director Calloway. Kelly did note that this bill is not coming from ISP, it comes from the Illinois Chiefs of Police, and a few chiefs who are former Illinois State Police.

IV. NEXT STEPS

Keigher mentioned the Board meeting is next week. He noted with the SAFE-T Act material settled he and his staff are working on Rules to present at the meeting. Smoot stated he could not attend the upcoming Board meeting but could be available by phone if needed. Director Calloway mentioned staff are meeting with the Illinois Sheriffs' Association next week after the Board meeting.

III. FINANCIAL MATTERS

A. Financial Items ~ Courtney Bott

Bott noted Tab F contains the FY26 expenditures and cash flow analysis through January 31, 2026. She stated the Board has consumed roughly 17% of its appropriated budget for this fiscal year.

The camera grant application period closed on December 31, 2025. The grant team received 183 applications requesting almost \$38M in funding, and the team's review is almost complete. They anticipate signing and filing contracts soon, then staff will begin processing payments in the coming weeks.

The Governor's State of the State and Budget Address presented a \$115.3M budget for ILETSB. This included increased headcount to fulfill the SAFE-T Act, additional funding for law enforcement training, and cashflow shifts due to fluctuations in revenue streams. SB 4235 and HB 5666 reflect this, one is based on estimated spend and the reappropriation in the drafted bill is based off of 12/31 actual expenditures. The bill drafts reflect the total of \$143M.

The Federal Projects Project line item came into question as there are no expenditures

included; Bott explained that this line is included in case the Board ever receives a Federal Grant then staff would have a means to spend it out.

Motion was made by Watson, seconded by Neukirch, and carried by all members present to approve the fiscal report.

B. Personnel Matters & DEIA Report~ Ellen Petty

Petty noted her report can be found under Tab G in the Board book. She stated staff headcount is currently at 57. Since the December Board meeting, two employees have left for positions at other agencies and one employee has retired, five new employees have been onboarded, and one internal transfer has been processed. HR is currently working on eight job postings to backfill positions due to departures and internal movement, as well as two postings for newly created positions. Two positions are currently posted, and an additional posting is expected by the end of the week. Petty noted that staff requested adding twenty positions to the budget; while not all were approved, some positions will be filled, and additional approvals may be granted by GOMB if needed.

C. Legislative and Litigation Update ~ John Keigher & Andrew Janetzke

Keigher noted the Joint Finance & Legislative Committee held a WebEx meeting last Friday to discuss bills. He then introduced Andrew Janetzke as the new General Legal Counsel [and Ethics Officer].

Janetzke stated the litigation cases have remained stable. He noted that two of the cases are on appeal, and all of the cases for Gibson have been dismissed except for the first appeal he filed.

Janetzke then briefly discussed the Board's bills, and the bills staff are watching.

IV. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

A. SAFE-T Act Update ~ John Keigher

Keigher reported the Board has three Administrative Law Judges (ALJ's) on loan from CMS who will be working with the three ALJ's the Board now has on contract. The first of the preliminary hearings are set for March 17th, 18th, and 19th, and the next Certification Review Panel meeting is expected to take place in early April.

Keigher stated staff submitted proposals for the Administrative Rules to both JCAR and the Secretary of State. He noted legal staff did a robust overhaul of the existing rules and integrated them with new requirements. Keigher gave a shout out to David Catlin, Special Projects Policy Advisor, who has a long history of creating rules, and noted the legal team expects the number of parts and sections to double under this project. Staff will present more at the June meeting.

Keigher reported that verification is the final step of the SAFE-T Act process. The initial verification period concluded in January, with 75% of the group having reported by the end of that phase. The process has now moved into the grace period, during which reporting has increased to 82%. Staff will send an additional reminder email to both the officers and their respective agencies that have not yet responded.

Keigher noted staff is watching the Attorney General's Bill: HB 5517 which focuses on discretionary decertification. It incorporates some of the wishes of the unions and other stakeholders. Staff would prefer to let the current plan run its course before any adjustments are made.

Motion was made by Watson, seconded by Neukirch, and carried by all members present to accept the SAFE-T Act Update.

VIII. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Motion was made by Neukirch, seconded by Watson, and carried by all members present to approve the meeting minutes for the Curriculum and School Standards Advisory Committee Meeting from December 10, 2025, the Joint Finance & Legislative Committee and Executive Committee Meeting minutes from December 10, 2025, and the Quarterly Board Meeting minutes from December 11, 2025.

IX. REPORT OF STANDING AND ADVISORY COMMITTEES

- A. Curriculum and School Standards Advisory Committee ~ Ghida Neukirch
Neukirch stated the Committee met yesterday and approved the In-Service training courses submitted through the Mobile Team Units & Executive Institute, and the Lead Homicide Investigators 32-hours Continuing Education Courses submitted from January 1, 2026 through February 20, 2026. The Committee also approved an additional BLE Academy date for the Cook County Sheriff's Office located at the Moraine Valley Community College to be held August 31, 2026 – December 18, 2026. Neukirch shared a few noteworthy facts related to training from the staff reports located in the Board book, she then thanked staff for their detailed reports and encouraged everyone to review the reports.
- B. Finance & Legislative and Executive Committee ~ John Idleburg
Idleburg stated the committee discussed the FY26 expenditures and noted Board staff received almost \$38M in camera grant funding requests. Idleburg reported ILETSB staff count is at 57 with eight job postings in progress. He noted the legislation and litigation report will be given later in this meeting.
- C. Waiver Review Committee ~ John Keigher for Brendan Kelly
Keigher stated the Committee addressed two issues. The first recommendation was to uphold the waiver denial for Anthony Sinnott. The second recommendation was a review and approval for SRO applicant Felecia Rasmussen.

Motion was made by Watson, seconded by Redd, and carried by all members present to approve the Curriculum and School Standards Advisory Committee report, the Joint Finance & Legislative and Executive Committee report, and the Waiver Review Committee report.

X. EXECUTIVE MATTERS

- A. Financial Items ~ Courtney Bott
Bott reported the FY26 expenditures and the cash flow analysis through January 31, 2026 can be found under Tab F in the Board book. The Board has consumed

nearly 17% of its appropriated budget for FY26. She noted the camera grant application period closed December 31, 2025. The grant team received 183 applications requesting almost \$38M in funding, and the team's review is almost complete. They anticipate signing and filing contracts with the Comptroller soon and then processing payments in the coming weeks.

The Governor's State of the State and Budget Address presented a \$115.3M budget for ILETSB. This included increased headcount to fulfill the SAFE-T Act, additional funding for law enforcement training, and cashflow shifts due to fluctuations in revenue streams. SB4235 and HB5666 reflect this, and the reappropriation in the drafted bill is based off of 12/31 actual expenditures. The bill drafts reflect the total of \$143M.

Motion was made by Gomez, seconded by Watson, and carried by all members present to approve the Fiscal Report.

B. Personnel Matters & DEIA Report ~ Ellen Petty

Petty stated her report can be found under Tab G in the Board book. She stated staff headcount is currently at 57. Since the December Board meeting, two employees have left for positions at other agencies and one employee has retired, five new employees have been onboarded, and one internal transfer has been processed. HR is currently working on eight job postings to backfill positions due to departures and internal movement, as well as two postings for newly created positions. Two positions are currently posted, and an additional posting is expected by the end of the week, with five positions currently in progress. Petty then informed the Board members that she will be retiring at the end of March. Idleburg thanked Petty for her service and wished her continued success in her next chapter.

C. Legislative and Litigation Update ~ Andrew Janetzke for John Keigher

Janetzke stated the litigation cases have remained stable. He briefly mentioned the Magnus, DeRosa and Gibson cases and noted all of the Gibson cases have been closed.

Janetzke then briefly discussed the Board's bills, and the bills staff are watching.

D. Division of Professional Standards

1. Notice of Violations ~ Kent Bragg

Deputy Director Cobb introduced Kent Bragg as the new Certification Manager and Rick Bleichner as the new Investigations Manager. Bragg then reported the Board received 160 Notices of Violations since the December Board meeting for a total of 499 notices received for calendar year 2025 compared to 231 for 2024. The Board received 97 notices in January 2026 compared to 19 in January 2025.

2. Waiver Disposition Quarterly Report ~ Kent Bragg

Bragg noted the Waiver reports can be found under Tab H in the Board book, and the reporting period for all reports is November 1, 2025 through January 31, 2026. His division processed a grand total of 484 waiver requests during this reporting period with 455 requests approved and 29 requests denied. The breakdown of the processed Waivers is as follows:

- c. *State & Others: Law Enforcement*
70 waivers approved, 7 denied

Motion was made by Watson, seconded by Redd, with Ryan, Feld, and Hokenson recusing, and carried by all other members present to approve the State & Others Law Enforcement Waiver Disposition Report.

Neukirch requested that Bragg review recent violations to identify any recurring themes observed by staff. She questioned if there should be communication with the public regarding these violations, including providing insight into their nature and any emerging trends to ensure appropriate follow-up. She noted that staff could use these insights to create procedures to better address these violations going forward.

3. **Decertification ~ Pat Hahn**

Hahn presented his report on decertification [found under Tab I in the Board book]. He stated notice was given to all, a chance to respond was given to all, and none responded. XI. PROGRAM PROGRESS REPORTS AND CONCEPTS

A. **Illinois Law Enforcement Executive Institute ~ Heather Hotz**

Hotz stated the Executive Institute (EI) has assisted with the Emergency Medical Response Mandate. To prevent a training bottleneck from happening with the MTU's the EI stepped in and provided support in the form of a dedicated portal to review the recertification cards issued only by the American Heart Association and the American Red Cross. Cards can be uploaded, status can be monitored by the agency and the officer, and approval/denial notifications are sent. Hotz noted that almost 8,000 have already been received.

Hotz reminded everyone of the upcoming Women in Criminal Justice Conference. Registration closed yesterday with 415 registrants, exceeding all previous records.

B. *A Statewide System of In-Service Training (ASSIST) Program ~ Cheryllynn Williams for Paul Petty*

Williams stated Petty's report can be found under Tab K in the Board book. The report contains the second quarter update for FY26 and the FY25 Governor's Report.

C. *CIT, Mental Health Training & Therapy Dog Initiative Update ~ Jennifer Wooldridge*

Wooldridge stated the CIT training initiatives continue to advance successfully, with strong participation in mental health and conflict resolution courses. Development is underway for a newly certified two-day Collaborative Crisis Co-Response course, expected to launch through the MTUs later this spring. Efforts to ensure statewide consistency remain a priority, including an upcoming biennial training retreat in Chicago for instructors, evaluators, and actors to align on best practices and strengthen curriculum standardization. Preparations are also in progress for another CIT Concepts train-the-trainer course, alongside minor updates to student performance objectives.

The CIT K-9 therapy dog program has expanded its impact across Illinois, maintaining a visible and supportive presence in both community events and crisis situations. Teams participated in public engagements such as Brookfield Zoo holiday events and the Chicago Auto Show, while also providing critical support to schools following tragedies. Their continued presence helps foster trust, offer comfort, and strengthen connections between law enforcement and the communities they serve.

Significant progress has also been made in implementing the CIT Crisis Response Therapy Canine certification program. Applications are now available on the Board's website, infrastructure for service requests has been established, and interest from other states is emerging. The first certification sessions are scheduled for April and July in Cook County.

Looking ahead, a CIT Resilience event is scheduled for June 24, 2026 in Schaumburg, focusing on wellness and support for public safety personnel. Additionally, leadership engagement efforts continue through participation in the Lt. Governor's Girls We Lead Initiative, where staff will mentor two grade school students on women's leadership in state government. Overall, CIT programs and the therapy canine initiative continue to demonstrate strong momentum, meaningful community impact, and growing interest both statewide and nationally.

D. *Specialized Programs Update ~ Barbara Wood*

Wood stated her reports can be found under Tab M in the Board book. In addition, she asked the Board to approve the 28 individuals for certification who completed

the Crash Reconstruction Specialist test in February.

E. Basic & Part Time Training Update ~ Ryan Snow

Snow stated his report can be found under Tab N of the Board book. As a recently appointed Board staff member, he introduced himself and provided Board members with a brief overview of his professional background. He also introduced the new Director of SLEA, Mike Zegadlo. Snow reported a 90.8% BLE success rate and a 93.1% BCO success rate for officers seeking certification through the academies. He further noted that he will soon initiate an audit of academy directors, chiefs, sheriffs, instructors, and recruits to gather insights on next steps.

F. Information Technology Update ~ Kelly Ingram

Ingram stated the LETM roll out happened this past weekend, and IT staff is currently in the clean up phase of the rollout. He noted there are some issues, but he stressed there is no data loss. IT staff are implementing InformaCast services, and currently appointing employees who will be sending the messages to staff. This is an emergency notification system to send messages via text, email, phone, and over intercom systems throughout both the Springfield and Chicago buildings. Finally, Ingram introduced the two newest employees to the IT team, Adura Oladapo and Collin Steele.

Motion was made by Watson, seconded by Redd, and carried by all members present to approve the Program Progress Reports.

XII. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

A. SAFE-T Act Update ~ John Keigher

Keigher reported the Board has three Administrative Law Judges (ALJ's) on loan from CMS who will be working with the three ALJ's the Board has on contract. The first of the preliminary hearings are set for March 17th, 18th, and 19th, and the next Certification Review Panel meeting is expected to take place in early April.

Keigher stated the Administrative Rules need an update and staff submitted a robust overhaul of the existing rules to both JCAR and the Secretary of State. Staff will present more at the June meeting.

Keigher reported that verification is the final step of the SAFE-T Act process. The initial verification period concluded in January, with 75% of the group having reported by the end of that phase. The process has now moved into the grace period, during which reporting has increased to 82%. Staff will send an additional reminder email to both the officers and their respective agencies that have not yet responded.

Keigher noted staff is watching the Attorney General's Bill: HB 5517 which focuses on discretionary decertification. Staff would prefer to let the current plan run its course

before any adjustments are made. If more arises out of this staff will email Board members or convene the Committee if necessary.

XIII. NEW BUSINESS

XIV. PUBLIC INPUT

Dvonte Delitz: Delitz requested clarification from the Board regarding the status of his certification. He explained that he was previously a sworn law enforcement officer in Pennsylvania and resigned in good standing to accept a position that brought him back to Illinois. He subsequently accepted employment with the Illinois Gaming Board and began the process of entering the academy, completing ten weeks at the State Police Academy. He stated that he was dismissed from the academy in January 2026 but has not received any written notification outlining the reason for his dismissal or the applicable rule. He further noted that he had been charged with a misdemeanor in 2013, which has since been expunged from his record. Delitz is requesting written clarification regarding the basis for his dismissal, information on whether a waiver process is available, and guidance on how he may proceed moving forward.

XV. ANNOUNCEMENTS

Idleburg announced the next Committee meetings will be held on June 3, 2026, and the next Quarterly Board meeting will be held June 4, 2026 with the location to be determined.

XVI. ADJOURNMENT

Juvenile Officer Refresher and Continuing Education

PURPOSE OF COURSE: This 2-day training program is a practically oriented training course designed for an experienced, certified, Juvenile Police Officer as defined by the Illinois Juvenile Court Act. It addresses the significant and problematic, substantive and procedural juvenile law issues, investigations and custody concerns of the abused, neglected, minor requiring authoritative intervention and delinquent minor. This continuing education course will overview many different aspects of police-juvenile encounters with the emphasis of new ways to communicate with minors. Investigations of social media and computer interactions and crimes. Review the investigation procedures and protocols referencing sex and abuse crimes committed against minors. Review, discuss and update the Illinois Juvenile Court Act in reference to the abused, neglected, minors requiring authoritative intervention and delinquent minor. Review of best practices and case law pertaining to the juvenile delinquent.

COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course has been designed to provide all peace officers, with specific direction to the experienced and certified Illinois Juvenile Police Officer with a review concerning the custody of the juvenile delinquent; review of the updates with Chapter 705; Act 405, Juvenile Court Act. Topics to be addressed include the following:

- Communication skills with minors, including minors identified in a special spectrum.
- Investigations of computer and social media crime involving minors.
- Review the investigation standards, procedures and protocols of sex and physical abuse crimes against a minor.
- Juvenile rights and protections in the juvenile justice system, emphasis on latest interviews and interrogations of delinquent minors
- Revisions of Chapter 705; Act 405. Juvenile Court Act of 1987
- Law Enforcement responsibilities
- Review of the requirements with juvenile delinquents in custody
- Latest trends and dispositions pertaining to the status offender and delinquent minor in the use of ordinance citations, station adjustments and court referrals.

COURSE GOALS: The goals of this course are to provide participants with a detailed study of the Juvenile Court Act, Illinois Chapter 705, including:

- Review with experienced juvenile police officers the common complications experienced by minors, recognizing the signs of such hardships and an overview of proper response techniques within the criminal justice community.
- Develop and enhance officers' ability to recognize different levels of communication among adolescents.

- Provide officers with tools to effectively listen and respond, ways that adolescents communicate, including verbally, non-verbally and through technology.
 - The course will examine the rights of children and when crimes against children are committed.
 - To provide an overview to officers of the elements of child abuse, recognition of signs of abuse, and investigation strategies.
 - Familiarizes officers with the investigative use of electronic communication sources and social media platforms.
 - Participants will explore the processes, tools, and legal considerations involved in digital evidence preservation, consent searches, exigent requests, and working with service providers to obtain critical information for juvenile-related investigations.
 - Discussions will include the revisions in the Juvenile Court Act pertaining to the age and custody requirements of the juvenile delinquent, definitions and restrictions with record retention and sharing, new crime trends involving juveniles.
-
- Reviewing the rights of a juvenile during a law enforcement interview or interrogation. A review of the Illinois' court decisions pertaining to the custody of juvenile delinquents. Procedural and substantive legal issues pertaining to the requirements of conducting interviews and interrogations of juvenile delinquents,
 - Video confessions of juvenile delinquents
 - Rights to counsel requirements for certain offenses and ages
 - Preventing coercion; self-incrimination
 - A comprehensive examination of rights of a juvenile and protections for crimes against children as outlined in the Illinois Juvenile Court Act, Chapter 705, the Illinois Constitution, and Illinois Detention law,
 - A detailed examination of the recent revisions enacted to the Illinois Compiled Statutes Chapter 705
 - A clear understanding of the elements and provisions of the Illinois Juvenile Court Act
 - Minors requiring authoritative intervention
 - Electronic dissemination of indecent depictions
 - New record keeping and sharing requirements
 - Station Adjustments use and best practices
 - Review the definition of the Delinquent Minor
 - New detention requirements of juvenile delinquents
 - Procedural and substantive legal issues pertaining to the requirements of conducting interviews and interrogations of juvenile delinquents,
 - Video confessions of juvenile delinquents
 - Rights to counsel requirements for certain offenses and ages
 - Preventing coercion; self-incrimination
 - A clear understanding of the responsibilities of the police officer and the juvenile officer, to assure the rights of a juvenile are being adhered too and requirements are being followed

- An understanding of recent Court decisions affecting the implementation of the Juvenile Court Act
 - The courts consideration of the “totality of the circumstances”

COURSE PREREQUISITES: This course will be offered to a sworn, certified law enforcement, sheriff's and public safety officers who are required by their jobs to work with abused, neglected, delinquent minors, minors in need of supervision and/or other classes of juvenile offenders. The course will build on the previous learning and personal experiences of the experienced Juvenile Police Officer in order to provide them with a higher level of training and discussion related to the Illinois Juvenile Court Act.

There are two sets of prerequisites for this course, the first affecting the sponsoring agency, the second affecting the student participant:

1. Agency: Only Chiefs, Sheriffs, and Public Safety Directors, or their designated representatives, may enroll student officers. Officers will NOT be allowed to enroll themselves.
2. Student Participants: Only personnel who are currently employed by a unit of local government in a sworn or non-sworn be permitted to attend this program. Full-time personnel from railroad, state or federal agencies not under the jurisdiction of the ILETSB may make application to attend this program.

METHODS OF EVALUATION: Students will be required to demonstrate knowledge of all course materials. Additionally, the instructor will evaluate students' comprehension and retention of course topics based on their participation in practical exercises/scenarios and discussions conducted during the course. Evaluation forms completed by each student will provide feedback to NEMRT on the quality of the course content and the instructor's effectiveness in delivering this content.

METHODS OF INSTRUCTION: This course is conducted using the following methods of instruction:

- In-class review of student handout materials
- In-class lecture
- In-class practical exercises and discussion
- In-class evaluations, both written and verbal, of the participant's performance

The cost for a proposed training program for a minimum of 7 participants and a maximum of 40 participants will be finalized upon request. This cost will include instructor fees that will include instructor lodging, per diem. The costs provided do not include instructor travel mileage reimbursement and officer course materials.

June 2026

Core Concepts:

The Juvenile Court Act of 1987 defines a “juvenile police officer” as a sworn police officer who has “completed the necessary juvenile officers training as prescribed by the Illinois Law Enforcement Training Standards Board.” See 705 ILCS 405/1-3(17) and 705 ILCS 405/5-105(9). For over 30 years, the Board has approved a select number of courses, all exceeding 32 hours in length and containing several core components, to satisfy this requirement upon completion. (See Appendix A).

In the wake of establishing standards and curriculum for School Resource Officers pursuant to PA 101-81, the Board began to reexamine the requirements and delivery methods of the juvenile courses and also began to receive feedback from the Illinois Juvenile Officers Association regarding the increasing need to obtain in-service courses to remain abreast of the evolving laws in this area. Therefore, pursuant to the additional authority of the Illinois Police Training Act giving the Board the general powers to provide “advanced or in-service training for permanent law enforcement officers” and to “establish appropriate mandatory minimum standards relating to....in-service training of permanent law enforcement officers,” we now seek to incorporate in-service requirements into the “course of training” required for Juvenile Officers. 50 ILCS 705/6. These classes will ensure that juvenile officers stay at the forefront of new laws, administrative rules, the school code, and case law involving juvenile victims, witnesses, suspects and parents or guardians.

As a result, juvenile officers will continue to develop their communication skills with juveniles, increase their knowledge on child development, and understand the special needs of those individuals that face unique challenges and disabilities as a juvenile - while continuing to increase their knowledge on the latest changes to Illinois juvenile law, paying close attention to child abuse and neglect. These officers will be the primary resource protecting juveniles and will be instrumental in building the necessary trust and relationships between juveniles and the policing community.

Requirements:

In an effort to identify officers serving in this role, and provide assistance related to the required trainings, agencies employing law enforcement officers specifically as juvenile officers in accordance with the Juvenile Court Act will now be asked to identify and report those officers with ILETSB. A year of transition will be afforded to implement these new requirements for officers who previously completed a Basic Juvenile Officer Certification Course; therefore, reporting can begin on January 1, 2027, and must be completed before January 1, 2028, utilizing the form provided. (See Appendix C).

In an effort to ensure that those Illinois law enforcement officers serving as Juvenile Officers for their agency have met the in-service requirements established by ILETSB, a 4-year certification period will be established after completion of the requisite Basic Juvenile Officer Certification Course. A certificate of completion will be issued notating the start date of the 4-year period. Within this 4-year period, the Juvenile Officer will be required to complete a minimum of 16-hours of juvenile specific coursework in two specific areas (communication and law) before subsequent recertification will be granted. (See Appendix B).

Courses meeting these requirements will be offered in juvenile law, juvenile interview/ interrogation, juvenile case studies (state or federal), juvenile-specific trauma-informed procedures, behavioral threat assessments, cyberbullying, internet/social media safety, bullying prevention, youth mental health, autism, and youth de-escalation, among others. Additionally, most School Resource Officer courses related to juvenile law or officer/youth interaction and generational learning styles will be applicable. A recertification application will be available just prior to end of the period to apply for an additional 4-year period.

Officers who have completed a Basic Juvenile Certification Course that met the requirements identified in Appendix A, prior to January 1, 2024, will be recognized as approved Juvenile Officers as of January 1, 2027, but must complete the 16 hours of reapproval in-service training before January 1, 2028. Officers who completed the Basic Juvenile Certification Course after January 1, 2024, must simply complete the 16 hours of specific in-service training prior to recertification.

Eligibility:

To be eligible to serve as a Juvenile Officer, an individual must be an Illinois certified law enforcement officer and actively employed in a law enforcement position within the state for a minimum of 2 years (from the date of certification) for full-time officers and 3 years for part-time officers before being enrolled in the requisite Basic Juvenile Officer Certification Course. Additionally, an applicant's background will be checked to ensure that it is free of any offenses or misconduct involving juveniles.

An agency's chief administrator must request enrollment of the individual officer into the Basic Juvenile Officer Certification Course and must register the officer as a Juvenile Officer with the Board. See Appendix C.

Basic Juvenile Certification Course Completion:

An agency seeking to appoint an individual as a Juvenile Officer must enroll that individual in the Basic Juvenile Officer Certification Course, which must be completed in consecutive days and attended in-person or through the Board-approved online format. While 10% of the class may be missed due to an excused absence, all attendees must complete the conclusionary exam and evaluation offered within the course. The material in the following Appendix A is intended to be the minimum standard for any facilitator or instructor that seeks to conduct a Board approved course.

Re-Certification Requirements:

A Juvenile Officer certification issued by the Board shall be valid for 4 years from the date of issuance. Six months prior to expiration, an agency may seek to renew an officer's Juvenile Officer approval by completing a Juvenile Officer re-certification application. See Appendix D. This form must ensure that the Juvenile Officer has completed a minimum of **16 hours** in the core areas of the Juvenile Officer program:

- *Juvenile Communication and Development*
- *Illinois Specific Juvenile Law Highlighting Child Abuse/Neglect and Protections*

In order to obtain recertification, a Juvenile Officer must complete a minimum of **8 hours** in **both** of the two

core areas. See Appendix B. These courses must be completed within the 4-year approval period in order to be eligible for recertification. Once the application has been completed, it should be sent to PTB.JO@Illinois.gov for processing. If approved, a new, updated certificate will be emailed back to the individual's chief administrator/Sheriff.

Review & Revision

In accordance with Board practices, the Board reserves the right to periodically review, revise and update this policy and the corresponding course curriculum as needed.

Appendix A

This Basic Juvenile Officer Certification Course is designed for recently assigned juvenile officers and provides them with the basic skills and knowledge required to fulfill their roles and responsibilities. In addition, officers will discuss current trends, issues, and challenges they will meet in the juvenile system.

The FY26 Law Enforcement Camera Grant produced 137 awards totaling roughly \$20 million. This is the largest camera grant total since program inception in 2018.

The purpose of this program is to provide grants to Illinois police agencies of municipalities, counties, park districts, public universities, and all units of Illinois local governmental for the purchase or lease of in-car video cameras for use in law enforcement vehicles; officer-worn body cameras for law enforcement officers and data storage related to officer-worn cameras; and training for law enforcement officers in the operation of the cameras. (20 Ill. Adm. Code 1705.100-199).

Live grantee training and Q&A proved to be successful based on the amount awarded this fiscal year. We plan to continue this option in the future.

REPORT ON PERSONNEL MATTERS

June 4th, 2026

Quarterly Board Meeting

- 78 positions have been filled as of 5/1/26:
 - 15 internal promotions.
 - 5 internal transfers.
 - 28 new hires to State of Illinois employment.
 - 23 promotions from other agencies.
 - 1 reinstatement from another agency.
 - 7 transfers from other agencies.
- 8 employees have transferred out to other agencies.
- 10 employees have retired.
- 1 employee resigned to take a different job.
- 3 employees have been discharged.
- 1 employee was returned to work due to an arbitration award & then retired.
- 1 retiree is back on a PSC and will work on special projects
- 2 employees are on LOA
- 7 positions are currently in various stages of the hiring process.
- 5 (or more) additional jobs will need to be posted to backfill before the end of FY26, due to internal promotions and movements.
- 11 additional job descriptions remain to be developed, approved, posted, and filled through the end of FY27. (8 of those are only to be posted with GOMB approval)
- The agency headcount included in the approved FY26 budget allows for 66 employees.
- *Headcount we requested was 86 (+20) for FY27. We were only approved for a headcount of 74. However, once we reach 74, we can aim for 78 to include all 8 of the new Field Rep positions. GOMB has indicated which positions are approved and which ones they will discuss with us if we are still able to add more positions once we reach the 74, and then the 78 figures they've laid out for us. We can hire 4 Field Reps effective 1/1/27, and 4 more effective 4/1/27. We cannot hire any from 7/1/26 through December 2026 -- except for the backfill we have planned for FY26. (See table on page 3)*

PERSONNEL UPDATES SINCE LAST QUARTERLY REPORT

- Headcount as of May 1st is 57, the same as our March report due to one new hire, one internal promotion, and one retirement within that period.
- There has been one job offer made and accepted with an onboarding date of 5/18/2026. We anticipate another offer will be made and accepted with an anticipated 06/01/2026 start date (pending employee verification).

DETAILED STATUS OF HIRING SEQUENCES CURRENTLY IN PROGRESS

As of May 1st:

1. Certification Specialist: Staff will be onboarding one of the top-ranked candidates for this position on May 18, 2026. The second candidate's employee verification is still in process. Once that is received, staff will be making a second offer based on those results.
2. Assistant General Legal Counsel: This job closed on April 28, 2026, and has been taken down. CMS review of minimum qualifications is now underway.
3. Curriculum and Testing Counsel: Preparing for SME review.
4. Internal Auditor & Reporting Manager: Interviews are scheduled for May 12-13, 2026.
5. Benefits & Retirement Representative: Interview pre-planning stage.
6. Vehicle Coordinator and Property Control Manager – Executive II: Conducting employee verification to confirm contractual rights.
7. GATA/GATU Specialist – Executive I: Interview pre-planning in progress. Interviews are tentatively scheduled for May 18th & 19th.

Critical Positions to Fill

- Police Training Specialist Advanced - Sangamon County: Staff have recently spoken to CMS, and it was mentioned that this position's implementation in Employee Central has been completed. Staff are waiting for approval to move forward.

If all the above positions are filled timely, it will bring our FY26 headcount to 66.

STATUS OF REMAINING FY26 HIRING SEQUENCES PLANNED

1. Director's Confidential Assistant – This position has been vacant since 8/16/25 due to the resignation of the incumbent to accept another non-state position. This is an appointed position. As soon as the Director has identified a suitable candidate, this appointment will be made. (*no change from previous Board meeting*)
2. Statewide Officer Wellness Coordinator – It was decided that this position would work better for this agency as a PSC (Personal Service Contract). This was recently approved by CMS compliance, and the contract has been signed and is in effect.

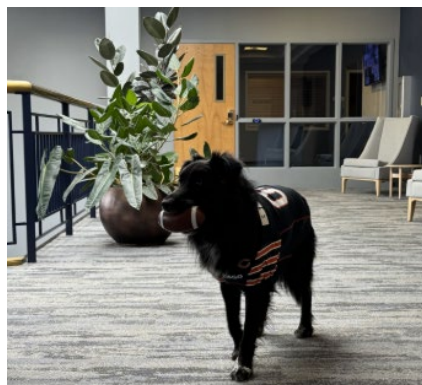

1. Executive Summit – Leader Armor – Edward Pallas; April 21, 2026; East Moline

Law enforcement officers are responsible for observing, reporting, and, often, interpreting elements discovered on scene. The manner in which these incidents are handled can be a pivotal moment in any death investigation case. CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES – CONFERENCES

Women in Criminal Justice Conference – April 9+10 – East Peoria, IL

The 17th annual Women in Criminal Justice Conference, held April 9–10 in East Peoria, marked a milestone year for this premier event. Attendance increased by 15% over the previous year, establishing a new record and reflecting the continued growth and impact of the conference within the criminal justice community.

The conference opened with a powerful and memorable ceremony, highlighted by the Cook County Sheriff’s Office Honor Guard and an exceptional vocal performance that set a respectful and inspiring tone. Dana Wright, a participant from the inaugural conference, delivered heartfelt opening remarks, underscoring her long-standing commitment and support throughout the conference’s history.

The first day featured an engaging keynote presentation by Becky Burleigh, who spoke on “*What Drives Winning*,” offering valuable insights into leadership, motivation, and high-performance culture. The afternoon provided a diverse array of breakout sessions, allowing attendees to tailor their experience across a wide spectrum of topics. These sessions included leadership development, officer wellness, evidence-based practices, financial wellness, investigative strategies, and homicide-centered approaches, among others.

Day two continued the strong momentum with three featured general sessions from highly regarded speakers. Attendees heard from crowd favorite Heather Hansen, Jamie Sypniewicz of the Las Vegas Bomb Squad, and Janeé Harteau, retired Minneapolis Police Chief, each bringing unique perspectives and expertise to the conference.

In total, 2,325 mandate training hours were awarded, further demonstrating the conference’s value as both a professional development and certification opportunity.

Preceding the conference, a special training session was offered featuring Julie Wernyak, recently inducted into the 2026 National Law Enforcement Officer Hall of Fame as Trainer of the Year. Her presentation on de-escalation tactics provided attendees with practical, impactful tools ahead of the main event.

The conference also celebrated excellence within the profession during the Women in Criminal Justice Banquet. This year’s honorees included:

- **Lt. Audrey Hoftender (Illinois Department of Natural Resources)** – 2026 Women in Law Enforcement Leadership Award (sponsored by Susan “Susie” Nichols)
- **Molly Muennich (Fairview Heights Police Department)** – 2026 Women in Criminal Justice Female Officer of the Year
- **Nicole Collum (Village of River Forest Police Department)** – 2026 Women in Criminal Justice Civilian of the Year

The continued growth, strong participation, and high-quality programming of this year’s conference reinforce its importance as a leading professional development event. Planning is

already well underway for the 2027 Women in Criminal Justice Conference, with a continued commitment to delivering impactful, relevant, and empowering experiences for all attendees.



Strategic Command – May 5 +6, 2026 – Bloomington, IL

This Strategic Command training marked the inaugural offering in our newly developed training series, designed specifically to address the evolving needs of today’s law enforcement leaders. This first rendition was intentionally tailored for seasoned Chiefs and Sheriffs, recognizing their depth of experience and the unique challenges they face at the executive level.

The primary focus of this initial session centered on leadership, and was structured to move beyond foundational concepts, instead emphasizing advanced leadership strategies, real-world application, and peer-driven insights. This first session set the tone for a high-level, executive-focused learning experience that supports and challenges even the most experienced law enforcement leaders.

Thirty-eight Chiefs and Sheriffs were invited to attend, and included speakers such as:

- Ken Clary – Chief Bellevue, Nebraska. Expert on intentional inclusiveness in departments and retaining talent through a culture of care.
- Dean Crisp – 38 year law enforcement veteran and leadership expert.
- Paul Butler – 27 year law enforcement veteran and leadership and motivation expert.
- Steven Johnson – Chief of Fairview Heights and national leadership speaker.

OLN Historical Training Activity Summary

Five Year Comparison

Over the past five years, annual training volume has averaged 228,400 hours, with a peak of 275,000 hours. Following that peak, training levels have stabilized in the 220,000–240,000 hour range, indicating a maturing and sustainable program level. In addition, the Online Learning Network (OLN) has delivered a **cumulative 1.16 million training hours during this timeframe**, significantly expanding training reach, efficiency, and accessibility for departments across Illinois while reducing travel, overtime, and backfill costs. Overall, training volume has grown **30% over five years**, demonstrating continued long-term expansion while maintaining consistent delivery levels.

Ten Year Comparison

Over the past ten years, training delivery has expanded significantly in both scale and impact. A decade ago, the program trained approximately 1,500 officers and delivered 9,642.5 training hours annually. In the current fiscal year, that has grown to over 100,000 officers trained and to over 249,000 training hours delivered—representing nearly a 6,557.70% increase in participation and more than a 2,482.32% increase in training hours when comparing ten years ago to today.

When compared to traditional university systems, where enrollment and instructional growth typically occur gradually, the OLN program's multi-thousand percent increase represents an extraordinary rate of adoption. This positions OLN not simply as a training platform, but as a highly scalable, modern learning infrastructure that has expanded access at a pace rarely seen in formal education environments.

OLN Current and Anticipated Future Activity Summary

Executive Summary: OLN Strategic Plan (2026–2027)

The Illinois Law Enforcement Training & Standards Board's Online Learning Network (OLN) is undergoing a comprehensive modernization to enhance training effectiveness, accessibility, and accountability statewide. This strategic effort focuses on integrating advanced technology, expanding curriculum offerings, and applying evidence-based instructional design to better serve law enforcement personnel and training officers.

A key priority is the rollout of an updated OLN interface that improves usability, navigation, and overall user experience. These enhancements are designed to streamline course access, and improve completion tracking. Complementing these updates is the development of expanded reporting tools, giving training officers real-time visibility into compliance, course progress, and training needs, ultimately strengthening oversight and accountability.

Significant progress has already been achieved in curriculum development. In January 2026, OLN launched the **Autism Informed Response** course, developed by a state subject matter expert and refined by a contracted PhD specializing in trauma-informed care and curriculum design. Additionally, **six existing courses were updated this quarter** to reflect the latest research, data, and best practices. Looking ahead, a **new Human Trafficking course will be deployed in June 2026**, continuing OLN's commitment to addressing critical and emerging issues in law enforcement.

To improve engagement and knowledge retention, OLN is expanding **interactive learning elements**, including scenario-based training, decision-making exercises, and embedded self-assessments across all courses. These enhancements align training with real-world situations officers encounter, reinforcing practical application of knowledge.

Together, these initiatives position OLN as a modern, user-centered training platform that supports officer readiness, enhances training officer capabilities, and ensures alignment with evolving standards. This strategic direction reinforces Illinois' leadership in providing innovative, high-quality law enforcement training.

Social Media

The ILETSB Executive Institute continues to maintain a social media presence using LinkedIn, Twitter, Facebook, and a website that promotes the mission, vision, and activities of the organization. The various social media platforms offer an overview of upcoming events and training courses, access to publications, the Online Learning Network, the Center for Homeland Security Leadership, and the Leadership Fellow Program.

BOARD MEETING

Federal Homeland Security Grant Illinois Homeland Security Advisory Council

Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board Executive Institute

This report provides an update of the Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board Federal Homeland Security Grant funded through the Illinois Homeland Security Advisory Council (HSAC).

TRAINING AND FUNDING

ILETSB has been a voting member of the Illinois Homeland Security Advisory Council and recipient of homeland security funds since 2002. ILETSB has four active awards, Federal Fiscal Years 2021, 2022, 2023, and 2024; years 2021, 2022, and 2023 the award is \$391,000. For FFY 2024 the award is in the amount of \$136,000. The decrease is the result of a 10 percent reduction to the State of Illinois Homeland Security Grant Program. This 10 percent reduction impacted all stakeholders receiving homeland security funds in Illinois. ILETSB is currently in Federal Fiscal Year 2022 with the performance period ending June 30, 2026.

ILLINOIS HOMELAND SECURITY ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The HSAC did not meet during this quarter.

The Council of Chairs did not meet during this quarter.

Due to the Department of Homeland Security shut down, HSAC and their subsequent committees have not met, nor will they meet until the shutdown has been resolved.

Next full quarterly meeting of the HSAC will be TBD at IEMA.

LAW ENFORCEMENT MUTUAL AID COMMITTEE

LEMAL did not meet during this quarter.

CENTER FOR HOMELAND SECURITY LEADERSHIP

Program Director – Derek Carle

Derek Carle continues to serve on the Illinois Homeland Security Advisory Council (IHSAC) and serves on three sub-committees of the IHSAC: Law Enforcement Mutual Aid Committee, Cyber Security Committee and, Prevention Committee.

Derek serves on three national committees pertaining to law enforcement and incident management. Derek is a member of a law enforcement committee to address incident command/NIMS to law enforcement executives, command staff and officers. Derek is also on the Incident Commander and Intelligence/Investigations committees.

Derek is also a credentialed Type 2 Incident Commander for the State of Illinois.

Planning Workshops

During this quarter the Mobile Training Units held 16 workshops for 277 officers totaling 3,933 hours of training. UASI held 0 workshops. The workshops were paid out of the FFY2022 and FFY 2023 HSGP.

The ILETSB-Executive Institute using Homeland Security funds hosted an Advanced SWAT training at T1G in West Memphis, Arkansas, March 16 -20. 32 participants from SWAT teams across Illinois completed this very dynamic training.

I am pleased to announce a second Advanced SWAT course will be held June 8-12 at T1G.

This training will be addressing gaps in Illinois that will bring the basic SWAT officer to a level that will help them in a response for a “lone wolf” assailant to multiple assailants in a complex-coordinated attack, crowded spaces and soft targets.

I am pleased to announce a Shoot House Instructor course September 14 – 18 will be held at T1G in West Memphis, Arkansas. 32 participants will be attending this course with approximately 20 officers on a waiting list.

Several police departments in Illinois have built or are building shoot houses within their jurisdictions. This training will address gaps in certified instructors in order to teach tactics and safe procedures while using the shoot house.

Illinois Active Threat Master Instructor Course

The Fall 2026 IATMI course flyer has been pushed out across the state.

Dates for the fall 2026 IATMI course:

Week 1: August 3-7 at Gurnee PD, Marengo, and Lake Villa

Week 2: August 31- September 4 at Lake Villa, and Elgin

Week 3: September 28 – October 2 at Muscatatuck Training Center in Muscatatuck, Indiana

Week 4: November 9 – 13 at T1G in West Memphis, Arkansas

The Illinois Active Threat Master Instructor Certification Program builds upon the ITOA's (Illinois Tactical Officers Association) TPO (Tactical Patrol Officer) program by offering an advanced certification for current instructors throughout the state.

The 4-week program will certify instructors to teach: Use of Force, Safety Officer/Scenario Based Instruction, High Risk Patrol Tactics, Active Threat/Rapid Deployment, Solo Officer Response, Rescue Task Force, and Urban Tactic/MACTAC (Multiple Assault Counter Terrorist Action Capabilities).

Homeland Security Workshop Catalog

With guidance from Mobile Team Unit Coordinators, staff continues to review and revise the workshop catalog. Coordinators are encouraged to submit new workshops for consideration.

Based on the desire of the Illinois Homeland Security Director and the IHSAC, the homeland security grant guidance and catalog will be going through a small revision. The core courses for the catalog will consist of the Active Threat Master course, Active Threat End-User courses, Community Behavioral Threat Assessment (different from school based Behavioral Threat Assessment), Digital Threat Assessment, Cyber Security, Domestic Violent Extremism, Soft Targets/Crowded Spaces and a few of the popular courses that address the Vision 2028 Homeland Security Strategy.

Illinois School and Campus Safety Program

The Illinois School and Campus Safety Program provides awareness and preparedness training to enhance organizational capacity to plan for, respond to, and recover from an emergency or disaster. The Program also runs the Illinois School and Campus Safety Resource Center website.

Presentations and Work Groups

Derek Carle, the Program Director for the Illinois School and Campus Safety Program, serves on the Law Enforcement Mutual Aid Subcommittee, the Prevention subcommittee, and the Cybersecurity Subcommittee of the HSAC. Derek also attended the Association of Threat Assessment Professionals Winter Conference and presented at an ERBS school safety day in Algonquin.

National Domestic Preparedness Consortium (NDPC)

The Illinois School and Campus Safety Program works in collaboration with NDPC members, including the Energetic Materials Research and Testing Center at New Mexico Tech, to bring a variety of courses to Illinois, including classes on Understanding and Planning for School Bombing Incidents and Surviving Bombing Incidents for Educators. The Program is working on the schedule for 2026 and plans on scheduling sessions of both classes.

Behavioral Threat Assessment and Online Threat Assessment

The Illinois School and Campus Safety Program is working to deliver training regarding the threat assessment & management process and online threat assessment.

The Program continues to work with David Okada, past President of the Association of Threat Assessment Professionals, on sessions of the K-12 class Threat Assessment Team Training (TATT).

The Program continues to work with Dr. Gene Deisinger and Jeffrey Cugno on both the K-12 class Behavioral Threat Assessment and Management in a School Setting (BTAM) and the higher ed class Campus Threat Assessment and Management (CTAM).

Furthermore, the Program continues to work with Safer Schools Together on sessions of Digital Threat Assessment® (DTA), Advanced Digital Threat Assessment® (ADTA), and Current Online Behavioral Trends and Updates (COBT), as well as with Rich Wistocki on sessions of Preventing Targeted Violence Through Leakage and Cyber Investigations (PTVTLCI).

The Program held sessions of COBT on January 22nd, February 27th, and March 25th; sessions of DTA on Feb. 17th & March 9th; a session of TATT on March 5-6th; a session of CTAM on March 23-24th; and a session of BTAM on March 25-26th.

Additionally, the Program has sessions of CTAM scheduled for April 20-21st, May 12-13th, May 18-19th, and June 10-11th; a session of PTVTLCI on April 27-28th; a session of TATT on May 7-8th; a session of BTAM on June 8-9th; and is in the process of scheduling additional sessions of DTA, ADTA, TATT, BTAM, CTAM, and PTVTLCI. The Program is also hosting 7 more sessions of the monthly 2-hr COBT classes, which are scheduled for April 23rd, May 27th, June 25th, Sept. 24th, Oct. 22nd, Nov. 19th, and Dec. 17th.

Cybersecurity and Cyber Safety

The Illinois School and Campus Safety Program is working with Safer Schools Together on sessions of the Cyberbullying, Sextortion, and the Pathway to Radicalization class. The Program held sessions of the class on Jan. 28th and March 2nd, 2026.

Additionally, the Program held a session of Cybersecurity in Education: Risk Assessment, Mitigation, and Management with Safer Schools Together on March 31st, 2026.

Site Safety Security Assessment

The Illinois School and Campus Safety Program is working to deliver sessions of the Site Safety Security Assessment training throughout Illinois. The Program is working on the schedule and plans to hold around 8 sessions of the training in 2026.

Crisis Communications

The Illinois School and Campus Safety Program is working with Deputy Chief Chris Covelli on sessions of Effective Communication Principles Before, During, and After Critical Incidents. The Program plans to hold around 8 sessions of the training in 2026. One session was held on March 13th and the next session is scheduled for June 5th.

Crisis Response and Reunification

The Illinois School and Campus Safety Program is working with the “I Love U Guys” Foundation to schedule sessions of the 2-Day SRM-REx training, which includes a full-day SRP/SRM

(Standard Response Protocol and Standard Reunification Method) Train the Trainer and a full day of reunification exercises. The Program has sessions scheduled for April 29-30 and June 3-4, and is the process of scheduling 3 more sessions.

The Program is also working on scheduling Critical Incident Response and Management classes.

Trauma-Informed Practice and Interpersonal Violence

The Illinois School and Campus Safety Program continues to work with Michelle Denault to hold sessions of her class “It IS Your Business”: Grooming and Sexual Assault Awareness for K-12 Schools and Institutions of Higher Education, including a session scheduled for April 2, 2026.

The Program is working with Safer Schools Together on sessions of their Trauma-Informed Safe and Caring School Communities class. The Program held the first session on Feb. 10th and a second session is being held April 7th, 2026.

Website

The Illinois School and Campus Safety Program continues to promote and update the Illinois School and Campus Safety Resource Center website. The website features a comprehensive resource compendium of school safety topics, has a multimedia platform that features public service video work, features many of our collaborative state and federal partners, and provides information about the Illinois School and Campus Safety Program. We are continuing to seek input from both K-12 and higher education institutions and associations to drive the content of the website. Staff is currently working on adding additional resources and topic areas to the website, as well as testing and updating links.

Weekly Update Emails

The Illinois School and Campus Safety Program continues to promote school safety topics and spread awareness through our Weekly Update emails, which go out weekly to over 23,000 individuals in the School and Campus Safety directories. The Weekly Update emails feature important school safety topics, share breaking news/resources, promote upcoming classes, and provide links to the Illinois School and Campus Safety Resource Center website. Past Weekly Update emails are added to the Resource Center website to make their content accessible to individuals who do not receive them via email.

K-12 School Directory and Institution of Higher Education Directory

Staff continue to update the K-12 public and private school directory and the statewide institution of higher education directory. Presently the directory has over 23,000 contacts. For January through March, staff worked on updating the K-12 directories for ROE 13, ROE 16, ROE 20, ROE 26, ROE 28, ROE 33, and ROE 56.

The Executive Institute A.S.S.I.S.T. Program (A Statewide System of In-Service Training) was started at the end of July 2023. This program consists of three major sections: State Law Enforcement Agencies (Course Certification, Instructor Approval, and class recognition), ILETSB K9 Certification and the ILETSB IROCC (Illinois Retired Officer's Concealed Carry) Program, along with several entities that do not fall within these sections directly. The EI - A.S.S.I.S.T. Program also works directly with the rest of the Executive Institute and ILETSB staff with assistance in conferences and training, along with the administration of the IDOT Grant.

Since the inception of the EI – A.S.S.I.S.T. Program, several State Law Enforcement agencies have used our program to get their courses ILETSB certified, along with getting their instructors approved to provide the instruction. This is helping agencies to fulfill mandate requirements per the Illinois Safe-T Act.

Another meeting was held on 04/28/26 by EI-A.S.S.I.S.T. with several State Law Enforcement Agency Training Coordinators and other personnel at the ILETSB building. Present at the prior meetings or via Webex were several agency representatives that showed up such as: ILETSB, Illinois Attorney General's Office, Illinois Secretary of State Police, Illinois State Police, Illinois Department of Revenue, Illinois Department of Natural Resources, Illinois Gaming Board, Illinois Commerce Commission Police, Illinois Liquor Control Commission, along with Heather Hotz from Executive Institute. The Agencies' Contact's information was shared, so they have a direct contact on each agency, along with agencies sharing trainings that they conduct in-house, which they will open up for other State Law Enforcement Agencies to attend when available. The Agencies understand the importance of the trainings, the Safety Act, along with the required mandates and they strive to train beyond the minimum.

The VirTra System located at the ILETSB Building is being utilized by departments with more looking to start. We have added even more ILETSB certified courses for the system, to give more opportunities to get training and mandates needed. More courses are being reviewed to add as well.

The K9 Certification/Re-certification team, which includes ILETSB Legal Counsel, has been working on ways of updating the program. This is to help ensure accurate information on forms and keep the certification process up to date. This program has scheduling in several locations around the state with dates scheduled throughout the year to assist the Department's K9 handlers and the K9 assessors. We have gone back to using a fiscal year calendar for record keeping. For updates on the 4th quarter of fiscal year 2026 K9 Program statistics, see the included report.

The IROCC Program, which consists of nearly 10,000 applicants yearly.

QUARTERLY REPORT FOR THE JUNE 2026 BOARD MEETING: ASSIST PROGRAM 3rd Quarter Report (Jan-Mar)

This report provides an update on the administration of the ASSIST Program including: the 3rd Quarter Report for FY26 & the FY27 MTU request for funding including Specialized Training requests in the areas of LHI, SRO, & CIT. Presented below are some of the ASSIST administrative matters to include Training & Fiscal Reports. MTU Directors and their staff cooperated in a technology upgrade to the LETM portal system along with ILETSSB's IT staff. This upgrade occurred near the end of the 3rd Quarter which is ongoing. This system upgrade has limited our ability to draw down certain data which has been reported in the past and will be left out of this report.

Attachment I consists of the ASSIST program training activity report results through the third quarter of Fiscal Year 2026 to include all 13 MTU's and In-service training through Executive Institute, State ASSIST, and the Department of Justice-COPS Portal. This chart provides information from each Mobile Team Unit including training numbers, fiscal numbers, and cost analysis for all MTU's. In-service conducted 4,239 classes consisting of over 28,284 hours which is an increase of over 600 classes and 6,000 hours of training. In all, 97,103 officers were trained in over 357,460 man-hours of training. The Third-Quarter numbers more than likely reflect the first verification period whereas officers conducted training within the quarter to assure compliance in the verification process causing a sharp rise in hours and class demand. This report reflects a \$10.91 per hour of training, \$40.15 per officer trained, and \$137.85 for each instructional hour. These three primary costs that are analyzed have stayed 15% or better below the expected cost throughout FY26 and rose during the third-quarter at a rate of less than 1%.

Attachment II provides a financial overview of the total budgets operationally for the MTU's including expected Specialized Training requests along with the MTU's match. To date, the Board has approved release of ALL quarterly payments to the Mobile Team Units including payments to CPD for their In-Service Training needs via MTU 16.

Attachment III represents the current listing of MTU directors and locations of MTU offices and training sites. (Addition to the map includes the State ASSIST Division located within ILETSSB office in Springfield that represents all state agencies for In-House Training Applications, Instructors, and Certification through the Executive Institute)

Attachment IV represents the current listing of MTU geographical locations and represented agencies and officers being trained and listed within each MTU area. With the LETM update, this map's numbers are being updated to confirm current numbers for calendar year 2026.

Attachment V represents ALL In-Service Courses presented for Approval during the 3rd Quarter and up to May 5th of FY26. MTU's currently have a total of 2,560 Certified Courses which include conferences, summits, and expo training as well as all online based training offered through COPS and Executive Institute. During the migration of all information, over 3,000 courses migrated without approved status so as to allow MTU's and departments to view common courses that meet the standards in both hours and training demanded by departments and MTU's. One of the primary issues ILETSB & MTU's were faced with during the implementation of the SAFE-T Act was the individualization of like and similar courses. The concept is to view courses within a catalog of choices for trainers and review previously approved and certified courses that meet the needs of trainers without adopting the same courses multiple times.

It is the goal of the Training Division to provide a catalog of courses with particular interest in the High Liability areas so as to standardize training in areas of Use of Force Trainings, High Risk Traffic Stop Trainings, and Active Shooter/Active Response Trainings, to name a few.

Attachment VI represents each MTU's request for funding for FY27. The Board has had a number of meetings with representatives from each individual Mobile Training Unit and discussed in detail each of the requests for funding with emphasis on the high demand of Use of Force training hours including both: In-Service through MTU's and In-Service through In-House training. During these meetings, MTU Coordinators share their needs and their concerns regarding demands by their membership agencies and their proactive concerns with regards to ensuring they are able to financially meet the demands of the increased training needs as spawned by the SAFE-T Act. It is our hope that we are able to fully fund the FY27 requests as we move into the first year of our second wave of verification and compliance as generated by the SAFE-T Act. MTU's have requested a total of **\$12,681,333.04** in ASSIST Funding from the State of Illinois which will be paid in quarterly payments throughout the year and is based upon your approval of paying 50% of the total budget request with the balance of funding being provided by MTU membership agencies. Additionally, MTU's have requested additional funding for Specialized Training to include: School Resource Officer Trainings & Lead Homicide Trainings totaling **\$2,348,565.00** & C.I.T. funding in the amount of **\$1,710,100.00** Additionally, under 50 ILCS 705/1, MTU's have requested funds totaling \$3,780,000.00 to 'aid in the establishment of adequate training facilities', which has not been done in years past. These monies combined bring FY27 ASSIST Training Program request to **\$20,519,998.04**.

Closure

The Board has been extremely pleased with the MTU's over the course of the last four years regarding the implementation of the SAFE-T Act. As the Gatekeepers, our MTU leadership and staff have managed far more in the past four years than could be expected. MTU's have enabled law enforcement agencies and officers throughout the state to manage their training, meet their requirements as set in the SAFE-T Act, and placed our ability to manage compliance and verification in the optimal position as we move towards the completion of the first four-year period of the SAFE-T Act and a 98.1% compliance for officers verifying in the first cycle.

They continue to develop and meet the demands of their memberships and our law enforcement community. These 3rd quarter numbers will clearly display the hard work and dedication each MTU has for their memberships which has established new highs in officer turnout and hours trained. Unique in the field of In-Service Police Training is a pyramid learning style with so many mandates required within our profession. Each MTU is both individually defined and managed based upon the need of their membership and the make-up of their Advisory Boards. We have seen great strides in partnerships within the MTU arena as well as a growing involvement from local law enforcement with regards to the role each MTU's Advisory Board must play in the MTU's development.

The ILETSB Training Division continues to build upon the ASSIST Program and has set its short-term goals on the establishment of training policy & procedure aimed at standardizing curriculum and adopting best practices and standards utilized and proven to be effective within our profession. Additionally, the ASSIST Program is proactively approaching the development of our instructors in a three-tier process to identify each instructor throughout the state and proactively providing a developmental program that allows each instructor to reach a master level status within the training sphere. It is the training department's belief that better training will be spawned by even better instructors.

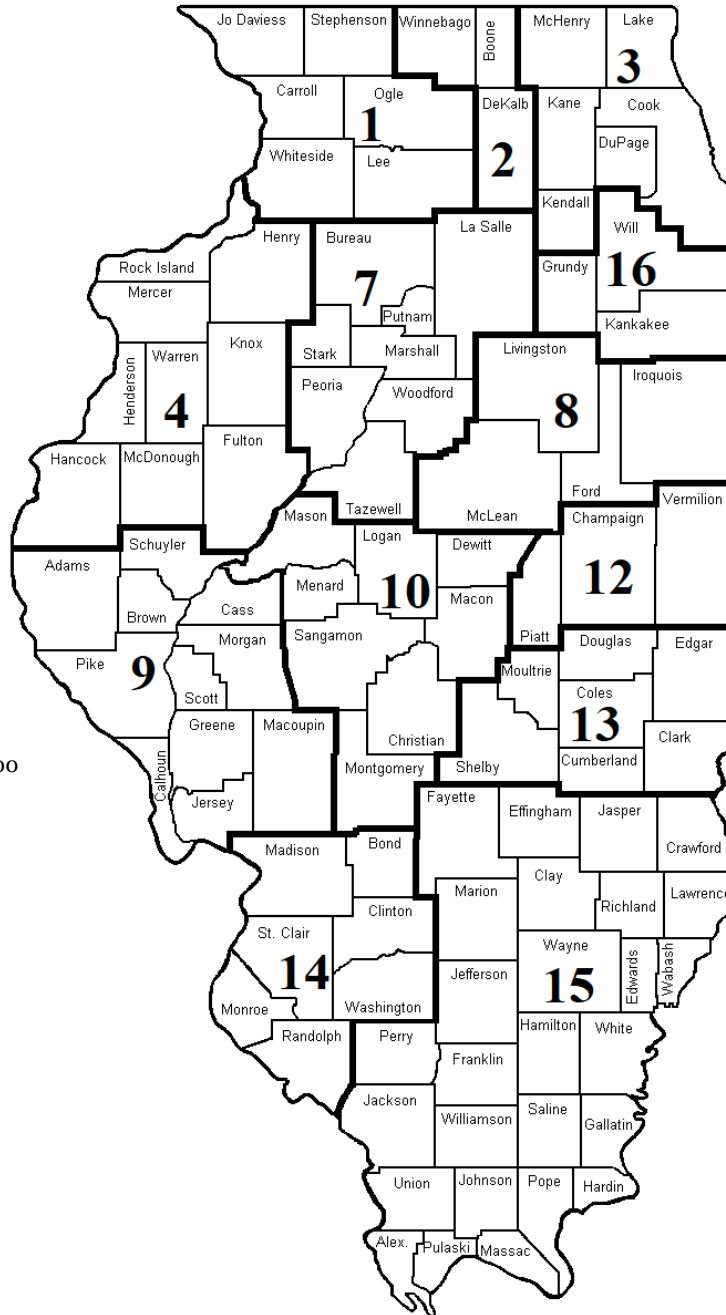

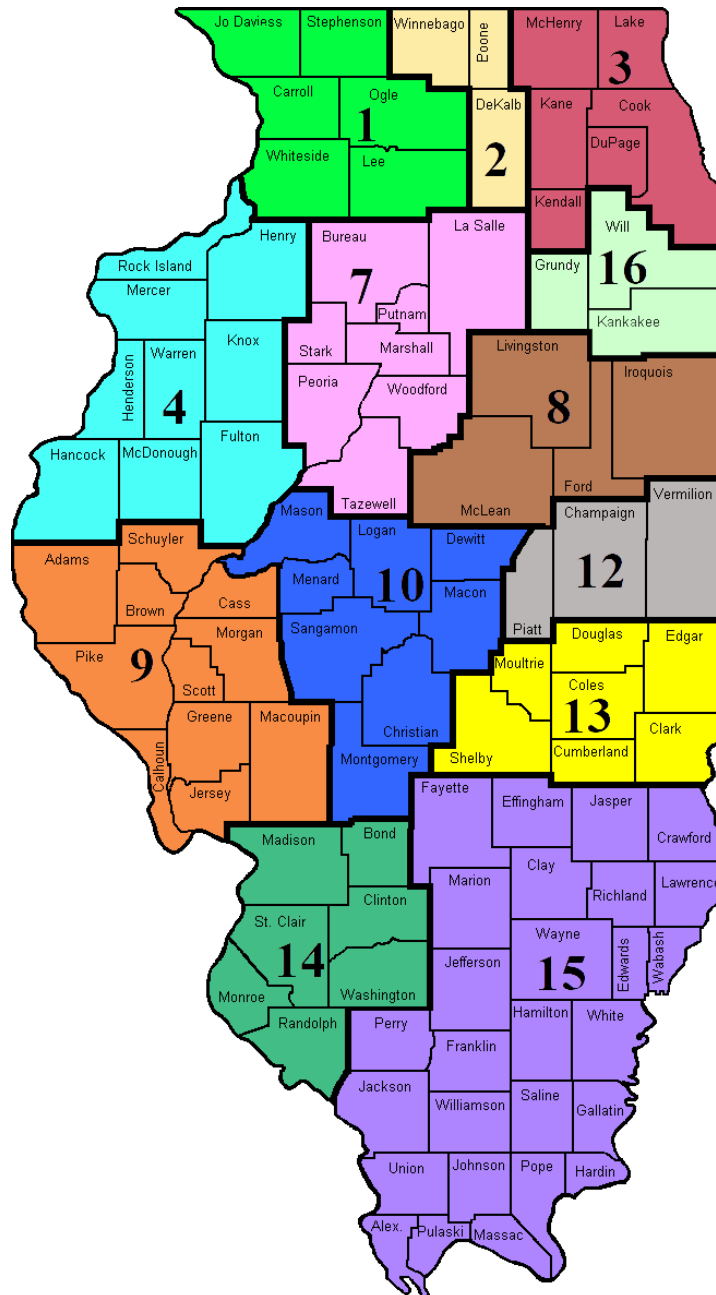

Re: Police Chaplain Program

As you may be aware, many states have Police Chaplain Training Curriculum available and many departments within Illinois recognize the service and assistance provided by police chaplains. Nevertheless, we as a Board have not specifically approved any one program so as to recognize police chaplains through an identified training process recognized by ILETSB.

Through our discussions and research, we have identified the International Conference of Police Chaplains (ICPC) as a training and certification organization and value their commitment to both the police profession and an ever encompassing arm regarding diverse beliefs with a focus on proactively supporting officers and families at times of great need.

The ICPC was established in 1973 by direction of the Department of Justice to provide standardization and continuity for chaplains at a federal level and they have MOUs with numerous local agencies. ICPC provides an endorsement and credentialing for chaplains who complete their program and they are required to sign a code of conduct, maintain the certification through continuing education and maintain a current membership with the ICPC. Before the training, individuals must complete the application and meet all prerequisites and requirements. This includes a background check, 35 hours of training, letter from their Chief/Sheriff endorsing them and their Celestial endorsement.

The ICPC is made up of various regional areas serving over 20 countries and is highly represented within the United States with the Midwest Region (Region 4) holding its annual conference in March here in Springfield. ILETSB staff were able to attend this conference and saw first-hand the structure, planning needs, and steps necessary to define and explore the creation of a chaplaincy program in Illinois.

Today's law enforcement profession is faced with unprecedented pressures and without question such a program would certainly assist local agencies in ways far beyond our comprehension. With a commitment to ongoing training, the requirement of a thorough background check, and a network of deployable chaplains, the ICPC stands out as a tremendous resource for agencies throughout Illinois – similar to the role ILETSB plays for law enforcement officers. For these reasons, we believe that the Board should recognize the work of ICPC as a resource and encourage agencies to seek their services in times of need.

The Mission and Vision of ICPC

ICPC's mission continues to be to develop professional law enforcement chaplains through dynamic education and support. In addition to that core mission, ICPC also has a vision to provide the means for an effective law enforcement chaplaincy program in every agency. They invite you to join them in supporting chaplains and their agencies as they turn this vision into reality.

The Core Values of ICPC

Guided by respect and honor of the badge and the men and women who have earned the right to wear it. They pledge availability to the needs of law enforcement officers and victims of crime. They subject their lives and their office to the scrutiny of accountability to ensure integrity. They offer professionalism of service, including confidential listening, and spiritual counsel.

How ICPC Began

In February 1973, three agents of the Internal Revenue Service were killed in a tragic late evening auto accident. Officials needed to make death notifications to the families located in cities outside the Washington, D.C. area. Chaplain Joseph Dooley was extremely frustrated at not being able to locate or contact other law enforcement chaplains for assistance. After the incident concluded, Chaplain Dooley dedicated himself to assuring that he would never again find himself isolated from other law enforcement chaplains.

In June 1973, a letter was sent to the president of 175 police associations, chiefs of police of major departments across the United States, and law enforcement chaplains. Chaplain Dooley outlined two distinct goals for a proposed association of chaplains:

- Compile a directory of chaplains, including their department or police association affiliation and contact information as to how they could be reached.
- Promote the bond of brotherhood so chaplains from far-reaching communities in the United States and Canada would be joined together in fellowship. The association would serve as a clearing house for helpful information pertinent to police chaplains.

In October 1973, the first group of chaplains gathered at a hotel in Washington, D.C. and organized - International Corporation of Police Chaplains (ICPC). The official name was later changed to The International Conference of Police Chaplains. For the first time, chaplains from every part of the country had a forum to share their experiences, concerns, hopes, and dreams for law enforcement chaplaincy. If Dooley had any doubts about the interest and commitment of his fellow chaplains, they were soon allayed. The response was immediate and extensive. In less than two months, over 300 chaplains had returned their applications for membership in the new organization.

The great response can be attributed to the chiefs of police, local police associations, FOP lodges, and chaplains themselves. It was truly a cooperative effort of many people. A need had become a vision, the vision had become a plan, and the plan became a reality.

See the Need

Law enforcement officers regularly encounter fatal accidents, violent crime, and domestic abuse, yet their resulting depression and stress often goes untreated due to the stigma around seeking support. The very independence, fortitude, and self-reliance that make a soul fit for law enforcement service, renders him or her more susceptible to its long-term effects.

See the Good

Chaplaincy is as crucial as it is uncomplicated. The call of the chaplain is simply the call to see the good. As volunteers who exist outside the command structure, yet hold themselves accountable to agency leadership, chaplains are uniquely positioned to lead by example. In every situation, in every crisis, in every moment, chaplains are there solely to support without judgment, to normalize positivity and resilience, and to be a reminder of the goodness and humanity that can be obscured in times of extremity.

The ICPC is a global family of individuals dedicated to supporting those who serve on the front lines. Theirs is a ministry of presence—proactively walking alongside officers through critical incidents, offering guidance to their families, and championing wellness practices that remove the stigma associated with seeking and receiving help. ICPC serves those who think only of the service they can give. Often, they are the only ones from whom they will receive it.

ICPC Requirements and Guidelines

Individuals seeking to be accredited through the ICPC Program, must first meet the prerequisites and requirements established by the ICPC:

- Attached Application for review & approval by the ICPC

After approval by the ICPC, candidates will become eligible to enroll in the Basic Program after the ICPC completes and receives the following:

- Background Check
- Letter from the Chief or Sheriff, endorsing the candidate
- Celestial endorsement

This report provides an update on the administration of the Board's Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) training programs, therapy dog initiative and various related mental health and de-escalation trainings.

CIT Training Courses/Series:

In anticipation of the FY27 appropriations to ILETSB, Board staff began receiving MTU and Approved CIT training entities proposals for the upcoming fiscal year in the areas of: CIT (those classes under the CIT umbrella), Mental Health Awareness, Peer Support, Officer Wellness, Crisis Response, Therapy Dog, De-escalation/Conflict Resolution and Co-responder training. I'm happy to report that interest in the above noted programs remains strong. Additional information regarding FY27 approvals will be forthcoming once a budget has been approved.

As mentioned to this body previously, every other year, we like to host a training retreat for our core statewide CIT instructors, evaluators and actors. This training retreat is designed to strengthen statewide consistency and ensure our team remain aligned with current best practices, curriculum standardization and quality assurance. It's also a fantastic way to collaborate, share successes, challenges and look to innovative approaches to strengthen the overall program. I'm happy to share that we had a very successful training retreat at our Chicago office this past April to a full house of our statewide team members. It's very impactful to have all these amazing instructors working together for a common statewide goal of ensuring that CIT training in Illinois remains a flagship program for others to emulate!

Additionally, I'd like to share that we also hosted another CIT Concepts Train the Trainer course. This one-day offering was also held at our Chicago facility in April and received fantastic reviews. Having this training expands our expertise of instructors available to teach this important topic to recruits while they are still in the academy.

CIT K-9 Therapy Dog Initiative:

Since the December Board meeting, the CIT crisis response therapy canine initiative has continued to grow, expanding its positive impact not only across Illinois but beyond. Our law enforcement therapy dog teams remain a steady and visible presence in the communities we serve, providing consistent outreach and support at both the celebratory and challenging events. This quarter included visits to South Suburban Law Enforcement Academy (SLEA), Cook County Juvenile Detention Center, Chicago Police Academy, various schools, Midway International Airport and ILETSB-EI Women in Criminal Justice Conference, where our teams welcomed and engaged with fellow law enforcement officers and training participants. At the same time, we responded to more somber occasions, offering comfort and compassion to school communities navigating tragedy. On these difficult days, our handlers and therapy dogs provided a calming, reassuring presence for students, faculty and SRO's. By being a constant – on good days and bad – we continue to strengthen trust organically, serving as a meaningful bridge between public safety and the communities we are honored to support.

Here are some other highlights of the therapy dog initiative since last reported in March:

* Continuing Training and Community Events:

Trooper and I have attended not only CIT trainings around the state, but also TOR sponsored continuing skills training for K-9 therapy dogs and their handlers (meet at least once monthly). These trainings reinforce basic skills, provides tricks to acquiring more advanced techniques/approaches, and allows for team interacting events and site visits. Here's some highlights since last reported in March:

I'm happy to share some updates to the implementation of the CIT crisis response therapy canine program. Since the Board formally adopted the parameters of the certification program this past December (2025), Board staff, alongside our Cook County Sheriff's Office/Tails of

Redemption partners have been making great strides. Here are just some of the major highlights:

- We have created a dedicated phone number and email address for law enforcement and their communities to reach out should they have a need for our statewide team to respond or visit their respective areas. The phone number will go to the Tails of Redemption staff, the email is monitored by ILETSB. This information, along with a QR code and joint emblems will be put on a magnet and other items such (as a mousepad) and available to disseminate statewide by this summer.
- CIT Crisis Response Therapy Canine brochures have been created and used during conferences.
- The inaugural graduation of the nation's first law enforcement CIT Crisis Response Therapy Canine certification program was held April 20-22, 2026 in Cook County. (*press release attached*) This inaugural class featured 11 certified therapy canine teams representing seven agencies across Illinois. This three-day course included classroom as well as in the field and professional actor-based assessments. We had numerous news/media outlets on-hand to capture and report on this memorable event. Our next certification class is set for July 7-9, 2026.
- A few members of our team traveled to the ICAT facility for a tour and to discuss possibility of using their facility for our therapy dog teams continuing training.
- Discussions with Cook County Sheriff's office regarding the MOU have been initiated.
- We are exploring the possibility of hosting a Therapy Dog Conference Summer 2027
- The IL C.O.P.S. organization has asked our CIT Crisis Response Therapy Dog Teams to partner with them in supporting families and fellow officers during times of need.

I will keep the Board apprised as these events move forward.

CESSA:

Just a quick update to let you know that the CESSA statewide group continues to meet as well as the subcommittees. Progress is being made for implementation around the state; however, because of the enormous task at hand, a new legislative extension (via bill) has been submitted was approved to extend the deadline until July 2027. I will keep the Board apprised of substantive updates.

CIT and Mental Health Awareness Training and Resource Institute:

As the Board has been offering the basic CIT training since 2003 and various off-shoots of mental health training including the CIT series, Mental Health Awareness and Response – and Intro to CIT, peer support pilot programs, officer wellness, etc. we are looking to the future to the possibility of creating a CIT and Mental Health Awareness Training & Resource Institute – perhaps in conjunction with the 988/CESSA roll out. It is really just a larger defined umbrella to the works we are already doing including but not limited to:

- CIT training series for in-service
- Intro to CIT training in academies (CIT Concepts)
- CIT resources
- MHA and Response Training and Resources
- Peer support training and resources (model policies and best practices)
- Support pilot programs on peer support
- Officer wellness training and resources
- Resources for families of law enforcement officers
- Co-responder model policy and best practices
- Therapy/Comfort dog assistance – Tails of Redemption (TOR) through the Cook County Sheriff's Office and Operation TT through the PBPA
- Add on training for social workers, paramedics, fire and additional courses for dispatch (as allowed)
- De-escalation training by CIT Instructors
- Provide opportunities for ICAT training
- Summits/conferences (may also assist with training mandates)
- Increase awareness of resources via first responder app
- Become a repository for best practices statewide
- Create a reporting mechanism (to assist with getting federal funds)
- Ongoing research and curriculum updates/development

Although we have not yet begun on this initiative, as soon as the Board retains additional staff to help support such an extensive resource platform, we will move forward with this concept.

Inaugural Cohort Graduates from Nation's First Crisis Response Therapy Canine Program

Graduation marks major milestone in innovative, trauma-informed approach to public safety

Chicago, IL — Today, the Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board (ILETSB), in partnership with the Cook County Sheriff's Office (CCSO), marked a historic milestone with the graduation of the inaugural cohort of the nation's first Crisis Response Therapy Canine Certification Program. The inaugural class features 11 certified therapy canine teams representing seven agencies across Illinois.

The program, launched to better equip law enforcement agencies with tools to respond to individuals in crisis, provides specialized training for therapy canine teams to support de-escalation, mental health response, and trauma-informed policing. Today's graduates represent a new model for public safety that prioritizes compassion, connection, and community trust.

"This inaugural graduating class represents a meaningful step forward in how we approach public safety," **said Sean Smoot, Chairman of the Board at ILETSB.** "ILETSB introduced Trooper, its first therapy dog supporting officer mental health resiliency, as an initial step, and this program builds on that work by integrating certified therapy canine teams into crisis response. We are giving officers and communities new tools to safely and effectively support individuals experiencing mental health challenges."

The certification program is the first of its kind in the United States, establishing standardized training and operational guidelines for therapy canines working alongside law enforcement. Participants completed rigorous instruction focused on crisis intervention, behavioral health awareness, and canine-handler coordination in high-stress environments.

Today's graduates will return to their respective agencies prepared to deploy therapy canine teams in a range of situations, including mental health calls, community engagement, and post-trauma response.

In September 1986 the Illinois Law Enforcement Training & Standards Board adopted a formal Crash Reconstruction program, in order to validate the professional expertise of individuals engaging in crash reconstruction in Illinois.

This program requires that an applicant complete specific training programs from vendors that are certified by the Board. Upon completion of these courses an application is submitted to Board staff for review. If the application is approved, the applicant is required to take and pass all three parts of a state exam with a score of 70% or better. Finally, upon recommendation of the Manager of Specialized Programs the individuals will be approved for certification by the Board.

The following individuals have successfully completed all portions of the certification exam and Board staff recommends these 8 individuals be approved, as Board certified as Crash Reconstruction Specialist.

SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER (SRO) PROGRAM

June 2026 Quarterly Board Report

In the wake of multiple school tragedies, the Illinois General Assembly addressed the use of police personnel within the school setting by passing PA 100-984 in Spring of 2018. Beginning January 1, 2021, any officer serving in the role of School Resource Officer (SRO) must obtain a certificate by the Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board ("Board"). These SRO certificates are good for two (2) years before an officer/agency must reapply. Officers serving as SRO's must either complete specialized training developed through ILETSB and other stakeholders or attain a waiver by the Board.

To date since January 2021, the Board has provided a total of approximately 1842 new certificates to SROs throughout the state. Currently there are approximately 848 active SROs certified by ILETSB in the state. For this quarter the Board office processed approximately 40 new requests for certification and 60 requests for recertification.

In Illinois, it seems that laws and requirements relating to juveniles are ever-changing. ILETSB believed that the Officers completing the 32-hour, and the 40-hour Juvenile Officer courses were being disadvantaged by not being required to recertify or complete any type of continuing education to stay at the fore front of new laws, administrative rules, school code and case law involving juvenile victims, witnesses, suspects and parents or guardians. From that, the idea to develop and implement a certification/recertification program and run it parallel to both the School Resource Officer (SRO) program and the Lead Homicide Investigator (LHI) program came to fruition.

ILETSB is pleased to present updated guidelines for the 32-hour and 40-hour Juvenile Officer program. ILETSB has established a fundamental outline of procedures relating to the Juvenile Officer certification process and is pleased to introduce the process for recertification for all Juvenile Officers. Please see the attached guidelines for the Juvenile Officer program.

To go hand in hand with the enhanced Juvenile program, a need was recognized by ILETSB for a Juvenile Officer refresher course. Brian Galske, who currently instructs the majority of the 32-hour Juvenile Officer courses and all of the 40-hour Juvenile Officer courses, designed a 16-hour Juvenile Officer Refresher course.

This course has been designed to provide all peace officers with specific direction to the experienced and certified Illinois Juvenile Police Officer with a review concerning the custody of the juvenile delinquent; review of updates with Chapter 705; Act 405, Juvenile Court Act. Topics that will be addressed in the 16-hour course include:

- Communication skills with minors, including minors identified in a special spectrum.
- Investigations of computer and social media crime involving minors.
- Review the investigation standards, procedures and protocols of sex and physical abuse crimes against a minor.
- Juvenile rights and protections in the juvenile justice system, emphasis on latest interviews and interrogations of delinquent minors.
- Revisions of Chapter 705; Act 405. Juvenile Court Act of 1987.
- Law Enforcement responsibilities.
- Review of requirements with juvenile delinquents in custody.
- Latest trends and dispositions pertaining to the status offender and delinquent minor in the use of ordinance citations, station adjustments and court referrals.

Important events happening in the world of SRO and Juvenile Officers. The Illinois Juvenile Officers Association and the Illinois D.A.R.E. Officers Association are currently hosting the 2026 annual conference from June 3-5, 2026 in Bloomington, Illinois. Later in June the Illinois School Resource Officers Association will host their conference from June 17 – 19, 2026 also in Bloomington.

For the last piece of SRO/Juvenile related information from ILETSB, Chris Haubrich, Instructor Approval/ Course Certification Administrator and I had the pleasure of sitting down with the D.A.R.E. coordinator for the state of Illinois – Deputy Chief Christy Fruge from Lincoln Police Department and discuss expanding their program here in Illinois and getting the current course ILETSB certified for mandate credit. For those unaware, the D.A.R.E. course is an 80-hour intensive instructor development course focused on designing and implementing the D.A.R.E. curriculum into the school setting at the elementary, middle and high school levels by Police Officers that are either School Resource Officers or D.A.R.E. Officers or both.

As a D.A.R.E. alumni, I can honestly say that this course was as tough as the Illinois State Police training academy was for my basic recruit training. Once I completed the D.A.R.E. program and began teaching it, I found how rewarding it truly was. D.A.R.E. America made a fundamental curriculum change a number of years ago from trying to get children away from drugs by just saying no to now providing children decision making methods and ideas to make better choices for many areas including the decision to do drugs.

ILETSB is pleased to announce that we have certified the D.A.R.E. America 80-hour Officer Training course for state mandate credits.

BASIC AND PART-TIME ACADEMY TRAINING

June 2026 Quarterly Board Report

This report serves as an update to the basic and part-time training for Basic Law Enforcement and Basic Corrections Officer programs. The data presented was acquired in the third quarter of FY26 (Jan-Mar '26).

New Academy Director

The Chicago Police Academy welcomed a new administrator to the Office of Constitutional Policing and Reform in the Training and Support Group. Deputy Chief Karla Johnson was selected to serve in this role after Deputy Chief Migdalia Bulnes left the position in April.

Please find time to introduce yourself to Deputy Chief Johnson and welcome her to the team.

Field Engagement

The time since the last Board meeting was defined by a comprehensive situational analysis of the Illinois Academy training landscape. To ensure that the Training Division remains responsive to the operational realities of our partners, I conducted an exhaustive series of site visits, personally observing every Basic Law Enforcement (BLE) and Basic Corrections Officer (BCO) academy in the state.

This time on the ground served as a critical feedback loop, revealing a high degree of institutional readiness and professional support for the Board's efforts and mission. The prevailing sentiment from academy leadership and instructional staff indicates a strong appetite for standardized, evidence-based curriculum delivery. This field-level insight confirms that our current strategic trajectory is not only necessary for compliance but is being embraced by the personnel responsible for training the next generation of Illinois officers.

Virtual Engagement

In addition to creating connections in the field, a monthly newsletter was established to foster deeper connections across the state. This helps to keep communication between the ILETSB Training Division and our academies consistent and transparent. I've attached a copy of the May newsletter to the end of this report. Recognizing that everyone processes information differently, I have also launched a 'podcast-style' audio version to accompany the written

newsletter. This multimodal approach ensures the content is accessible whether individuals want to listen at their desk or on the move.

Monthly virtual director meetings were established as a collaborative forum. These sessions provide a vital 'temperature check' for the group, allowing me to listen to statewide input and gather real-time feedback from those on the front lines before any significant updates or changes are finalized. The reactions to these efforts to increase communication have been overwhelmingly positive.

BCO Curriculum Integrity

A primary milestone for the division has been the exhaustive review and revision of the Basic Corrections Officer Curriculum and exam. This initiative, facilitated through our partnership with the University of Illinois-Springfield, was conducted over a two-year period. With the current project coming to an end, Dr. Cindy Jones and the UIS team should be recognized for their contributions. The work was focused on ensuring the BCO curriculum maintains fidelity with evolving state laws. Through research and collaboration with several subject matter experts (SMEs), the partnership produced updated instructional guidelines to address changing legal mandates.

Another core accomplishment of this project was synchronizing our testing instruments with the updated instructional content. By eliminating discrepancies between the curriculum and the certification exam, we have strengthened the psychometric validity of the ILETSB certificate. This ensures that every newly certified correctional officer has been measured against a legally defensible and professionally relevant standard. Our focus remains on the integrity of the content and the accuracy of our assessments, ensuring they reflect the sophisticated competencies required in modern correctional environments. Future work will build on the current product to ensure alignment with the expected recruit outcomes and current best practices in the field.

Training Standardization: The SFST Framework

The Training Division worked closely with Mike Pappas, the Illinois State Coordinator for the Drug Evaluation and Classification Program (DECP), to help standardize the delivery of the Standardized Field Sobriety Testing (SFST) curriculum in the academy setting. Through careful evaluation, it was noted that delivery varied slightly across training sites. To ensure the Board can stand behind every training course provided in the academy, we are working closely with the academies to provide the information and resources they require to deliver the content established by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) at every academy site in the state.

Central to this effort is the strict adherence to the instructor-to-student ratio as defined by NHTSA. By ensuring training is conducted with consistent ratios, we maintain a safe and productive environment for every recruit through supervised instruction. Instructor update courses were conducted at several locations across the state, and new instructor applications

were submitted to ensure that only those individuals who meet the strict criteria for delivering the course content are utilized in the academy setting. These moves aim to mitigate institutional risk and ensure that the foundational training provided to Illinois recruits aligns with national standards.

Strategic Outlook

As the Training Division moves into the next phase of modernizing the training experience in the academy setting, I look to the Board for guidance on prioritizing our future milestones. Having established an initial alignment of the BCO program, our next steps will involve a deep-dive analysis into the Student Performance Objectives (SPOs) that link directly to the tasks presented in the job. Support for conducting this process will involve input from several experts in the training space. Feedback and review will be invited from academy directors, instructional design experts, and administrators from across the state. National standards for the development of reliable and evaluative SPOs will be used to confirm strong alignment between the curriculum and the actual job performance requirements, requisite knowledge, and requisite skills needed to be successful in law enforcement in the state of Illinois.

This process will expand into the broader law enforcement curriculum within the BLE course and into the continued evolution of our training and evaluation models. Steps are being taken to explore options to support the development and delivery of training for those who have chosen to dedicate themselves to the law enforcement profession. Innovative research to improve the retention of key ideas is being closely monitored and supported to stay at the cutting edge of new technology and training methods. Proposed changes to the curriculum design will be brought to the Board for approval as they are developed.

The Board's direction and mission remain the primary drivers of our division's work. I seek your continued perspective on how we should continue to define instructional mastery and where our analytical resources can best serve the long-term mission of the Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board.

A total of 4 Basic Law Enforcement (BLE) classes completed instruction during this reporting period. 99 recruits enrolled in the full-time training; 92 completed the training in good standing and obtained certification. This describes a 93% success rate of officers seeking certification. 24 recruits enrolled in the part-time training; 20 completed the training in good

standing and obtained certification. This describes an 83% success rate of officers seeking certification.

In addition, 4 Basic Corrections Officer (BCO) classes were completed. 166 recruits enrolled in the training; 160 completed the training in good standing and obtained certification. This describes a 96% success rate of officers seeking certification.

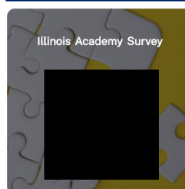

Information Services Board Report – 2nd Quarter – June-2026

InformaCast:

The Emergency Event Notification System went live at the end of March – The System is in place to provide ILET SB Staff with real-time alerts regarding emergency events, safety concerns and weather-related issues - These notifications are provided via Audible Broadcast, Cellular and eMail Services – In recent weeks, the system has been proven useful in providing real-time alerts during recent inclement weather in the Chicago and Springfield areas – ILET SB is one of only few State Agencies who have implemented and are internally operating an Emergency Broadcast System

Network & Security Services:

Primary stages of implementing Windows Server 2025 has been conducted to accommodate future Server upgrades – Migration of Data & Services to the new Storage Environment is near completion & is anticipated to finalize prior to the end of June 2026 – Once complete, Firewall Service Upgrades will follow to enhance and reinforce ILET SB’s Cyber-Security capabilities – “Always-On” VPN Services are in the planning stages and will be implemented post completion of the FireWall Upgrades - The ILET SB Web-Site is undergoing Federally Mandated ADA Compliance Requirements – These requirements were satisfied in advance of the April 27th deadline, which has now been pushed out to April of 2027 – The Web-Site is under continuous review to provide those with Disabilities the necessary enhancements to conduct web-based interactions – A Remote Assistance Application is currently being piloted to provide staff with virtual Helpdesk Services to minimize the need for in-person resolution & allow remote Server Administration

Disaster Recovery/Contingency Planning:

With the recent transition and restructure of Network Services, the Disaster Recovery Plan (DRP) is currently under review to incorporate the steps necessary to return functionality to operational state in the event of catastrophic disruption - Information Services is currently undergoing a thorough Risk Assessment in coordination with the Department of Innovation and Technology – The assessment will provide insight and remediations to the strengths and vulnerabilities of ILET SB’s Technical Service provisions – Once complete, a Business Impact Analysis will be conducted to identify and prioritize critical business functions to minimize disruption and support effective recovery efforts in the event of unforeseen service interruptions - Protocols will include synchronized data integration of the Springfield and Chicago Offices for redundancy and Off-Site Storage for data preservation and restoration – Continual research and preventative measures are conducted to strengthen ILET SB’s cybersecurity posture, particularly in response to the rapid advancement of AI-driven threats.

Data Services:

Additional Information Services are being identified and implemented as necessary to accommodate the changing operational requirements of ILETSB's operational data provisions – Evidentiary Intake and Digital Document Archiving are expected to require significant capacity requirements for storage, backup and availability purposes – Research and vendor engagements are being conducted to identify potential and best solutions for both - Information Services continues to review, manage and implement the Data Storage Services based on priority and need - With the implementation of the Data Storage Expansion, future Back-Up Services will provide real-time synchronization and preservation of ILETSB Databanks - Active Directory Service restructuring has streamlined data availability and Departmental collaboration –Data Mapping and Classification is regularly reviewed to provide the most efficient back-up and restoration capabilities in the event of circumstantial compromised data

On-Line Testing Services:

ILETSB's Testing Services has successfully conducted over 4,500 exams for Law Enforcement Candidates in the State of Illinois - Testing locations include the ILETSB Chicago and Springfield Facilities, as well as Partner MTUs and Academy Facilities – Based on logistical considerations, the inclusion of multiple Testing Sites provide Candidates with the opportunity to attend based on proximity to Training Locations – Review of testing services continues to identify potential enhancement, performance & security features

Chicago Office:

Several projects continue at the Chicago Office

- ILETSB continues to work with CMS Property Services on implementation of Security Cameras and Door Badging - The process is currently with CMS Project Management with current expectation that completion will occur prior to close of FY26
- AV Hardware for two Testing and Meeting Rooms are in process of procurement to accommodate the needs for Trainings, Testing & Legal Hearing Proceedings - ILETSB is working in conjunction with Vendor and DoIT Services for fulfillment by end of FY26
 - Chicago AV project remains in progress; currently coordinating with CMS to ensure electrical work is completed ahead of installation
- Cellular Extenders are to be installed at the facility to enhance Telecom Services for Staff and Guests
 - The cell signal extender installation at the Chicago office remains pending while we await the vendor's installation date.

ILETSB In-House Applications:

Development Steering Committee meetings are conducted on a regular basis with ILETSB Departmental & Affiliate Representation for opportunity to provide input, approval and testing of functional improvements, reporting provisions and legal requirements of the applications – With the expansion of Technical Services and the anticipation of new Applications, plans are being made to incorporate an additional Programmer to the Development Team

CIT Therapy Dog Tracking:

Created to track certification State of Illinois Therapy Dogs and their Handlers - The Application is currently operational, with Development discovery dialogues are on-going to identify and implement additional features and enhancements

Legal Hearing System:

Developed for tracking and storing the documentation of hearings pertaining to Officer reactivation and decertification – The Application is currently active and additional functional requirements have been identified, tested and implemented – Development continues on an as-needed basis to incorporate additional functional and legal requirements

PTB/LEDI:

PTB is utilized internally to provide records management to ILETSB Staff in the areas of basic training, specialized certification, Professional Conduct records, and data reports for officers and their agencies – LEDI serves as a document records submission portal, to assist agencies in reviewing and maintaining compliance with legal requirements to State of Illinois mandates – LEDI Mandate Reports have been updated to track when Mandated Classes are approaching or have past expiration - Development of the applications continue with regular improvements and feature enhancements

LETM:

Utilized by ILETSB Staff and affiliated Training Partners, the Law Enforcement Training Management (LETM) was Developed to track and document the course, class and student records of State Law Enforcement – A full re-write of the application was released in early March 2026 – Post release, programmatic issues were identified and corrected – Regular review and development of the application provides enhanced functionality and a more intuitive end-user experience - Targeted development and extensive analysis has been conducted to ensure functional services perform with integrity - Development continues with the incorporation of recommended modifications and enhancements

Officer Portal:

Provides Officers with the opportunity to review their individual Law Enforcement Records and Training Requirements - With the integration of the Professional Conduct Database, individuals are able to review and respond to Professional Conduct Reports Electronically - The Portal currently supports more than 36,000 registered accounts or approximately 85% of Active Law Enforcement Officers throughout the State of Illinois – Expiration notices are sent weekly to Officers to provide advance notice of Mandates that will expire within 60-days - The Officer Verification Process, which is required on a 3-year recurring mandate, has been implemented with notifications disseminated to applicable Law Enforcement Officers – To date, 10,000+ Officers have utilized the new Verification Process - Review and development of the Portal is on-going in conjunction with the PTB-LEDI applications.
